

cases in which the question was raised as to the insurability under the above Acts of certain persons employed in hostels carried on in connection with a high school for girls, which was primarily a day school.

The persons in question were employed as housemaid, cook, and charwoman respectively. Pupils and students attending the high school were only permitted to reside in hostels, the proprietors of which complied with certain regulations made by the school authorities.

The Judge held that the employment of the persons in question was employment in domestic service and, by reason of the nexus that existed owing to the management and control imposed on the hostels by the school authorities, was not employment in a trade or business carried on for the purposes of gain, and that the employment was accordingly excepted under paragraph (b) of Part II of the First Schedule to the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1920. The persons in question were, therefore, not required to be insured.
