The following Addresses were presented to The KING on the occasion of His Majesty's visit to Newcastle upon Tyne and Gateshead and of the opening by His Majesty of the new Tyne Bridge on the 10th October, 1928:—

NEWCASTLE UPON TYNE
CORPORATION.

TO THEIR MOST GRACIOUS MAJESTIES KING
GEORGE V. AND QUEEN MARY.

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR MAJESTIES:

We, the Lord Mayor, Aldermen and Citizens of the City and County of Newcastle upon Tyne, humbly offer to Your Majesties our loyal and affectionate welcome to our City.

We desire to express our heartfelt gratitude to Your Majesties for the gracious interest which you have displayed in the inauguration of the Tyne Bridge, an undertaking designed to improve not only the means of communication between the City and the adjoining Borough of Gateshead but also to facilitate traffic on that important and ancient highway the Great North Road.

The distinguished honour conferred upon the City by the gracious presence of Your Majesties on this important occasion will long be remembered by the Citizens of Newcastle upon Tyne.

We earnestly pray that Your Majesties may long be spared to reign over your grateful and loyal subjects.

To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious Answer:—

I am happy to receive your loyal and dutiful Address and the Queen and I are deeply touched by the affectionate welcome accorded to us by the citizens of Newcastle upon Tyne.

It is a great pleasure to us to have this opportunity of seeing so vast an assembly of school children and of visiting the new Heaton Secondary Schools. I congratulate the Educational Authority of the City upon the provision of these finely constructed and well equipped buildings which, I am confident, will mark a great step in advance for secondary education in Newcastle.

The primary object of to-day's visit, the Opening of the Tyne Bridge, recalls a like occasion in the past and forms another association of my Family with your City; for in 1906 my dear Father came here to open the Bridge which bears his name.

It is a source of much grief to me to know that during the past few years the men and women of this area have been living under the shadow of grave industrial depression. Owing to the dislocation of trade caused by the War the industries of coal, iron and steel and ship-building, which have given world-wide renown to the River Tyne have been struggling with adversity. The erection of the new Bridge is a characteristic act of courage and demonstrates your belief in the power of these industries to recover lost trade and to play again their former proud role in the world's markets. I am happy to observe that your

dauntless handling of these difficulties is achieving results. Already the coal industry of the North and the shipbuilding of the Tyne appear to be emerging from the depression.

I trust that this day may be the beginning of a new era of prosperity and that God's Blessing may ever rest upon your City.

In asking His Majesty to open the new Tyne Bridge the Lord Mayor of Newcastle upon Tyne said:—

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR MAJESTIES:

The development of Tyneside by the utilisation of its natural resources, with the help of the Tyne Improvement Commissioners, who have transformed our River into one of the leading Ports in Your Majesty's Kingdom, has called for increased transport facilities, and for forty years it has been realised that another Bridge was necessary; and that need has been intensified in recent years by the increase in motor traffic.

It would not have been possible to realise our ambition without the aid of Your Majesty's Government and we desire to acknowledge gratefully the assistance given by Your Majesty's Minister of Transport and the National Treasury.

Tyne Bridge is one of the latest triumphs of bridge building, being the largest single span Bridge in Europe, and we desire to express our appreciation of the Engineers' skilful design and the Contractors' ability.

The satisfaction which we feel on the completion of this design is enhanced by the presence of Your Majesty with Her Gracious Majesty the Queen at to-day's Ceremony.

Our District is passing through a period of great industrial depression, but the building of the Bridge and the promotion of a large Industrial Exhibition to be held here next year give evidence of our faith that the present gloom will soon be dispelled.

I have pleasure, on behalf of myself and the Mayor of Gateshead, in asking Sir Arthur Dorman to hand to Your Majesty the key which will raise the Barrier and to ask Your Majesty to be graciously pleased to declare the Bridge open.

To which His Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious Answer:—

Twenty-two years ago my dear Father opened the King Edward VII Bridge. Now it is with great pleasure that I dedicate an even more imposing structure to public use.

Few cities combine more favourably than Newcastle the advantages of highway, railway, river and sea transport, advantages which have ever placed you foremost in commercial developments and progress. But while a river is in some respects an aid, in others it is a barrier to land communications, and generation after generation the men of the Tyneside have grappled energetically with the problem of bridging the Tyne without hampering the movements of shipping. I congratulate you most warmly upon this Bridge, constructed by the joint labours of Newcastle and Gateshead. With its wide single span and spacious approaches, the Tyne Bridge not only adds dignity and convenience to your City but also bears lasting testimony to the unrivalled

capacity of British Engineering Trade and its workers of all grades. It is my earnest hope that this notable improvement in the facilities of transport may help to bring back to your City the full tide of prosperity which your courage and patience under recent difficulties so justly deserve.

I have much pleasure in declaring the Tyne Bridge open for the use of the public.

TO THEIR MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTIES KING GEORGE THE FIFTH AND QUEEN MARY.

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR MAJESTIES:

We The Mayor, Aldermen and Citizens of the City of Durham and Framwelgate, respectfully bid you welcome to our Ancient and Loyal City.

We are fully sensible of the Honour you have so graciously conferred upon us by your Royal Visit and desire to offer you our heartiest thanks for the opportunity of personally expressing our sentiments and of assuring you of our sincere attachment to the Throne.

The Palatine Jurisdiction of the County Palatine of Durham and Sadberge and all jura regalia rights formerly exercised by the Prince Bishops of Durham having been transferred to and vested in the Crown as a separate Franchise and Royalty in 1836 by Act of Parliament 6 and 7 William IV, cap. 19, We as Citizens of the Capital City of the County Palatine are additionally proud in welcoming Our King as Prince Palatine.

Our earnest prayer is that Your Majesties may live long to continue in the enjoyment of the affection of all Your Majesties' subjects.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 26th October, 1928, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £45,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 29th October, 1928, to Saturday, the 3rd November, 1928, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

His Majesty The KING has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal to Henry Butterfield, in recognition of his gallantry in the following circumstances:—

An outburst of fire damp and small coal occurred in the main slant at the Ponthenry Colliery, Carmarthenshire, on the morning of July 10th, 1928. Butterfield, who was a fireman at the mine, heard the outburst and saw men running. He steadied them and at once started a pump to improve the ventilation, and on being informed that there were men lying unconscious in the main slant, he, followed by some of the others, went to their rescue. After he had proceeded a short way the air became so bad that his oil safety lamp would not remain alight, and he had to use an electric lamp. On reaching the main slant he found six men, of whom four were unconscious and one semi-conscious and struggling. These men were then assisted to the surface. Butterfield then continued down the main slant where in a side road he found two men who were still conscious and a little further on three more who were unconscious. Assistance was summoned and the injured were taken to the surface. By this time Butterfield had himself been severely affected by the gas.

Similar sudden outbursts had occurred in these workings previously, several with fatal results, and Butterfield as a fireman would know what the danger was and the importance of prompt action. After doing what little he could quickly to reduce the danger, he at once took the lead in the rescue operations, and his action in exposing himself to the effects of the foul atmosphere in order to ascertain whether it was possible to retain consciousness and carry out the work of rescue encouraged others to follow him in order to render assistance in removing the injured. Two of his helpers were themselves overcome. There is no doubt that Butterfield knowingly endangered his life in order to save the lives of his comrades. Unfortunately two of those who were rescued subsequently died.
