WE, The Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in consideration of the Benefaction which has been duly secured in favour of each of the Benefices whereof the names and the names of the Counties and Dioceses wherein the same are respectively situate are stated in the first three columns of the Schedule hereto, which benefaction is described in the fourth column of the said Schedule opposite to the name of the Benefice, and in respect of which Benefaction we have agreed to pay to the Incumbent of the Benefice, and to his successors Incumbents of the same Benefice, the yearly sum (if any) the amount of which is stated in the fifth column of the said Schedule opposite to the name of the Benefice, do hereby, in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, Grant out of our Common Fund to the Incumbent of the Benefice, and appropriate for the benefit of such Incumbent and his successors Incumbents of the same Benefice to meet such Benefaction the capital sum the amount of which is stated in the sixth column of the said Schedule opposite to the name of the Benefice, in respect of which capital sum

so granted so long as the same or any part thereof shall remain in our hands there shall be paid by us to the Incumbent for the time being of the Benefice the yearly sum the amount of which is stated in the seventh column of the said Schedule opposite to the name of the Benefice, or such part thereof as shall be proportionate to any balance of the same capital sum which shall so remain in our hands, the yearly sums so payable in respect of the Benefaction and of the Grant to commence as from the date stated in the eighth column of the said Schedule opposite to the name of the Benefice, and to be payable in equal quarterly portions on the first day of February, the first day of May, the first day of August and the first day of November in each and every year. Provided always that this Instrument which is intended to be executed in several parts (one part for each Diocese concerned) shall only operate as one single Grant in favour of each of the Benefices mentioned in the said Schedule.
