The following Statute made by the Governing Body of the College or Hall of the Holy Trinity, in the University of Cambridge, on the 12th day of October, 1928, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

STATUTE TO ALTER AND AMEND THE STATUTES OF THE COLLEGE OR HALL OF THE HOLY TRINITY IN THE UNIVERSITY OF CAMBRIDGE, WHICH AMENDING STATUTE HAVING BEEN DULY MADE AT A GENERAL MEETING OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE SAID COLLEGE OR HALL (SPECIALLY SUMMONED FOR THIS PURPOSE AND HELD ON THE 12TH DAY OF OCTOBER, 1928, NOTICE OF THE PROPOSED AMENDING STATUTE HAVING BEEN GIVEN TO THE UNIVERSITY) AND PASSED AT SUCH MEETING BY THE VOTES OF ALL PERSONS PRESENT AND VOTING IS NOW SUBMITTED FOR THE APPROVAL OF HIS MAJESTY THE KING IN COUNCIL.

WE, the Master, Fellows and Scholars of the College or Hall of the Holy Trinity in the University of Cambridge, do hereby in pursuance of the power given to us by the 7th Section of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, alter and amend the Statutes made under that Act in relation to

our said College or Hall in manner following, that is to say:—

STATUTE XII.

College Meetings.

By adding the following paragraph to Section 3 of this Statute:—

"When the Mastership is about to become vacant at a known date by resignation or superannuation, an election to the Mastership may be made not more than six calendar months before the date of the vacancy, by the same procedure as if the Mastership had already become vacant. Such election shall take effect from the date on which the Mastership becomes vacant. The Master shall not be present at any meeting at which an election to the Mastership is made and no business not immediately connected with election to the Mastership shall be transacted at any such meeting."

PROPOSAL TO FIX AND TO VARY MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES.

In accordance with the Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour and dated 21st April, 1927, the Toy Manufacturing Trade Board (Great Britain) HEREBY GIVE NOTICE that they PROPOSE TO VARY the Minimum Rates of Wages for certain classes of Male and Female Workers, and to FIX Minimum Rates of Wages for Male and Female Workers brought within the scope of the Trade Board by the Trade Boards (Toy Manufacturing Trade, Great Britain) (Constitution and Proceedings) Regulations, 1926.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz.:—

REGULATIONS FOR THE COMPETITIVE SELECTION OF ASSISTANT ENGINEERS IN THE ROADS DEPARTMENT OF THE MINISTRY OF TRANSPORT.

N.B.—These regulations are liable to alteration from time to time. Competitions do not take place at fixed intervals, but are held as occasion arises.

1. Candidates must not have attained the age of 35 on a date to be fixed in respect of the competition in which they are to take part.

Candidates who have served or are serving in the Navy, Army or Air Force may deduct from their actual age, for this purpose, any time during which they have so served, but not exceeding 5 years.

Candidates already serving in the Ministry may be considered up to the age of 50.

- 2. Candidates must be natural-born British subjects and the sons of fathers also natural-born British subjects; provided that exception may be made:—
 - (a) In the case of candidates serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners.
 - (b) In the case of natural-born British subjects who served in His Majesty's Armed Forces in the Great War between 4th August, 1914, and 11th November, 1918.

(c) In the case of natural-born British subjects who have satisfactorily completed a period of not less than five years' service on full pay in His Majesty's Regular Forces.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied, in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a naturalborn British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalization or by any other voluntary and formal act.

3. Until further order, special consideration will be given to candidates who have served in His Majesty's Forces during the War.

No person will be eligible who obtained from any tribunal established under the Military Service Acts, 1916 to 1918, exemption from service in His Majesty's Forces under those Acts on the ground of a conscientious objection to the undertaking of military service, or, although not so exempted, declined to comply with obligations imposed upon him by those Acts.

4. Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to apply for appointment.

No person actually serving in the Navy, Army, or Air Force will be eligible for consideration unless he produces, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to apply for appointment, dated before his appearance before the Selection Board, and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent, cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

5. The Ministry will take such steps as they think most appropriate to make known the existence of any vacancy or vacancies which they desire to fill on any one occasion, and the

Civil Service Commissioners will satisfy themselves that the steps taken have been such as to secure all desirable publicity.

Application shall be addressed in the first instance to the Ministry of Transport and shall be made on a form to be obtained from The candidate's credentials will that office. be examined at the Ministry and the names of those candidates who appear to have the requisite qualifications and to be best fitted for appointment will be submitted to the Civil Service Commissioners. The Commissioners, if dissatisfied with the number or quality of candidates for any vacancy, may require further search to be made for qualified candidates. The Civil Service Commissioners may, if they think fit, assist in the scrutiny of the application forms of the candidates.

7. Candidates must be corporate members of the Insitution of Civil Engineers or must hold some equivalent professional qualification. Previous experience in road and bridge construction is essential and a knowledge of Highway Authorities' procedure is desirable.

8. Candidates who are recommended by the Ministry and are accepted by the Civil Service Commissioners as possessing the requisite qualifications will be summoned to an interview before a Selection Board, who will recommend, for the vacancies existing, those candidates who appear to them to possess the highest qualifications, and their decision will be final. The Selection Board will be constituted by the Ministry in consultation with the Civil Service Commissioners who will be represented on the Selection Board.

9. The appointment of selected candidates will be subject to their satisfying the Civil Service Commissioners of their eligibility in respect of age, nationality, health and character, and will not be confirmed unless and until they have passed the prescribed period of probation to the satisfaction of the Ministry of Transport.

10. Candidates selected for appointment will be required to pay a fee of £8.

11. Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons unacquainted with their work, will disqualify them for appointment. The Selection Board will disregard spontaneous recommendations from persons who are not personally acquainted with the candidate's work, whether at school, at the university, in industry or business, in the Forces, or otherwise.
