And whereas it is expedient that the firstmentioned Order as so amended (hereinafter referred to as the principal Order) should be further amended in manner hereinafter appearing:

And whereas the provisions of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied

with:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

- 1. For paragraph (3) of Article nine of the principal Order the following paragraph shall be substituted:
 - "(3) A person shall not smoke in any aircraft registered in Great Britain and Northern Ireland, unless and except in so far as smoking in that aircraft is permitted by a notice exhibited by the owner of the aircraft in a prominent place therein.

A notice permitting smoking in any such aircraft may only be exhibited therein if and in so far as smoking in the aircraft is permitted by the certificate of airworthiness of the aircraft or by the direction of the Secretary of State.

The owner of every aircraft registered in Great Britain and Northern Ireland shall exhibit in a prominent place in the aircraft a notice stating whether and to what extent smoking is prohibited or permitted therein."

- 2. Paragraph (1) of Article twenty-one of the principal Order shall be amended:—
 - (1) by omitting the words "at the beginning and end of each communication";

(2) by inserting after the words "Provided that" the following words:

"after communication has been established by means of such call sign the aircraft may employ an abridged call sign consisting—

(a) in the case of radio telegraphy of the first and last letters of the complete

call sign of five letters;

(b) in the case of radio telephony, of the whole or part of the name of the owner of the aircraft followed by the last two letters of the complete call sign of five letters.

Provided also that".

- 3. For paragraphs 7 to 15 of Schedule I to the principal Order, the paragraphs set forth in the Schedule to this Order shall be substituted.
- 4. Paragraph 17 of Schedule IV to the principal Order shall be amended:—
 - (1) by inserting after sub-paragraph (a) the following new sub-paragraph:—
 - "(aa) The international distress call 'MAYDAY' (corresponding to the French pronunciation of the expression 'm'aider') by means of radio telephony";

(2) by substituting for the words "international alert signal" the words "international urgent signal";

(3) by inserting at the end of the paragraph the words "Where radio-telegraphy is used the three letters must be well separated so that the signals 'A N' may not be transformed into one signal 'P'. The

- urgent signal may be transmitted only with the authorisation of the commander or person responsible for the aircraft."
- 5. After paragraph 48 of Schedule IV to the principal Order there shall be inserted the following new paragraph:—
 - "48A. The Secretary of State may by directions temporarily suspend the application of all or any of the rules contained in this Section with reference to any aerodrome in Great Britain or Northern Ireland which is open to public use. At any aerodrome as respects which all or any of the rules contained in this Section are for the time so suspended as aforesaid, a red square panel, each side of which is at least three yards in length, shall be placed horizontally near to the signal in that aerodrome which indicates the direction of the wind."
- 6.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 4) Order, 1928.
- (2) This Order shall come into operation on the first day of January nineteen hundred and twenty-nine.

SCHEDULE.

PARAGRAPHS TO BE SUBSTITUTED FOR PARAGRAPHS 7-15 OF SCHEDULE I TO THE PRINCIPAL ORDER.

- 7. The nationality mark of an aircraft registered in Great Britain and Northern Ireland shall be the capital letter G in Roman character, and the registration mark shall be a group assigned by the Secretary of State of four capital letters in Roman character.
- 8. The nationality and registration marks shall be painted on the aircraft in the following manner:—
 - (a) Flying Machines.—The marks shall be painted once on the lower surface of the lower main planes, and once on the upper surface of the top main planes, the top of the letters to be towards the leading edge. They shall also be painted along each side of the fuselage between the main planes and the tail planes. In cases where the machine is not provided with a fuselage the marks shall be painted on the nacelle instead.
 - (b) Airships and Balloons.—In the case of airships the marks shall be painted near the maximum cross-section on both sides and on the upper surface, equidistant In the case from the letters on the sides. of balloons the marks shall be painted twice near the maximum horizontal circumference of a spherical balloon as far as possible from one another, and, on a non-spherical balloon, near the maximum cross-section on both sides immediately above the rigging band or the points of attachment of the basket suspension cables. In the case both of airships and balloons the side marks shall be visible both from the sides and ground.

The marks shall be of such a colour in relation to the colour of the background on which they are painted as will render them clearly legible at a distance of not less than 250 yards in a clear atmosphere.

- 9. The height of the letters need not exceed eight feet unless otherwise required by the Secretary of State. Subject as aforesaid, the height of the marks shall be as follows:—
 - (a) Flying Machines.—The height of the marks on the main planes shall be equal to four-fifths of the chord. The height of the marks on the fuselage or nacelle shall be equal to four-fifths of the greatest depth of the narrowest part of that portion of the fuselage or nacelle on which the marks are painted.
 - (b) Airships and Non-spherical Balloons.—The height of the marks shall be equal to at least one-twelfth of the circumference at the maximum transverse cross-section of the airship, or the maximum cross-section of the balloon.
 - (c) Spherical Balloons.—The height of the marks shall be equal to at least one-fifteenth of the maximum horizontal circumference of the balloon.
- 10. As nearly as the constructional features of the aircraft admit,
 - (a) the width of the letters shall be twothirds of their height;
 - (b) the thickness of the letters shall be one-sixth of their height; and
 - . (c) except as provided in paragraph 11 of this Schedule, a space equal to one-half the width of the letters shall be left between the letters.

The letters shall be painted in plain block type, and shall be uniform in shape and size.

- 11. A hyphen of a length equal to the width of one of the letters shall be painted between the nationality mark and the registration mark.
- 12. The nationality and registration marks shall be displayed to the best possible advantage, taking into consideration the constructional features of the aircraft. The marks must always be kept clean and visible.
- 13. The aircraft shall carry affixed to the car or basket or to the fuselage, in a prominent position, a metal plate inscribed with the names and residence of the owner and the marks of nationality and registration.

HEREAS by Section 48 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1928 (7 Edw. 7. c. 29; 4 & 5 Geo. 5. c. 18; 9 & 10 Geo. 5. c. 80; and 18 Geo. 5. c. 3), it is provided that the said Section shall apply only to vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of a foreign state with respect to which His Majesty, by Order in Council, declares that the laws thereof confer corresponding rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into the foreign state or the territorial waters thereof:

And whereas by Section 91 of the said Acts it is provided that the provisions of that Section shall apply only in the case of those foreign states with respect to which His

Majesty by Order in Council declares them to be applicable:

And whereas at The Hague on the 6th November, 1925, His Majesty and the heads of certain foreign states having deemed it expedient to make certain modifications in and additions to the International Convention of the 20th March, 1883, for the creation of an International Union for the Protection of Industrial Property, as revised at Brussels on the 14th December, 1900, and at Washington on the 2nd June, 1911, agreed upon a Convention comprising the said International Convention as revised at Brussels and at Washington with the said modifications and additions, the ratification of which Convention was duly effected by Great Britain and certain other foreign States:

And whereas the Serb-Croat-Slovene Kingdom has acceded to the said Convention:

And whereas by reason of the accession to the said Convention by the Serb-Croat-Slovene Kingdom the laws thereof confer rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into the Serb-Croat-Slovene Kingdom or the territorial waters thereof, corresponding to those mentioned in the said Section 48:

And whereas the said Convention is an arrangement of the nature contemplated by the said Section 91:

And whereas by Order in Council dated the 14th day of February, 1921 (S.R. & O. 1921, No. 267), His Majesty was pleased to declare that the provisions of the said Section 91 should apply to the Serb-Croat-Slovene Kingdom, and it is expedient, on the making of this Order, that the said Order should be revoked:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Him in manner hereinbefore recited and of all other powers in that behalf, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to declare, and it is hereby declared, as follows:—

1. The laws of the Serb-Croat-Slovene Kingdom confer rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into the Serb-Croat-Slovene Kingdom or the territorial waters thereof, corresponding to those mentioned in Section 48 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1928.

2. The provisions of Section 91 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1928, shall be applicable to the Serb-Croat-Slovene Kingdom.

3. The Order in Council dated the 14th day of February, 1921, relating to the Serb-Croat-Slovene Kingdom, is hereby revoked.

4. This Order may be cited as The Industrial Property Convention (Serb-Croat-Slovene Kingdom) Order, 1928.

And whereas it appears that without the exercise of their powers under the said Act by marriage officers in Egypt sufficient facilities exist under the form of marriage referred to in Section 22 of the said Act for marriages in Egypt of British subjects who are serving in Egypt in His Majesty's Military Forces or in the Royal Air Force:

And whereas it is necessary on account of the urgency of the matters dealt with by this Order that this Order should come into operation forthwith in accordance with Section 2 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Foreign Marriage Act, 1892, or otherwise enabling Him in this behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

- (1) This Order may be cited as the Foreign Marriages (Egypt) Order in Council, 1928.
- (2) No marriage officer in Egypt shall solemnize any marriage between parties either of whom is serving in Egypt in His Majesty's Military Forces or the Royal Air Force.
- (3) Nothing in this Order shall be deemed to affect the powers as a marriage officer under Section 12 of the Foreign Marriage Act, 1892, of any commanding officer of any of His Majesty's ships.

And the Right Honourable Sir Austen Chamberlain, K.G., one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein.

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended

in the said Report:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices of Moreton Morrell and Newbold Pacey are now full the Reverend William Coleman being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Moreton Morrell and the Reverend Roland Charles Herring being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Newbold Pacey:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Charles Lisle, Bishop of Coventry (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Moreton Morrell and the said Benefice of Newbold Pacey shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Newbold Pacey with Moreton Morrell' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if the said Benefice of Moreton Morrell only shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent, then the said union shall take effect upon the then next avoidance of the said Benefice of Newbold Pacey and the then Incumbent of Moreton Morrell shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, and if the said Benefice of Newbold Pacey only shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Moreton Morrell; and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant, then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Moreton Morrell if the Incumbent at that time of the said Benefice of Newbold Pacey shall have been instituted to Newbold Pacey subsequently to the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or if instituted before that date shall consent to become the Incumbent of the United Benefice; but if he shall have been instituted to Newbold Pacey before that date and shall not so consent, then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of the Benefice of Newbold Pacey following such avoidance of the Benefice of Moreton Morrell and the then Incumbent of Moreton Morrell shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Newbold Pacey shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, the Patron of the said Benefice of Moreton Morrell having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patrons of the said Benefice of Newbold Pacey having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Coventry has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said

Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Arthur Cayley, Bishop of Gloucester, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Preston, All Saints and Siddington, Saint Peter with Saint Mary, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Gloucester and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Gloucester signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

All Saints, and the Reverend Edwin Watkin Hughes being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Siddington, Saint Peter with Saint Mary:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Arthur Cayley, Bishop of Gloucester (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Preston, All Saints, and the said Benefice of Siddington, Saint Peter with Saint Mary, shall be per-

manently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Siddington with Preston' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if one only of the said two Benefices shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall consent become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but, if he shall not so consent then the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of his Benefice and the then Incumbent (if any) of the other of the said two Benefices shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice; and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of either of the said two Benefices if the Incumbent at that time of the other of the said two Benefices shall consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of his Benefice and the then Incumbent (if any) of the other of the said two Benefices shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Preston, All Saints, shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, and the first turn of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice after the union shall belong to the Patron of that one of the two said Benefices of Preston, All Saints, and Siddington, Saint Peter with Saint Mary, an Incumbent of which does not become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice under any of the provisions of clause 2 of this Scheme.

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

"And whereas both of the said Benefices of Harnhill with Driffield and Ampney are now full the Reverend Gilbert Allen Grace being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Harnhill with Driffield and the Reverend Thomas Edgar Johnson being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of

That upon the said union taking effect the said Church of Saint Andrew, Canterbury, shall be appropriated as a Church Room or Parish Hall in connection with the United Benefice and the said Benefice of Canterbury, Saint George the Martyr with Saint Mary Magdalene, and be used for such educational, charitable or other purposes in connection with the Church of England having in view the intellectual, moral or social welfare of parishioners of those Benefices and others and subject to such conditions, regulations and provisions as the Archbishop of Canterbury shall by Deed made pursuant to the 24th Section of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, declare and appoint.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measure relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the said Benefice of Wickham Market shall be vacant the union of the said Benefices of Wickham Market and Lowdham with Pettistree and also the union of the said Benefices of Bredfield and Boulge shall forthwith take effect and the said William Maulkinson Snook if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Bredfield with Lowdham and Pettistree shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Bredfield with Boulge but if upon the day aforesaid the said Benefice of Wickham Market shall not be vacant then the said two unions shall take effect upon the next avoidance thereafter of the said Benefice of Wickham Market, and the said William Maulkinson Snook or his successor Incumbent of the United Benefice of Bredfield and Boulge with Lowdham and Pettistree (referred to in Part III of this Scheme) shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Bredfield with Boulge.

"3. That upon the said unions taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Wickham Market shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Wickham Market with Lowdham and Pettistree and the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Bredfield shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Bredfield with Boulge.

"4. That after the said unions have taken effect the course and succession in which the Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefices respectively from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, (a) that in every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice of Wickham Market with Lowdham and Pettistree after the union the Patron of the said Benefice of Bredfield with Lowdham and Pettistree shall have the first turn and the Patrons of the said Benefice of Wickham Market shall have the second and third turns

and (b) that in every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to the United Benefice of Bredfield with Boulge after the union the Patron of the said Benefice of Boulge with Debach shall have the first turn and the Patron of the said Benefice of Bredfield with Lowdham and Pettistree shall have the second and third turns.

"5. That at any time and from time to time after the unions have taken effect the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Wickham Market with Lowdham and Pettistree shall employ such clerical or lay assistance in the performance of the duties of the United Benefice as the Bishop may require and towards the remuneration of clergy or lay workers so required to be employed the Incumbent of the United Benefice shall be liable to provide out of the income of the United Benefice such sum as may be necessary not exceeding the sum of £100 in any one year.

"PART II.

"As to the proposed union of the Benefices of Burgh, Clopton and Debach we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further recommend and propose:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Burgh the said Benefice of Clopton and the said Benefice of Debach shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Burgh with Clopton and Debach' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the said Benefice of Burgh shall be vacant the union shall forthwith take effect and the said John Walter Bowden Page if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Clopton shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice but if upon the day aforesaid the said Benefice of Burgh shall not be vacant then the union shall take effect upon the next avoidance thereafter of the said Benefice of Burgh and the said John Walter Bowden Page or his successor, Incumbent of the United Benefice of Clopton with Debach (referred to in Part IV of this Scheme) shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Burgh with Clopton and Debach.

"3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Clopton shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice; and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Burgh and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund established pursuant to the 32nd Section of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

"4. That a Curate be appointed to assist the Incumbent in performing the duties of the United Benefice and that the stipend to be assigned to the Curate out of the revenues of the United Benefice shall be of such amount not exceeding £300 per annum as the Bishop may from time to time determine, this recommendation and proposal being made to the intent that the Bishop shall have the power of requiring the appointment of a Curate in accordance with and subject to the conditions and provisions of Subsection (b) of Section 18 of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

"5. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, that in every series of six successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice after the union the Patron of the said Benefice of Burgh shall have the second and the fourth turns, the Patron of the said Benefice of Clopton shall have the first, the third and the sixth turns, and the Patron of the said Benefice of Boulge with Debach shall have the fifth turn.

" 6. That as and from the date of the taking effect of the union of the said three Benefices of Burgh, Clopton and Debach or the date of the union (as provided in Part I of this Scheme) of the said two Benefices of Wickham Market and Lowdham with Pettistree whichever date shall be the later all the Tithe Rentcharges glebe lands and all other the endowments belonging to the United Benefice of Burgh with Clopton and Debach or which may hereafter belong to the same United Benefice shall be charged and for ever after be chargeable in favour of the Incumbent for the time being of the United Benefice of Wickham Market with Lowdham and Pettistree with the annual sum or yearly rentcharge hereinafter mentioned that is to say a clear annual sum or yearly rentcharge of £100 the same annual sum or yearly rentcharge to be as from the later of the two dates aforesaid due and payable to the Incumbent of the said United Benefice of Wickham Market with Lowdham and Pettistree and the said annual sum or yearly rentcharge to be apportionable between any outgoing Incumbent of the said United Benefice of Wickham Market with Lowdham and Pettistree or his representatives on the one hand and his successor in the same Incumbency on the other hand and to be receivable by the Incumbent in whose favour it is charged as aforesaid by equal half yearly payments on the first day of May and the first day of November in every year and for the recovery of the said yearly rentcharge the Incumbent of the said United Benefice of Wickham Market with Lowdham and Pettistree and his successors shall have and be entitled to all the powers and remedies provided by sections 121 and 122 of the Law of Property Act, 1925, in respect of rentcharges to which those Sections apply. Provided always that if at any time the Incumbent for the time being of the said United Benefice of Burgh with Clopton and Debach shall by any Deed duly executed by him under his hand and seal in accordance with the provisions of any Statute in that behalf enabling him, grant, convey, and annex to the said United Benefice of Wickham Market with Lowdham and Pettistree any part or parts of the endowments belonging to the said United Benefice of Burgh |

with Clopton and Debach which shall in the opinion of the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich for the time being be a just and fair equivalent or not less than an equivalent for the said yearly rentcharge hereby proposed to be created as aforesaid then the said annual sum or yearly rentcharge shall thereupon and thenceforth cease and be no longer payable.

" PART III.

"As to the proposed union of the Benefices of Bredfield with Lowdham and Pettistree and Boulge we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further recommend and propose:—

"1. That if upon the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme the said Benefice of Wickham Market shall be full then pending the taking effect of the unions referred to in Part I of this Scheme the said Benefice of Bredfield with Lowdham and Pettistree and the said Benefice of Boulge shall forthwith be united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Bredfield and Boulge with Lowdham and Pettistree' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects and the said William Maulkinson Snook if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Bredfield with Lowdham and Pettistree shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"2. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Bredfield with Lowdham and Pettistree shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"3. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time if the same shall become vacant before the unions referred to in Part I of this Scheme shall have taken effect shall be as follows, that is to say that in every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice after the union the Patron of the said Benefice of Bredfield with Lowdham and Pettistree shall have the first and second turns and the Patron of the said Benefice of Boulge with Debach shall have the third turn.

" PART IV.

"As to the proposed union of the Benefices of Clopton and Debach, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further recommend and propose:—

"1. That if upon the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme the said Benefice of Burgh shall be full, then pending the taking effect of the union referred to in Part II of this Scheme the said Benefice of Clopton and the said Benefice of Debach shall forthwith be united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Clopton with Debach' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects, and the said John Walter Bowden Page if he is then Incumbent of the said

Benefice of Clopton shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"2. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Clopton shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"3. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time if the same shall become vacant before the union referred to in Part II of this Scheme shall have taken effect shall be as follows, that is to say, that in every series of four successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice after the union the Patron of the said Benefice of Clopton shall have the first, the second and the third turns, and the Patron of the said Benefice of Boulge with Debach shall have the fourth turn.

" PART V.

"As to the endowments and property of the present United Benefices of Bredfield with Lowdham and Pettistree and Boulge with Debach, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further recommend and propose:—

"1. That upon the taking effect of any of the unions referred to in this Scheme the endowments and property now belonging to the said Benefice of Boulge with Debach shall (save as hereinafter mentioned) be divided as follows, that is to say there shall be transferred and annexed to the United Benefice of Bredfield with Boulge or to the United Benefice of Bredfield and Boulge with Lowdham and Pettistree as the case may be the whole of the Tithe Rentcharges commuted at £134 arising within the Parish of Boulge and now or formerly payable to the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Boulge with Debach together with all capital sums of money, stocks, securities and other property representing or being the produce of any sale, redemption or other conversion of all or any of such Tithe Rentcharges, and there shall be transferred and annexed to the United Benefice of Burgh with Clopton and Debach or to the United Benefice of Clopton with Debach as the case may be all other the endowments and property belonging to the said Benefice of Boulge with Debach.

"2. That upon the taking effect of any of the unions referred to in this Scheme the capital sum of money now in the hands of the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty representing the proceeds of the sale of the Parsonage House formerly belonging to the said Benefice of Boulge with Debach shall cease to be held for the benefit of that Benefice and shall be held by the said Governors for the benefit of the United Benefice of Burgh and Clopton with Debach, and the said sum of money (together with all accumulations of income, if any, pending the taking effect of the union of the said Benefices of Burgh, Clopton and Debach) shall be applied towards the cost of providing a house of residence for the Curate referred to in Clause 4 of Part II of this Scheme.

"3. That upon the taking effect of the unions referred to in Part I of this Scheme the endowments and property now belonging to

the said Benefice of Bredfield with Lowdham and Pettistree shall be divided as follows, that is to say, there shall be transferred and annexed to the United Benefice of Wickham Market with Lowdham and Pettistree the whole of the Tithe Rent Charge commuted at £96 15s. arising within the Parish of Pettistree and now or formerly belonging to the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Bredfield with Lowdham and Pettistree together with all capital sums of money, stocks, securities and other property representing or being the produce of any sale redemption or other conversion of all or any of such Tithe Rentcharges and there shall be transferred and annexed to the United Benefice of Bredfield with Boulge all other the endowments and property belonging to the said Benefice of Bredfield with Lowdham and Pettistree.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich.

WHEREAS the Right Reverend John Augustine, Lord Bishop of Lichfield, has, under the Pluralities Acts, 1938 and 1887, made a Representation to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, in the following terms:—

"I, John Augustine, Lord Bishop of Lichfield, beg leave to represent to your Grace:—

"That it appears to me that under the provisions of the Acts of Parliament called 'The Pluralities Acts, 1838 and 1887,' the place of district or portion of Land known as the District of Amington described in the First Schedule hereto may be advantageously separated from the Parish of Tamworth in the Diocese of Lichfield to which it belongs and be united for Ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of Shuttington in the Diocese of Birmingham to which it is contiguous as the spiritual care of the Inhabitants thereof will thereby be more conveniently and effectually provided for.

"That pursuant to the directions of the 26th Section of the Act 1 and 2 Vic. c. 106 as amended by the Pluralities Act, 1887, I have drawn up in writing a Scheme appended to this Representation describing the mode in which it appears to me that the alterations above proposed may be best effected and how the changes consequent upon such alterations in respect to Ecclesiastical jurisdiction, Glebe lands, Tithes, rent charges and other Ecclesiastical dues, rates, and payments and in respect to Patronage and rights to Pews may be made with justice to all parties interested and I submit the same to your Grace together with the Consents in writing of the Lord Bishop of Birmingham and the respective Patrons and Incumbents of the Benefices of the said Parishes of Tamworth and Shuttington to the intent that your Grace may if you shall be satisfied with the said Scheme certify the same and such Consents to His Majesty in Council.

"Given under my hand this sixteenth day of August one thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight.

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

" SCHEME.

"It is proposed that the District or portion of land described in the First Schedule hereto and delineated in the accompanying Map and thereon colcured pink shall be separated from the Parish of Tamworth in the Diocese of Lichfield to which it belongs and be annexed to and united with the Parish of Shuttington in the Diocese of Birmingham for ecclesiastical purposes and to be known in future as the Parish of Shuttington with Amington.

"That the Incumbent of the said Parish of Shuttington shall have exclusive Cure of Souls within the District of Amington so transferred to the Parish of Shuttington.

"That all ecclesiastical offices shall be performed for the Inhabitants of the said District

of Amington in the Parish Church of Shuttington (or in the Church situate in the District of Amington) and that the fees for all such offices and all other such ecclesiastical dues offerings and emoluments usually payable to the Incumbent of a Benefice as shall arise or become payable within or in respect of the said District of Amington shall belong to the Incumbent of the said Parish of Shuttington.

"That the interest or other income arising from the Capital monies particulars of which are set out in the Second Schedule hereto and the annual rentcharge and dole and the properties also set out in such Schedule shall belong to the Vicar of Shuttington but no other change shall be made in regard to Glebe lands Tithes or Tithe rent charges compositions in lieu of Tithes endowments or other annual payments of or belonging to the Benefices of the Parishes herein referred to nor in

respect to Patronage.

"That the Inhabitants of the said District shall be entitled to accommodation in the Church of the Parish of Shuttington to which it is proposed that the said District shall be annexed and in common with the Parishioners of that Parish and shall not henceforth be entitled to any accommodation in the Church of the Parish of Tamworth from which they shall be separated except nevertheless any person or persons (if any) possessing a legal right by Faculty or otherwise to the exclusive use of any Pews or Sittings in the last mentioned Church and who may not be willing to relinquish and give up the same.

"The First Schedule referred to in the fore-

going Representation and Scheme.

"To be added to the Parish of Shuttington in the Diocese of Birmingham from the Parish of Tamworth in the Diocese of Lichfield.

"That portion of the Parish of Tamworth known as the District of Amington delineated and coloured pink in the accompanying Map and containing in the whole 1,694.3 acres or thereabouts.

"The Second Schedule referred to in the foregoing Representation and Scheme.

"1. The Sum of £480 in the hands of Queen Anne's Bounty now bearing interest at 3 per cent. and representing a Sum of £500 Three per cent. Annuities transferred by C. H. W. a'Court Repington of Amington Hall in 1864 upon trust to apply the income towards providing for the Performance of Divine Service in the Church or Chapel of Amington.

"2. Rent Charge of £20 per annum created by Deed of Trust dated 7th September, 1836, payable by the Proprietors of the Amington Hall Estate for the performance of Divine

Service at Amington Church.

"3. The Benefaction of £2,000 in respect of which a yearly payment of £60 is made by the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England under an Instrument dated the 13th May, 1909, and the further yearly sum of £60 granted by the said Commissioners by the said Instrument to meet the said Benefaction.

One acre of land or thereabouts situate in the village of Amington in the Parish of Tamworth in the County of Warwick formerly part of a Close called 'Green Fortune' together with the Church Schools and the Master's House erected thereon now vested in the before mentioned Lichfield Diocesan Trust by Deed dated 16th July, 1898.

"We, Ernest William, Lord Bishop of Birmingham, within whose Diocese the Parish of Shuttington is situated, John Augustine, Lord Bishop of Lichfield, Patron of the Benefice or Vicarage of Tamworth, Ernest Henry Rogers, Vicar of Tamworth and the said Ernest William, Lord Bishop of Birmingham, the Patron of the Benefice or Vicarage of Shuttington (the same being now vacant) do hereby signify our consent to the Scheme above proposed.

DANGEROUS DRUGS ACTS, 1920-1925.

Notice is hereby given under the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that the Secretary of State for the Home Department proposes, after the expiration of forty days from this date, to make Regulations under Section 7 of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920 (10 & 11 Geo. V, cap. 46) controlling the manufacture, sale, possession and distribution of the drugs to which Part III of that Act applies.

The principal objects of the Regulations

- (1) To consolidate into one code the provisions of the seven separate sets of regulations at present in force.
- (2) To apply the provisions of the existing Regulations to the drugs and preparations which have recently been brought under Part III of the Act of 1920, viz.:—extract and tincture of Indian hemp, dihydro-oxycodeinone, dihydrocodeinone, and preparations containing them, and preparations containing less than one-tenth per cent. of diacetylmorphine.

Provision is also made for the constitution of a Tribunal (similar to that which has already been constituted for medical practitioners in accordance with the recommendations of the Departmental Committee on Morphine and Heroin addiction) to which the Secretary of State may refer any case where there is reason to think that a dentist may be

contravening the provisions of the Regulations with respect to the supply, administration or prescribing of dangerous drugs.

TRAMWAYS ACT, 1870, AND BLACKPOOL IMPROVE-MENT ACT, 1925.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Blackpool acting by the Council as local authority in this behalf did on the 3rd day of October, 1928, make the following Bye-laws and Regulations:—

BYE-LAWS AND REGULATIONS made by the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Blackpool with respect to Tramways and portions of Tramways for the time being belonging to and worked by them.

The Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Blackpool, in the County Palatine of Lancaster, under the powers conferred upon them by the Tramways Act, 1870, and the Blackpool Improvement Act, 1925, do hereby, as promoters and owners of the Blackpool Corporation Tramways, make the following Bye-laws and Regulations with respect to the Tramways and portions of Tramways for the time being belonging to and worked by the Corporation.

Interpretation.

1. Throughout these Bye-laws the following words shall have the meanings respectively assigned to them, that is to say, "Corporation" means The Mayor Aldermen and Bur-

gesses of the Borough of Blackpool and any Lessee or other persons for the time being working the Tramways hereinafter defined; "Tramways" means the Tramway and Motor Omnibus System worked by the Corporation, whether situate within the County Borough of Blackpool, or in any other district where the Corporation have running powers; "Car" means any Carriage or Car run upon the Tramways and belonging to the Corporation, and any Motor Omnibus owned and used by the Corporation for the conveyance of passengers; "Passenger" means every person being carried or conveyed upon or by a car; "Conductor" means any officer or servant of the Corporation having charge of, or helping in the charge of a Car; "Driver" means any officer or servant of the Corporation driving or helping to drive a car; "Tramway Premises" means any Station, Waiting Room, or other premises used in connection with the Tramways.

Offensive Language or Conduct.

2. No person shall swear or use obscene, indecent or offensive language or conduct himself offensively whilst in or upon any Car or Tramway Premises, or spit, or commit any nuisance in, upon, from, or against any Car or Tramway Premises, or in any way wilfully interfere with the comfort of any

. passenger.

No person shall, whilst travelling in or upon any Car, or whilst upon any Tramway Premises, sing or play or perform upon any musical instrument, or distribute advertisements or tracts of any kind, or beg or collect money, alms or subscriptions, or sell any article, or play any game, or gamble, or throw down and leave in or upon Tramway Premises or any Car, any waste paper or other refuse, or deposit remnants of food or fruit or any objectionable matter in or upon any Tramway Premises or any Car.

Objectionable Persons.

3. No person in a state of intoxication, or affected with any dangerous, contagious or infectious disorder, and no person who from any other cause or for any other reason in the opinion of the Conductor might be offensive or objectionable to any passenger, shall board or enter any Car, and any such person, found in or upon any Car shall leave the Car on being requested by the Conductor to do so, and on his refusal he may be immediately removed from the Car by or under the direction of the Conductor.

Dogs.

4. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or on any Car, except by permission of the Conductor or the Tramways General Manager. Any dog or other animal taken into or on any Car shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the Car immediately upon request by the Conductor, and in default of compliance with such request, such dog or other animal may be removed by or under the direction of the Conductor.

Damage to Car.

5. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil or damage the seats, cushions, curtains or linings, or remove or deface any number plate, printed

or other notice in or on any Car, or break or scratch any window of, or otherwise wilfully damage any Car or its equipment.

Any person acting in contravention of this Bye-law shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws, in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage so done.

Smoking.

6. No person shall smoke or carry a lighted pipe, cigar or cigarette in or upon any Car, except in a compartment or on seats especially set apart for the purpose.

Payment of Fares.

7. Each passenger shall pay to the Conductor the fare legally demandable for the journey, whether the same shall or shall not be demanded.

Upon payment of the fare, the Conductor shall give, and the passenger shall accept, a ticket for the journey or stage in respect of which the fare is paid. Such ticket shall only be available by the Car on which it is issued, and by the passenger to whom it is given, or in respect of whom it is issued.

Each passenger on a one-man operated vehicle shall tender his fare on entering the vehicle unless such fare shall have been previously paid to an authorised conductor.

Tickets.

8. Each passenger shall show his ticket (if any) when required to do so to the Conductor, or other duly authorised servant of the Corporation, and shall also, when required to do so, either deliver up his ticket in such a condition that the number and other material portion thereof can be read and identified, or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

Offensive Clothing.

9. No person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the Conductor of a Car, soil, injure, or damage the seats, linings, curtains, or cushions of the Car, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, shall enter, or remain in or upon any Car and the Conductor may prevent any such person entering the Car

No such person shall enter in or upon any Car after having been requested not to do so by the Conductor, and if any such person be found in or upon any Car, he shall on the request of the Conductor, leave such Car upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned or tendered to him, and on his refusal to do so he may be removed by or under the direction of the Conductor.

Provided that no person shall be prevented from entering or remaining in or upon a Car under the provisions of this Bye-law on the ground of the condition of his dress or clothing if such condition is solely due to the nature of his employment.

Provided further that on top covered Cars any such person as last mentioned shall, if so directed by the Conductor, travel on the upper deck when there is seating accommodation available thereon.

Interference with the Duties of Driver or Conductor.

10. No person other than the Conductor or Driver shall change or remove the route indicators, or Destination Boards, or interfere with the Controller, Brakes, Switches, Lights, Trolley Cord or any part of the Car or its equipment.

Luggage.

11. Every person about to enter or mount any Car or being a passenger, and in either case having any luggage (including the tools of artisans, mechanics, and daily labourers) shall, unless otherwise permitted by the Conductor, place such luggage on the front or Driver's platform, or on the rear or Conductor's platform, or in a compartment specially set apart for the conveyance of parcels, and not elsewhere on any Car. The Conductor may decline to take into or upon any Car any luggage which from its size or otherwise is not suitable for conveyance in or upon such Car.

Full Number of Passengers.

12. No person shall board or enter a Car carrying the full number of passengers or remain therein or thereon when warned by the Conductor not to do so.

The Conductor shall have power to prevent any person boarding or entering a Car, carrying the full number of passengers, and any person already upon such a Car shall immediately leave the same when requested to do so by the Conductor, and upon refusal he may be removed by or under the direction of the Conductor.

Disabled Cars.

13. If at any time a Car becomes disabled, or damaged, or from any cause unable to proceed, all passengers shall, upon the request of the Conductor, leave the Car, and shall not be entitled to the return of the amount of fares paid by them, but shall be entitled to continue their journey by the next available Car on any section. No person shall board or enter a disabled or damaged Car.

Cars proceeding to Sheds.

14. No person shall travel upon a Car which is proceeding to a shed, and is not on its usual route unless permitted to do so by the Conductor, and where such person is so permitted, he shall pay the usual fare payable on such route.

Travelling on Steps, &c.

15. No person other than the Driver or the Conductor of the Car, or other duly authorised Servant of the Corporation, shall travel or ride upon the platform, steps, outside rails, buffers, or any external part of a Car not intended for passengers, or stand on the upper deck, and shall cease to do so immediately on request by the Conductor.

Firearms, &c.

16. No person shall place or carry in or upon any Car loaded firearms, or any article, instrument, or implement or any material or substance which may be dangerous or offensive to the passengers or likely to cause a nuisance. or to soil or damage any Car or the clothing of any passenger.

Entering and Leaving Cars.

17. Except at a terminus and when so directed by the Conductor at other stopping places appointed by the Corporation, every passenger shall enter and depart from a Car by the step of the hindermost or Conductor's

platform, and not otherwise providing that this Byelaw shall not apply to any Car, which can, with the approval of the Ministry of Transport, be worked by one man in charge only, or Cars constructed to be loaded otherwise than at the hindermost or Conductor's platform.

All persons desiring to board a car for the purpose of travelling thereon shall first permit all persons intending to do so to alight from the Car, and persons desiring to depart from a Car shall cause no unnecessary delay to intending passengers.

Entering or leaving a Car in motion.

18. No person shall board or leave, or attempt to board or leave, any Car in motion.

Use of Signal Bells.

19. No person not being a servant of the Corporation shall ring or cause to be rung any of the signal bells upon any Car, so as to effect the unnecessary stoppage of any Car, nor signal a Car to start.

Illegal Offence.

20. Any person who shall commit whilst in or on any Car any breach of these Bye-laws shall, if the offence is continued, be liable in addition to incurring the penalty hereinafter provided, to be removed immediately from the Car by or under the direction of the Conductor, and if such person shall have paid his fare he shall not be entitled to have the amount thereof refunded.

Passengers to Form a Queue.

21. On occasions when six or more persons being intending passengers are awaiting at any stopping place or terminus upon the tramways to board or enter a Car, they shall form in a line or queue and board or enter the Car in the order in which they stand, and no person shall take or endeavour to take a place in such a line or queue when formed out of proper order, or shall enter or endeavour to enter a car out of the order in which he stood in such line or queue or before any person who stood in front of him in such line or queue.

Children Standing on Seats.

22. No child shall be allowed by the person in charge of such child to stand on the seats or cushions of any Car, and if any child shall stand on the seats or cushions of a car and damage be caused thereto, or to the clothing of any passenger in consequence thereof, the person in charge of such child shall be hable to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage so caused or sustained.

Obstruction.

23. No person shall wilfully obstruct or impede any Conductor, Driver or other servant of the Corporation acting in the performance of his duty upon or in connection with any Car or the Tramways.

Conductors and Drivers to Enforce Bye-laws.

24. Every Inspector, Conductor, and Driver of a Car shall, to the best of his ability, enforce these Bye-laws and prevent any breach thereof.

Penalty.

25. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these Bye-laws shall be liable in respect of each offence to a penalty not exceeding Forty Shillings.

Bye-laws to be kept in Cars.

26. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside of each car in use and in or about each tramway shelter or waiting room a printed copy of these Bye-laws.

Repeal of Existing Bye-laws.

27.
