At the Court at *Buckingham Palace*, the 1st day of *November*, 1928.

PRESENT,

The King's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 25th day of September, 1928, (G.H.), in the words following, viz. :—

“Whereas by Section 30 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1865, it is enacted that the Admiralty, with the approval of Your Majesty in Council, may, from time to time, make free grants of land, part of the lands vested in them by virtue of this Act, for the erection of buildings, and providing conveniences for places of worship, residence of Ministers, education of children or other public purposes (so that any such grant of land does not include any right to the minerals under the land granted, or comprise more than two acres in any one parish):

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the free grant to the East Suffolk County Council of a piece of land measuring 1,785 square yards or thereabouts at present vested in the Admiralty by virtue of the aforesaid Act, for the purpose of the widening of the Holbrook-Stutton Road.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with

the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:
