

MINISTRY OF TRANSPORT.

IN THE MATTER OF THE LONDON TRAFFIC ACT, 1924.

Notice is hereby given under the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that it is proposed by the Minister of Transport, after the expiration of at least forty days from this date, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by Section 7 of the aforesaid London Traffic Act, to make regulations amending the London Traffic (Restricted Streets) Regulations.

And notice is hereby further given that on account of urgency the Minister of Transport has under Section 2 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, made the London Traffic (Restricted Streets) Amendment (Routes Nos. 61D, 62, 79 and 620) Provisional Regulations, 1928, to come into operation forthwith as provisional regulations to continue in force until regulations have been made in accordance with the provisions of Section 1 of that Act.

These Regulations provide for an alteration in certain omnibus services run to and from Kingston-on-Thames on Saturdays.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 5TH NOVEMBER, 1928.)

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1928 (No. 72).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Contraction of Crewe (Cheshire) Infected Area.

1.—(1) The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1928 (No. 67) shall be read and have effect as if the Area described in the First Schedule to this Order were substituted for the Infected Area described in the Schedule to that Order.

(2) This Article shall come into operation on the tenth day of November, nineteen hundred and twenty-eight.

Further Contraction of Swanley (Kent) Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area.

2.—(1) The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1928 (No. 65) as amended by the Order of the Minister (No. 4673) dated the 24th October, 1928, and the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1928 (No. 69) shall be read and have effect as if the area described in the Second Schedule to this Order were substituted for the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area described in the Schedule to the last mentioned Order.

(2) This Article shall come into operation on the twelfth day of November, nineteen hundred and twenty-eight.

Release of Swanley (Kent) Area from Restrictions.

3. The area described in the Second Schedule to this Order shall cease to be an Infected Area for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925, as from the nineteenth day of November, nineteen hundred and twenty-eight.

Short Title.

4. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1928 (No. 72).

FIRST SCHEDULE.

An Area comprising:—

In the county of Chester.

The borough of Crewe; and the parishes of Wimboldsley, Tetton, Warmingham, Minshull Vernon, Moston, Elton, Sandbach, Wheelock, Hassall, Haslington, Crewe, Barthomley, Weston, Chorlton, Basford, Hough, Lea, Shavington cum Gresty, Walgherton, Wybunbury, Rope, Wistaston, Willaston, Stapeley, Batherton, Nantwich, Acton, Henhull, Worleston, Hurleston, Poole, Woolstanwood, Stoke, Cholmondeston, Aston juxta Mondrum, Church Minshull, Leighton and Church Coppenthal.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

An Area comprising:—

In the county of Kent.

The parishes of Sutton at Hone and Wilmington;

So much of the parishes of Eynsford, St. Mary Cray, St. Paul's Cray, North Cray, Bexley, Dartford, Darenth, Horton Kirkby and Farningham as lies within the following boundary, namely:—

Commencing at the point where Oakfield Lane joins the Dartford—Wilmington road, thence in a westerly direction along Oakfield Lane in the direction of Bexley via Leyton Cross and Dartford Heath to the point where the Bexley—St. Mary Cray road is met;
