PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, and of the Act of the 37th and 38th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 63, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 11th day of October, 1928, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, and of the Act of the 37th and 38th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 63, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme with respect to the Archdeaconries and Rural Deaneries within the Diocese of Leicester:—

“ Whereas there are within the said Diocese of Leicester two Archdeaconries, to wit, the Archdeaconry of Leicester and the Archdeaconry of Loughborough:

“ And whereas the Right Reverend Cyril, Bishop of the said Diocese of Leicester, has represented to us that it is desirable to make certain new arrangements (being the arrangements hereinafter recommended and proposed) with respect to the said Archdeaconries of Leicester and Loughborough and to the Rural Deaneries within those Archdeaconries:

“ And whereas we are of opinion that the new arrangements now proposed by the said Cyril, Bishop of Leicester, may properly be carried into effect:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Cyril, Bishop of the said Diocese of Leicester (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and affixed his Episcopal Seal to this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that as from the day on which an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the said Archdeaconry of Leicester and the said Archdeaconry of Loughborough respectively shall comprise and consist of the Rural Deaneries, the names of which are

set down in numbered order under the name of each of the said two Archdeaconries respectively in the said Schedule to this Scheme annexed, and that the name which in such Schedule is given to any Rural Deanery shall be the name thereof, and that every Parish or Cure or Church, the name of which is set down in numbered order in the first column of the said Schedule under the name of the said Archdeaconry of Leicester or under the name of the said Archdeaconry of Loughborough and under the name of any Rural Deanery in either of the said two Archdeaconries respectively, shall belong to and be and form a part of the Archdeaconry and of the Rural Deanery under the respective names

of which it appears as aforesaid and shall be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of the Archdeacon of such Archdeaconry and of the Rural Dean of such Rural Deanery respectively and shall not belong to or be or form a part of any other Archdeaconry or Rural Deanery nor be subject to the jurisdiction or authority of any other Archdeacon or Rural Dean.

“ And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other matter or thing with respect to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, under or by virtue of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Leicester.

His Majesty The KING has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal to Babu Lakhan Ram, in recognition of his gallantry in the following circumstances:—

On 1st May, 1928, when a passenger train was approaching Najibabad Station a man threw himself on the track opposite the

Station building. Babu Lakhan Ram, an employee of the Railway, heard the shouts of those who had witnessed the occurrence but were afraid to attempt a rescue, and running to the spot, immediately jumped on to the track although the train was then only 30 yards away. Despite the man's struggles Babu Lakhan Ram was just able to drag him clear of the lines and hold him down until the train came to a standstill.

The rescued man, who was strongly built, proved to be demented and bent on committing suicide. Had he succeeded in resisting Babu Lakhan Ram's efforts to drag him clear, Babu Lakhan Ram would undoubtedly have been killed.

WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION ACT, 1925.

TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.

THE TRADE BOARDS (HOLLOW-WARE MAKING) ORDER, 1928.

The Minister of Labour hereby gives notice that he has made a Special Order dated 26th October, 1928, altering the description of the trade contained in the Appendix to Order III of the Schedule to the Trade Boards Provisional Orders Confirmation Act, 1913, by substituting the following description:—

APPENDIX.

1. Subject to the provisions of this Appendix the Hollow-ware Making trade consists of the following operations:—

(a) All work in connection with:—

(i) the manufacture from sheet iron or sheet steel (hereinafter called black plate) of articles of hollow-ware or parts thereof;

(ii) the manufacture of baths and dustbins from black plate or from black plate coated with any metal, of an average thickness not exceeding .0392 of an inch (20 Birmingham Gauge);

(iii) the manufacture of kegs, drums, tapers, taper-necked cans and painters' pots, or parts thereof:—

from black plate of less than .125 of an inch thickness or

from black plate coated with any metal and of an average thickness exceeding .01745 of an inch (27 Birmingham Gauge) but less than .125 of an inch:

and the repair thereof;

(iv) the manufacture of boxes, canisters and bottles, or parts thereof from black plate whether coated or not with any metal when carried on in an establishment, branch or department mainly engaged in the work specified in paragraph (1) (a) (iii) hereof;

(v) the manufacture of kegs, drums, tapers, taper-necked cans and painters' pots, or parts thereof from black plate coated with any metal and of an average thickness not exceeding .01745 of an inch (27 Birmingham Gauge) when carried on in an establishment, branch or department mainly engaged in the work specified in paragraph 1 (a) (iii) hereof;

and the repair thereof;

(vi) the manufacture from any iron or steel of forged, stamped or pressed mountings or fittings, or parts thereof, for articles specified in paragraph 1 (a) (i), (ii) and (iii) hereof, when done by workers wholly or mainly so engaged, or in association or conjunction with the manufacture specified in paragraph 1 (a) (i), (ii) and (iii) hereof.

(b) All work in a tin box establishment in connection with—

(i) the manufacture of boxes, canisters and bottles, or parts thereof from black plate whether coated or not with any metal;

(ii) the manufacture of kegs, drums, tapers, taper-necked cans and painters' pots, or parts thereof from black plate coated with any metal and of an average thickness not exceeding .01745 of an inch (27 Birmingham Gauge);

and the repair thereof;

(iii) the manufacture of boxes partly from black plate whether coated or not with any metal and partly from paper, chip, cardboard, pulp-board, or other similar box board;

(iv) the manufacture of any other articles or parts thereof from black plate whether coated or not with any metal.

(c) All work in connection with the manufacture of cans of a kind ordinarily used to contain petrol.

2. Work in connection with the manufacture specified:—

(a) in paragraph 1 (a) hereof includes—
(i) finishing;

(ii) the work of persons employed in the factory or workshop in counting or weighing materials handed to workers and articles or parts thereof received from workers;

(iii) packing, warehousing, despatching, the work of inside messengers, yard-workers and stokers and work of a similar nature;

(b) in paragraph 1 (b) and 1 (c) hereof includes finishing.

3. Notwithstanding anything in this Appendix the following operations are not operations in the Hollow-ware Making trade—

(a) Work specified in paragraph 1 (a) hereof when performed in an establishment, branch or department (not being a tin box establishment) mainly engaged on other work and in which the jointing and finishing of articles or parts of articles specified in paragraph 1 (a) hereof are done by workers mainly employed in jointing and finishing other articles;

(b) the finishing (other than enamelling) of articles or parts of articles specified in paragraph 1 hereof when performed in a department in which the main business carried on is the finishing of articles other than articles specified in paragraph 1 hereof and in which no manufacture specified in paragraph 1 hereof is carried on;

(c) packing, warehousing, despatching, the work of inside messengers, yard workers and stokers, and work of a similar nature when performed in an establishment not otherwise

engaged on operations in the Hollow-ware Making trade;

(d) the manufacture of baths or dustbins from black plate or from black plate coated with any metal, of an average thickness exceeding .0392 of an inch (20 Birmingham Gauge);

(e) the manufacture of baths or dustbins from black plate or from black plate coated with any metal, of an average thickness not exceeding .0392 of an inch (20 Birmingham Gauge) in an establishment, branch or department mainly engaged in operations other than those specified in paragraph 1 (a) hereof or in the manufacture specified in paragraph 3 (d) hereof or both in such operations and such manufacture;

(f) the manufacture of component parts of motor vehicles, motor plants, aircraft, cycles or motor cycles;

(g) the manufacture of any article or part of any article when made in an establishment mainly engaged in the manufacture of motor vehicles, motor plants, aircraft, cycles or motor cycles or of component parts thereof;

(h) all clerical work other than work specified in paragraph 2 (a) (ii) hereof;

(i) the making of loose linings for packing cases when such linings cannot be used apart from the packing cases;

(j) the making of uniform cases, suit and dress cases, bonnet and helmet boxes, hand-made cash boxes, deed boxes, dispatch boxes and letter boxes;

(k) the manufacture of tin rollers, tin roller drums, card cans, coiler cans and other articles for use with textile or other machinery;

(l) the manufacture of pen boxes in an establishment mainly engaged in pen manufacture;

(m) the sealing or closing of filled tin boxes and tin canisters;

(n) the following operations when performed in a tin-box establishment or in connection with the manufacture of cans of a kind ordinarily used to contain petrol;

(i) the receiving, handling, and storing in bulk of raw materials;

(ii) the work of persons employed in the factory, or workshop in counting or weighing materials handed to workers and articles or parts thereof received from workers;

(iii) packing, warehousing and despatching;

(iv) the work of inside messengers, yard workers and stokers, and work of a similar nature;

(o) all processes of lithographic printing and processes of varnishing or lacquering done in connection therewith;

(p) all work in connection with the maintenance or upkeep of premises, machinery or plant.

4. For the purpose of this Appendix the expression "tin box establishment" means an establishment, branch or department in which the main business carried on is the manufacture specified in paragraph 1 (b) (i) or paragraph 1 (b) (ii) hereof, or paragraphs 1 (b) (i) and 1 (b) (ii) hereof

The expression "finishing" includes the operations of coating, polishing and cleaning articles.

The Minister has also issued Regulations dated 26th October, 1928, under the above Order, with a view to setting up separate Trade Boards for the Hollow-ware, Tin Box and Keg and Drum Sections of the trade. (2) that the benefit of the Scheme in connection with the application of the income of the Yeovil Free School Exhibition Foundation shall be extended to such parts of the proposed added areas as do not at the present time form part of the Ancient Parish of Yeovil.

(3) that the Scheme in connection with the administration of the Yeovil Foundation of John Nowes shall be modified and amended in the following manner:—

(a) Clause 3 (b) to be repealed and the following clause substituted:—

“One Additional Governor to be appointed by the Vicar and Churchwardens of St. James' Church.”

(b) Clause 14 to be repealed, such repeal however not to affect exhibitions that have already been awarded and are now being maintained by the Governors under the provisions of that clause;

(c) Clause 13 to be amended to read as follows:—

“After payment of any expenses of administration, the yearly income of the Foundation shall be applied by the Governors of the area (in this clause called the privileged area) consisting of the Municipal Borough of Yeovil, the Parish of Yeovil Without and the Hamlet of Alvington, as follows:—

(a) A part not exceeding one-third of the said income may, if the Governors think fit, be applied in or towards making arrangements for attending to the health or physical condition of children attending any Public Elementary School in the privileged area in accordance with rules to be made by the Governors with the approval of the Board of Education signified by writing under their seal.

(b) Subject to the foregoing provision, the said income shall be applied in the maintenance of Junior or Senior Exhibitions, to be awarded to boys and girls resident in the privileged area who have for not less than two years at any time attended Public Elementary Schools and have, under examination, shown a satisfactory knowledge of the doctrines of the Church of England.”

(4) that provision should be made for differential rating in favour of the areas to be added to the Borough by authorising the Minister of Health to make a further Order, on application being made to him within two months after the passing of the Act confirming the provisional Order by the local authority of any of the added areas, providing for an abatement from the general rate levied by the Borough Council within the added area to which the application relates.

The provisions of Sections 100, 102, 104 and 114 of the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876, of Section 7 of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, and of the Foreign Parcels (Customs) Warrant, 1885, shall not apply to the aforesaid oils and articles which are delivered from the premises of exporters thereof for exportation on drawback by the Imperial and Foreign Parcel Post.

2. The provisions of Sections 117 and 118 of the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876, shall apply to such oils and articles with the modification that the proper Officer of Customs and Excise shall in place of certifying the shipment and exportation of the oils or articles certify that the certificate of posting hereinafter mentioned has been duly received; and instead of a declaration by the exporter or his agent that the oils or articles have been actually exported and not reloaded there shall be a declaration by the exporter or his agent that they have been duly delivered to an Officer of the Post Office in accordance with the provisions of this Warrant.

3. Every such parcel on its removal to the Post Office shall bear on the outer cover thereof a label on which shall be printed in conspicuous type the words "exported on drawback" and shall be accompanied by an authority for its exportation on drawback by parcel post signed by an Officer of Customs and Excise.

4. The Officer of the Post Office accepting such parcel duly labelled and accompanied by the Authority aforesaid shall give the sender a certificate on such authority of the posting of the parcel.

5. The delivery of every such parcel from the premises of the exporter shall be subject to such bond and to such special conditions as the said Commissioners may from time to time prescribe.

6. If any claim shall be made on the Postmaster-General for compensation in respect of the loss of or damage to any such parcel, that claim shall, in the absence of proof to the con-

trary be deemed to be conclusive evidence that such parcel has not been duly exported, and that its contents have gone into use in Great Britain or Northern Ireland, and any Drawback paid shall be repaid by the exporter.

7. Nothing in this warrant shall affect any prohibition in the Post Office Acts or Regulations of the sending by post of any substance, article or thing.

8. This Warrant shall come into operation on the first day of November, 1928.

9. This Warrant may be cited as the Foreign Parcels (Customs) Warrant, 1928.
