PARCEL POST.

THE FOREIGN PARCELS (CUSTOMS) WARRANT,
1928.

Dated 1st November, 1928.

Whereas it is desirable to make provision for the delivery from the premises of exporters for exportation on drawback by Parcel Post of such hydrocarbon oils in respect of which the duty payable under Section 2 of the Finance Act, 1928, has been paid, and of such articles containing hydrocarbon oil (on which the duty has been paid) which was used as an ingredient in the manufacture or preparation thereof, as the Commissioners of Customs and Excise may from time to time allow: We, the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of the powers conferred on us by section fourteen of the Post Office (Parcels) Act, 1882, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the recommendation of the Commissioners of Customs and Excise and of His Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by their respectively signing the same), order, direct, and declare as follows:—

1. The provisions of Sections 100, 102, 104 and 114 of the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876, of Section 7 of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, and of the Foreign Parcels (Customs) Warrant, 1885, shall not apply to the aforesaid oils and articles which are delivered from the premises of exporters thereof for exportation on drawback by the Imperial and Foreign Parcel Post.

2. The provisions of Sections 117 and 118 of the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876, shall apply to such oils and articles with the modification that the proper Officer of Customs and Excise shall in place of certifying the shipment and exportation of the oils or articles certify that the certificate of posting hereinafter mentioned has been duly received; and instead of a declaration by the exporter or his agent that the oils or articles have been actually exported and not reloaded there shall be a declaration by the exporter or his agent that they have been duly delivered to an Officer of the Post Office in accordance with the provisions of this Warrant.

3. Every such parcel on its removal to the Post Office shall bear on the outer cover thereof a label on which shall be printed in conspicuous type the words "exported on drawback" and shall be accompanied by an authority for its exportation on drawback by parcel post signed by an Officer of Customs and Excise.

4. The Officer of the Post Office accepting such parcel duly labelled and accompanied by the Authority aforesaid shall give the sender a certificate on such authority of the posting of the parcel.

5. The delivery of every such parcel from the premises of the exporter shall be subject to such bond and to such special conditions as the said Commissioners may from time to time prescribe.

6. If any claim shall be made on the Postmaster-General for compensation in respect of the loss of or damage to any such parcel, that claim shall, in the absence of proof to the con-

trary be deemed to be conclusive evidence that such parcel has not been duly exported, and that its contents have gone into use in Great Britain or Northern Ireland, and any Drawback paid shall be repaid by the exporter.

7. Nothing in this warrant shall affect any prohibition in the Post Office Acts or Regulations of the sending by post of any substance, article or thing.

8. This Warrant shall come into operation on the first day of November, 1928.

9. This Warrant may be cited as the Foreign Parcels (Customs) Warrant, 1928.
