The KING has been pleased to order a Congé d'Elire to pass the Great Seal of the Realm empowering the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral and Metropolitan Church of Christ in Canterbury to elect an Archbishop of that See, the same being void by the resignation of the Most Reverend and Right Honourable Randall Thomas Davidson, G.C.V.O., D.D., late Archbishop thereof, and declared vacant as from the 12th November, 1928, by an Order of His Majesty in Council bearing date the 14th August, 1928; and His Majesty has been pleased to recommend to the said Dean and Chapter the Most Reverend and Right Honourable Cosmo Gordon Lang, now Archbishop of York, Primate of England and Metropolitan, to be by them elected Archbishop of the said See of Canterbury.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 23rd November, 1928, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £45,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 26th November, 1928, to Saturday, the 1st December, 1928, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

COUNTY OF THE EAST RIDING OF YORKSHIRE.

(i) Any vehicle which is being used for the purposes of agriculture in connection with land adjoining or lying near to the said roads; and

(ii) Any vehicle which is being used for the conveyance of goods or merchandise to or from any house, building or other premises situate on or adjacent to the said roads.

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1928 (No. 74).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Contraction of Bridport (Dorset) Infected Area.

1.—(1) The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1928 (No. 70) shall be read and have effect as if the Area described in the First Schedule to this Order were substituted for the Infected Area described in the Schedule to that Order.

(2) This Article shall come into operation on the nineteenth day of November, nineteen hundred and twenty-eight.

Contraction of Blandford (Dorset) Infected Area.

2.—(1) The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1928 (No. 71) shall be read and have effect as if the Area described in the Second Schedule to this Order were substituted for the Infected Area described in the Schedule to that Order.

(2) This Article shall come into operation on the nineteenth day of November, nineteen hundred and twenty-eight.

Further Contraction of Crewe (Cheshire) Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area.

3.—(1) The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1928 (No. 67) as amended by the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1928 (No. 72) shall be read and have effect as if the Area described in the Third Schedule to this Order were substituted for the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area described in the First Schedule to the last mentioned Order.

(2) This Article shall come into operation on the seventeenth day of November, nineteen hundred and twenty-eight.

Release of Crewe (Cheshire) Area from Restrictions.

4. The Area described in the Third Schedule to this Order shall cease to be an Infected Area for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925, as from the twenty-fourth day of November, nineteen hundred and twenty-eight.

Short Title.

5. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1928 (No. 74).

The East Riding of Yorkshire Agricultural Wages Committee, in pursuance of the powers vested in them by the Agricultural Wages (Regulation) Act, 1924, and the Regulations made thereunder do by this Order vary as from 24th November, 1928, their Order of 27th February, 1925, defining the employment which is to be treated as overtime employment for the purpose of the application of any differential

rate of wages for overtime employment fixed by the said Committee for the area comprising the administrative county of the East Riding of Yorkshire which for the purposes of the said Act shall be deemed to include the city and county borough of Kingston-upon-Hull, so as to provide that such employment shall be as follows:—

A. In the case of male workers not boarded and lodged by their employer:—

(1) All employment on a Sunday, Good Friday and Christmas Day.

(2) All employment after 12 noon on a Saturday or such other day (not being Sunday, Good Friday or Christmas Day) in every week as may be agreed between the employer and the worker.

(3) All employment in excess of 43 hours (excluding all hours which are to be treated as hours of overtime employment) in the week in which Good Friday falls.

(4) All employment in excess of 39½ hours (excluding all hours which are to be treated as hours of overtime employment) in the week in which Christmas Day falls.

(5) All employment in excess of 52½ hours (excluding all hours which are to be treated as hours of overtime employment) in any other week in summer.

(6) All employment in excess of 48 hours (excluding all hours which are to be treated as hours of overtime employment) in any other week in winter.

B. In the case of male workers who are boarded and lodged by their employer:—

(1) All employment on a Sunday, Good Friday and Christmas Day other than 3 hours on any such day spent on work in connection with the care of and attention to stock.

(2) All employment after 12 noon on a Saturday or such other day (not being Sunday, Good Friday or Christmas Day) in every week as may be agreed between the employer and the worker, other than the hours (being part of the 12 hours mentioned below) spent on work in connection with the care of and attention to stock.

(3) All employment in excess of 43 hours (excluding all hours which are to be treated as hours of overtime employment) with an addition of 12 hours on weekdays and 3 on Sunday, spent on work in connection with the care of and attention to stock in the week in which Good Friday falls.

(4) All employment in excess of 39½ hours (excluding all hours which are to be treated as hours of overtime employment) with an addition of 12 hours on weekdays and 3 on Sunday, spent on work in connection with the care of and attention to stock in the week in which Christmas Day falls.

(5) All employment in excess of 52½ hours (excluding all hours which are to be treated as hours of overtime employment) with an addition of 12 hours per week on weekdays and 3 on Sunday, spent on work in connection with the care of and

attention to stock in any other week in summer.

(6) All employment in excess of 48 hours (excluding all hours which are to be treated as hours of overtime employment) with an addition of 12 hours per week on weekdays and 3 on Sunday, spent on work in connection with the care of and attention to stock in any other week in winter.

C. In the case of female workers:—

(1) All employment on a Sunday, Good Friday and Christmas Day.

(2) All employment after 12 noon on a Saturday.

(3) All employment in excess of 36 hours (excluding all hours which are to be treated as hours of overtime employment) in the weeks in which Good Friday and Christmas Day fall.

(4) All employment in excess of 44 hours (excluding all hours which are to be treated as hours of overtime employment) in any other week.

For the purpose of the above Order employment in summer shall be deemed to be employment during the period from the first Monday in March to the last Saturday in October and employment in winter shall be deemed to be employment during the rest of the year.

Where the Undertakers charge any consumer by the electrical quantity contained in the supply given to him they shall be entitled to charge him according to the rates set forth in Section 1 of this Schedule the amount of energy supplied to him being taken to be the product of that electrical quantity and the declared pressure at the consumer's terminals that is to say such a constant pressure at those terminals as may be declared by the Undertakers under the regulations of the Electricity Commissioners.
