WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 8th day of November, 1928 (N. 3438/28), in the words following, viz. :—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council of the 17th day of May, 1920, to approve, *inter alia*, of revised rates of substantive pay for the Petty Officers, Non-commissioned Officers and men of Your Majesty's Navy and Marines and by Your Order in Council of the 3rd day of November, 1927, to approve of these rates being reduced for men entering or re-entering (after a break in service) Your Majesty's Navy or Marines subsequently to the 4th day of October, 1925:

"And whereas we consider it desirable that reduced rates of pay shall be introduced for Maltese non-continuous service ratings entered for the band of the Commander-in-Chief of the Mediterranean Station:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the following rates of pay for these ratings:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas we have decided in the interests of economy that all docking work on the Destroyers in Maintenance Reserve at Rosyth is to be performed by naval ratings under the direction of the Shipwright Officer of the Parent Ship:

"And whereas we consider that the additional work and responsibility thereby devolving on this Officer should be recognised by the grant of extra remuneration:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the grant to him, with effect from the 28th day of May, 1928, of an allowance of 10s. for each successful docking or undocking operation.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Right Reverend Thomas Banks, Lord Bishop of Oxford, has, under Section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, made a Representation to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, in the following terms:—

"We, Thomas Banks, Lord Bishop of Oxford, in pursuance of the twenty-sixth section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, do hereby represent to Your Grace as follows:—

"There is in the County of Buckingham and our Diocese of Oxford the Rectory or Benefice of Farnham Royal the Parish whereof contains a population of three thousand or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for three hundred and forty persons

and in the Church of St. John's for two hundred and fifty persons.

"The net annual value of the said Benefice of Farnham Royal is Seven hundred and sixty pounds or thereabouts.

"There is also in the same County and Diocese the Rectory or Benefice of Hedgerley the Parish whereof contains a population of one hundred and fifty or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for one hundred and eighty persons.

"The net annual value of the said Benefice of Hedgerley is Two hundred and ninety pounds or thereabouts.

"A certain portion of the said Parish of Farnham Royal (being part of the well defined district known as Hedgerley Dean) with a total population of two hundred and ten or thereabouts is distant about two and a half miles from the Parish Church of Farnham Royal and a few hundred yards from the Parish Church of Hedgerley.

"It appears to us and we do hereby represent to your Grace that under the provisions of the said Pluralities Act, 1838, the said portion of the Parish of Farnham Royal (which portion is more particularly delineated on the plan annexed to the Scheme appended to this Representation and thereon coloured pink) may be advantageously separated therefrom and annexed to the said Parish of Hedgerley to which it is contiguous.

"The Provost of the College Royal of the Blessed Mary of Eton near unto Windsor in the County of Buckingham and the same College are the Patrons of the said Benefice of Farnham Royal and the Reverend Allix Francis Gamul Farmer is the present Incumbent thereof.

Mabel Grace Norris (wife of Hugh Littleton Norris), of Michelmersh Court, Romsey, in the County of Hants, is the Patron of the said Benefice of Hedgerley and the Reverend William O'Connor is the present Incumbent thereof.

"Pursuant to the directions contained in the twenty-sixth section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, we, the said Lord Bishop, have drawn up a Scheme in writing annexed to this Representation describing the mode in which it appears to us that the alterations above proposed may best be effected and how the changes consequent on such alterations in respect of Ecclesiastical jurisdiction, Glebe lands, Tithe rent charges and other Ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect to Patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested and we do hereby submit the same to your Grace together with the consents in writing of the Patrons of both of the said Benefices of Farnham Royal and Hedgerley and also the consents of the Incumbents of the said Benefices to the intent that if your Grace shall on full consideration and enquiry be satisfied with such Scheme you may certify the same and such Consents aforesaid to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

"SCHEME.

"It is proposed:—

"(1) That there be separated from the Ecclesiastical Parish of Farnham Royal and

annexed to the Parish of Hedgerley a certain portion of the said Parish of Farnham Royal (being part of the well defined district known as Hedgerley Dean which lies to the west of the said Parish of Hedgerley) the boundaries of which portion are delineated on the plan annexed hereto and thereon coloured pink.

"(2) That the Incumbent of Hedgerley shall have sole and exclusive cure of souls within such portion so to be separated from Farnham Royal and annexed to Hedgerley.

"(3) That the inhabitants of such portion shall be entitled to accommodation in the Parish Church of Hedgerley but shall cease to be entitled to any right of accommodation in the Parish Church of Farnham Royal excepting nevertheless any such inhabitants or inhabitant (if any) possessing a legal right by faculty or otherwise to any pew or sitting in the said Parish Church of Farnham Royal who may not be willing to relinquish the same.

"(4) That the inhabitants of the aforesaid portion shall have such and the same right to have marriages baptisms churchings and burials solemnised and performed in the said Parish Church of Hedgerley as but for the said separation they might have had in the Parish Church of Farnham Royal.

"(5) That all Tithes, Tithe rent charges, fees, Ecclesiastical offerings and emoluments arising from the said portion so to be separated from the Parish of Farnham Royal shall henceforth belong to the Incumbent of the Benefice of Hedgerley who shall have all such rights and remedies for enforcing payment of the same as are now or would in the future but for the said separation be exercisable by the Incumbent of the Benefice of Farnham Royal.

"(6) That no other alteration except as aforesaid shall be made in the endowments of the said Benefices or either of them.

"(7) That no alteration shall be made in the Patronage of the said Benefices or either of them.

" CONSENTS.

"We, the Provost of the College Royal of the Blessed Mary of Eton near unto Windsor in the County of Buckingham and the same College, the Patrons or persons entitled to present to the Benefice of Farnham Royal in the County of Buckingham (if the same were now vacant) the Reverend Allix Francis Gamul Farmer, Incumbent of the same Benefice, Mabel Grace Norris (wife of Hugh Littleton Norris), of Michelmersham Court, Romsey, in the County of Hants, the Patron or person entitled to present to the Benefice of Hedgerley (if the same were now vacant) and the Reverend William O'Connor, the Incumbent of the same Benefice, do hereby respectively signify to your Grace our several consents to the Scheme above proposed and set forth and to every matter and thing therein contained.

"In testimony whereof we have hereunto set our hands this 7th day of November, 1928.

TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.

COFFIN FURNITURE AND CEREMENT MAKING TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

PROPOSAL TO VARY THE MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR FEMALE WORKERS IN THE CEREMENT MAKING SECTION OF THE TRADE FOR SPECIAL PERIODS NOT DEPENDENT UPON THE COST OF LIVING INDEX FIGURE.

This notice is issued with the consent of the Minister of Labour.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated the 21st April, 1927, the Coffin Furniture and Cerement Making Trade Board (Great Britain) established under the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE that, seeing that the specified period of operation of the minimum rates of wages set out in the Trade Board's Notice U. (22) dated 27th March, 1928, will expire on the 31st March, 1929, they again PROPOSE TO VARY the General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-Work Basic Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for Female Workers in the Cerement Making Section of the trade which are set out in the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice U. (16) issued by the Trade Board and dated 2nd December, 1924, and which would, unless varied by the Trade Board, be effective on and after 1st April, 1929, BY PROVIDING THAT the minimum rates of wages set out in the Trade Board's Notice U. (22) dated 27th March, 1928, for the periods 1st April to 30th September, 1928, and 1st October, 1928, to 31st March, 1929, respectively, shall be continued in operation for the corresponding 6-monthly periods 1st April to 30th September, 1929, and 1st October, 1929, to 31st March, 1930.

Pursuant to Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board will consider any OBJECTIONS to the above Proposal to Vary which may be lodged with them within two months from the 27th day of November, 1928. Such objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary of the Coffin Furniture and Cerement Making Trade Board (Great Britain), at 1, Whitehall Gardens, London, S.W. 1.

It is desirable that the objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.






WORCESTER CORPORATION (TRAMWAYS & LIGHT RAILWAYS ABANDONMENT) ORDER, 1928.

NOTICE is hereby given:—A. That on the 6th October, 1928, the Minister of Transport, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by Section 7 of the Worcester Corporation Act, 1926, made the Worcester Corporation (Tramways and Light Railways Abandonment) Order, 1928, whereby after reciting that the tramways and light railways in the City of Worcester described in the Schedule to the Order and referred to as "the Corporation's Tramways" had been purchased by the Mayor Aldermen and Citizens of the City of Worcester (hereinafter called "the Corporation"); and that the Corporation had provided Omnibuses within the City along the routes of the Corporation's Tramways, and had applied to the Minister for an Order to authorise the permanent discontinuance and abandonment by them of the Corporation's Tramways it was ordered as follows:—

(1) The Corporation may and shall forthwith abandon and discontinue the Corporation's Tramways and shall with all reasonable dispatch remove the rails of the Corporation's Tramways and leave the portion of the road upon which such rails were laid in good repair and condition:

(2) as from the date of the Order the powers and obligations of the Corporation to run services of cars on the Corporation's Tramways shall cease and as from the date on which the removal of the rails of the Corporation's Tramways and the restoration of the road upon which the same are laid shall be duly completed all other powers and liabilities duties or obligations conferred or imposed on the Corporation by any Act, or Order relating to the Corporation's Tramways shall cease.

THE SCHEDULE to the said Order included:—

All the Tramways and Light Railways in the City of Worcester constructed under the Worcester Tramways Act, 1901, the Worcester and District Light Railways Order, 1901, and the Worcester (Extension) Light Railways Order, 1902.
