The Home Secretary gives notice that in pursuance of Section 2 (1) of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920, he has made an Order authorising the employment on two day-shifts, of women of 18 and young persons of 16 years of age and over in the Artificial Silk Winding Department at the works of Messrs. Smith, Bulmer & Company, Limited, Lewis Street, Halifax, Yorkshire, subject to the conditions that a worker shall not be employed in the afternoon shift in consecutive weeks; and that suitable cloakroom and messroom accommodation and washing facilities shall be provided; that a responsible forewoman shall be appointed on each shift; that additional daily thermometer readings shall be taken and recorded if atmospheric humidity is artificially produced, and that the Secretary of State may at any time require the occupiers to make such special arrangements for the conveyance of workers living at a distance or otherwise for the welfare of such workers as may be necessary to prevent hardship.
