## MERSEY MAGAZINES.

46 AND 47 VICT. CHAP. 184.

In pursuance of the powers vested in me by the Mersey Gunpowder Act, 1883, I hereby make the following Regulation amending No. 13 of the Regulations under the above-mentioned Act:—

The following paragraph shall be substituted for paragraph (b) of Regulation 13:—

13 (b). To safety matches if the following conditions are observed, viz.:—

The safety matches shall be kept in a place set apart for their safe keeping in the cabin of the Magazine and shall not be used for any other purpose than for lighting the stove and the signal lights and watchman's lantern specified in paragraph (c), or elsewhere than in the cabin.

## MERCHANDISE MARKS ACT, 1926.

### REPORT OF THE STANDING COMMITTEE.

With reference to the notice which was published in the London, Edinburgh and Belfast Gazettes of the 4th May, 1928, regarding a reference made by the Board of Trade to the Standing Committee under the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926, in respect of imported—

(a) Carpets, carpeting and floor rugs of all descriptions;

(b) Floor mats and matting made of textile materials, including paper but not including coir,

the Board of Trade hereby give notice, in accordance with the provisions of Section 2, Sub-section 7, that a Report has been made by the Committee in respect of the aforesaid classes and descriptions of goods.
