DANGEROUS DRUGS ACTS, 1920-1925.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department gives notice that in pursuance of the International Opium Convention of 1925, he has made new Regulations under the Dangerous Drugs Acts as follows:—

Under section 3 of the Act of 1920, regulations for controlling dealing in Coca-leaves and Indian hemp;

Under Section 7, Consolidated Regulations which will take the place of the Regulations at present in force and which include the drugs brought in by the Convention. The Regulations, which are dated 14th December, come into force on 1st January, 1929.

On and after that date the following drugs, in addition to those which are already controlled, can be dealt in only by persons licensed or authorised by the Secretary of State:—

Coca-leaves.

Indian hemp (including the resins, extracts and tinctures).

Preparations containing less than 0.1 per cent. of diacetylmorphine (heroin).

(2) A notice under this Article shall be served upon the owner of the animal, and a copy shall be sent to the Ministry, to the Local Authority and to the Secretary of the Show.

(3) The removal, detention and isolation of any animal under a notice served under this Article shall be carried out at the expense of the owner of the animal.

Restriction of Movement of animals from the Smithfield Club Show at the Royal Agricultural Hall, London.

2.—(1) No animal shall be moved out of the Show Ground of the Smithfield Club at the Royal Agricultural Hall, London, except with a licence granted by an Inspector or other officer of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries, and then only to some suitable premises approved by the Inspector of the

Ministry and subject to such conditions as the Minister considers necessary or expedient for the purpose of preventing the spread of disease, and are inserted in the licence.

(2) No licence shall be required under the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925 in respect of any animal being moved from the Show with a licence under this Order.

3. The term "animal" in this Order means cattle, sheep, goats and swine.
