ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 26TH DECEMBER, 1928.)

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1928 (No. 83).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Contraction of Salop Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area.

1. The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1928 (No. 82) shall be read and have effect as if the Area described in the Schedule to this Order were substituted for the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area described in the Schedule to that Order.

Commencement and Short Title.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the thirty-first day of December, nineteen hundred and twenty-eight, and may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1928 (No. 83).

SCHEDULE.

Contracted Infected Area.

An Area comprising:—

In the county of Salop.

The petty sessional division of Wellington (except the parishes of Waters Upton and Stirchley, and so much of the parish of Ercall

Magna as lies to the North of the direct road from Shawbury to Newport (Salop); and the parishes of Upton Magna, Kinnersley and Preston upon the Weald Moors.

And also comprising:—

The parish of Little Wenlock in the borough of Wenlock.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 27TH DECEMBER, 1928.)

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS RESTRICTIONS) (AMENDMENT) ORDER OF 1928.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Modification of Conditions of Movement Licence.

1.—(1) The conditions attaching to licences granted in accordance with Article 6 of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925, hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Order," shall be read and have effect as if the words "period of 14 days" were substituted for the words "period of 21 days" in Condition 5 thereof.

(2) Nothing in this Article shall affect the conditions of any licence granted under the Principal Order authorising the movement of animals into or within any existing Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area declared before the date of this Order.

2. The following article shall be substituted for Article 7 of the Principal Order:—

"Disposal of Slaughterhouse Manure, Offals, etc.

7. No manure, refuse, or offals or other parts of a carcass of an animal, except offals intended for human consumption, shall be moved from any slaughterhouse in an Infected Area except to premises within the same Infected Area, and then only if permission for such movement is given in writing by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the place of destination. Any person removing or receiving any such material and the occupier of any premises to which it is moved shall take all practicable steps to secure that it is not fed to or brought into contact with animals.
