

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Eliza Ann Cott (in testimony whereof she has signed and sealed this Scheme) and with the consent of the said Cyril, Bishop of Leicester (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Ashby Magna now vested in her, the said Eliza Ann Cott as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said Cyril, Bishop of Leicester, and his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Cyril, Bishop of Leicester, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved on behalf of His Majesty at the Council held under the authority of the said Commission:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty The Queen, His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, His Royal Highness The Duke of York, His Grace the Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Prime Minister and First Lord of the Treasury, being authorized thereto by His Majesty's said Commission do hereby, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, on His Majesty's behalf, ratify the said Scheme and do order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And do further, by and with the like advice, hereby direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Leicester.

**WHEREAS** His Majesty was pleased by His Commission dated the 4th day of December, 1928, to nominate and appoint Her

Majesty The Queen, His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, K.G., K.T., K.P., G.C.S.I., G.C.M.G., G.C.I.E., G.C.V.O., G.B.E., His Royal Highness The Duke of York, K.G., K.T., G.C.V.O., the Most Reverend Father in God Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of Canterbury, the Right Honourable Douglas McGarel, Baron Hailsham, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Right Honourable Stanley Baldwin, Prime Minister and First Lord of the Treasury, or any three of them, during His Majesty's illness, to summon and hold on His Majesty's behalf His Privy Council, and to signify thereat His Majesty's approval of any matter or thing to which His Majesty's approval in Council is required:

And whereas the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 11th day of October, 1928, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting (1) the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Dinsdale, situate in the County of Durham, and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Sockburn, situate partly in the said County of Durham and partly in the County of York, and (2) an alteration of the boundaries of the Parish of the said Benefice of Dinsdale and the contiguous Parish of the Benefice of Middleton, Saint George, situate in the said County of Durham and all in the Diocese of Durham:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Herbert Hensley, Bishop of Durham, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Dinsdale and Sockburn and upon an alteration of the boundaries of the said Parishes of Dinsdale and Middleton, Saint George, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Durham and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the said alteration of boundaries and the terms for effecting the union and alteration, and the said Bishop of Durham signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices and the said alteration of boundaries based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas the said Benefices of Dinsdale and Middleton, Saint George, are now full, the Reverend Edward Harcourt Greatorex being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Dinsdale, the Reverend Picton Williams Francis being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Middleton, Saint George, and the said Benefice of Sockburn is at present vacant:
