

9½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called or known as Field Place, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Field Place for a distance of 2 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the passage leading along the backs of the houses and premises situate on the eastern side of Queen Street, and extending thence northward to and along the middle of the said passage for a distance of 13 chains or thereabouts to its northern end on the southern side of Cornwall Road, and extending thence northward in the same direction and in a straight line across Cornwall Road for a distance of 1 chain or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the footpath leading from Cornwall Road to East Street, and extending thence eastward along the middle of the said footpath for a distance of 9 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the footpath leading from Littlehampton to Toddington, and extending thence northward along the middle of the last-mentioned footpath for a distance of 20 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Littlehampton from the said Parish of Lyminster."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved on behalf of His Majesty at the Council held under the authority of the said Commission:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty The Queen, His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, His Royal Highness The Duke of York, His Grace the Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Prime Minister and First Lord of the Treasury, being authorized thereto by His Majesty's said Commission have taken the said Representation into consideration, and do hereby, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, on His Majesty's behalf ratify the same and order, as it is hereby ordered, that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And do further, by and with the like advice, direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Chichester.

**WHEREAS** His Majesty was pleased by His Commission dated the 4th day of December, 1928, to nominate and appoint Her Majesty The Queen, His Royal Highness The

Prince of Wales, K.G., K.T., K.P., G.C.S.I., G.C.M.G., G.C.I.E., G.C.V.O., G.B.E., His Royal Highness The Duke of York, K.G., K.T., G.C.V.O., the Most Reverend Father in God Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of Canterbury, the Right Honourable Douglas McGarel, Baron Hailsham, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Right Honourable Stanley Baldwin, Prime Minister and First Lord of the Treasury, or any three of them, during His Majesty's illness, to summon and hold on His Majesty's behalf His Privy Council, and to signify thereat His Majesty's approval of any matter or thing to which His Majesty's approval in Council is required:

And whereas the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 8th day of November, 1928, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Halford, situate in the County of Warwick, and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Newbold on Stour, situate in the County of Worcester, and both situate in the Diocese of Coventry:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Charles Lisle, Bishop of Coventry, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Halford and Newbold on Stour duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Coventry and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Coventry signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices of Halford and Newbold on Stour are now full the Reverend John Reuben Taft being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Halford and the Reverend William Howard Tomkins-Russell being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Newbold on Stour:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Charles Lisle, Bishop of Coventry (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Halford and the said Benefice of Newbold on Stour shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Newbold on Stour with Halford' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the
