

Baron Hailsham, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Right Honourable Stanley Baldwin, Prime Minister and First Lord of the Treasury, or any three of them, during His Majesty's illness, to summon and hold on His Majesty's behalf His Privy Council, and to signify thereat His Majesty's approval of any matter or thing to which His Majesty's approval in Council is required:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty The Queen, His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, His Royal Highness The Duke of York, His Grace the Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Prime Minister and First Lord of the Treasury, being authorised thereto by His Majesty's said Commission, in pursuance of the said section of such Act and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, on His Majesty's behalf are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Department of Health for Scotland (Consequential Provisions) Order, 1928.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

2.—(1) The statutory provisions set forth in the first and second columns of the Schedule to this Order shall be modified by the substitution for the words set forth in the third column of the words set forth in the fourth column thereof.

(2) The expression "authorised officer" wherever occurring in the fourth column of the Schedule means an officer authorised in accordance with paragraph (c) in sub-section (5) of section 1 of the Reorganisation of Offices (Scotland) Act, 1928.

3. This Order shall come into operation and take effect on and from the first day of January, 1929.
