SHEEP SCAB MOVEMENT AREAS.

The following Areas are now "Movement Areas" for the purposes of Part II of the Sheep Scab Order of 1928 :—

Inverness.—An Area comprising the islands known as the Outer Hebrides (*except the Islands of St. Kilda, Dune, Soay and Boreray*), in the county of Inverness.

Ross and Cromarty.—An Area comprising the island of Lewis, including the smaller islands adjacent thereto, in the county of Ross and Cromarty.

NOTE.—The next Return of Outbreaks of Scheduled Diseases will be in respect of the period 30th December, 1928, to 15th January, 1929, and will appear in the London Gazette of the 18th January, 1929. Thereafter the Return will be published twice a month, instead of weekly as heretofore, viz., for the periods 1st to 15th, and 16th to the last day of the month.
