

G.C.M.G., G.C.I.E., G.C.V.O., G.B.E., His Royal Highness The Duke of York, K.G., K.T., G.C.V.O., the Most Reverend Father in God Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of Canterbury, the Right Honourable Douglas McGarel, Baron Hailsham, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Right Honourable Stanley Baldwin, Prime Minister and First Lord of the Treasury, or any three of them, during His Majesty's illness, to summon and hold on His Majesty's behalf His Privy Council, and to signify thereat His Majesty's approval of any matter or thing to which His Majesty's approval in Council is required:

And whereas the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 8th day of November, 1928, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice') of Saint Silas, Penton Street, in the County of Middlesex and in the Diocese of London:

"Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Saint Silas, Penton Street, is vested in the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, in right of his See:

"And whereas a capital sum of £500 has been contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England to be held by us for the augmentation of the endowment of the said Benefice, upon the understanding and condition that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Saint Silas, Penton Street, should be transferred to the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, Caroline Helen Mary Penton, Wife of Frederick Thomas Penton, of Number 12, Harrington Gardens, London, late a Captain in Your Majesty's Army, the Right Honourable Lord Wester Wemyss, G.C.B., C.M.G., M.V.O., Cyril Frederick Penton, of the Junior Carlton Club, London, Esquire, the Reverend Cuthbert Fetherston Trower, of the Vicarage, Stockcross, in the County of Berks, Clerk in Holy Orders, Caroline Ella Warre Noble, of Number 5, North Montagu Mansions, Baker Street, London, Spinster, the Reverend Henry

Ross, of the Clergy House, Brooke Street, Holborn, London, Clerk in Holy Orders, Muriel Bence-Trower, of Number 12, Bolton Gardens, South Kensington, London, Spinster, and Helen Isabel McSwiney, of Number 12, Oxford Square, Hyde Park, London, Spinster:

"And whereas the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, is willing, in consideration of the contribution aforesaid, that the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Saint Silas, Penton Street, so vested in him as aforesaid, as such Bishop, should be so transferred and in token of such his willingness and also in token of his willingness to accept such transfer jointly with the other persons hereinbefore mentioned and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Archbishop of Canterbury, is consenting to the transfer of Patronage hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed, and in token of such consent which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is in this case made necessary he, the said Randall Thomas, Archbishop of Canterbury, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas in the circumstances thus set forth it appears to us that the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Saint Silas, Penton Street, which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will tend to make better provision for the cure of Souls in the parish or district in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say in the New Parish of Saint Silas, Penton Street:

"Now therefore with the consent of the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), with the consent of the said Randall Thomas, Archbishop of Canterbury (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Archiepiscopal Seal), and with the consent of the said Caroline Helen Mary Penton; the Right Honourable Lord Wester Wemyss; Cyril Frederick Penton; Cuthbert Fetherston Trower; Caroline Ella Warre Noble; Henry Ross; Muriel Bence-Trower and Helen Isabel McSwiney (in testimony whereof they have signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Saint Silas, Penton Street, shall be transferred to the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London; Caroline Helen Mary Penton; the Right Honourable Lord Wester Wemyss; Cyril Frederick Penton; Cuthbert
