"Whereas the Right Reverend Henry, now Bishop of the Diocese of Southwell, is desirous that certain improvements should be made at the said Episcopal Residence and has submitted to us the particulars of such improvements and we have specified our general approval of the same:

"And whereas the said Bishop is also desirous and it appears to us to be expedient that towards the cost of effecting the aforesaid additions and improvements a sum of £550 (being a sum which does not exceed two years income of the See) should be provided by his borrowing the same by way of mortgage upon the security of all and every part of the lands tenements and hereditaments endowments or emoluments which now belong or may hereafter belong to the Bishopric of Southwell:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Henry, Bishop of the said Diocese of Southwell (testified by his having affixed his signature and Episcopal Seal to this Scheme); we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that the said Bishop be authorised to borrow from the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne, and that the said Governors be empowered to lend under the provisions of the above mentioned Acts any sum not exceeding £550 and that as a security for the same the said Bishop do mortgage all and every part of the lands tenements and hereditaments and endowments or emoluments which now belong or may hereafter belong to his said See to the said Governors by Deed for a term of twenty years or until the said sum of £550, with interest for the same as hereinafter mentioned, and all costs and charges which may attend the

recovery thereof, shall be fully paid and satisfied and that such principal sum shall be repaid with interest in the manner following, that is to say, during and in respect of the first period of 12 months of the said term computed from the day of the date of the mortgage, no part of the said principal sum shall be repayable but the said Bishop or his successors shall yearly at the end of the second period of 12 months so computed and at the end of every such like period of 12 months thereafter, pay to the said Governors their successors or assigns one fifteenth part of the said principal sum of £550 until the whole thereof shall be repaid, and shall also at the end of the first and each succeeding period of 12 months, computed as aforesaid, pay interest at the rate of £4 per centum per annum on the said principal sum or on so much thereof as shall from time to time remain unpaid. And that if and when it shall happen that either the principal or the interest directed to be paid as hereinbefore mentioned shall be in arrear and unpaid for the space of 40 days after the same shall have become due it shall and may be lawful for the said Governors their successors and assigns to recover the same and the costs and charges attending the recovery thereof by distress and sale in the like manner as rents may be recovered by landlords or lessors from their tenants by the laws in force at the time of such distress and sale. "We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 48th and 49th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, and of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners Measure, 1926, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for augmenting the income of the Archdeaconry of Liverpool in the Diocese of Liverpool:

"Whereas it appears to us to be desirable that the income of the said Archdeaconry of Liverpool should be augmented in the manner which is hereinafter recommended and proposed:

"And whereas the grant hereinafter recommended and proposed, together with any existing grant or grants now payable by us in augmentation of the incomes of the said Archdeaconry will not have the effect of raising the annual income provided for such Archdeaconry out of the Common Fund created by the said Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, beyond the sum of £300 and will not raise the whole income of that Archdeaconry, including the income derived from any ecclesiastical office or preferment annexed thereto, beyond the sum of £1000 per annum:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, with the consent of the Right Reverend Albert Augustus, Bishop of Liverpool (testified by his having signed and sealed this Scheme) humbly recommend and propose that subject as is hereinafter mentioned, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, be authorised to pay out of the said Common Fund by equal quarterly payments on the first day of January, the first day of April, the first day of July and the first day of October in every year to the Archdeacon of the said Archdeaconry of Liverpool and to his successors in the same Archdeaconry a further yearly sum of £105, such yearly sum to take effect and be calculated as from the first day of November, 1928. Provided always that before any payment in respect of the said yearly sum shall be made by us we shall require to be satisfied that the Archdeacon who applies for the same has during the previous 12 calendar months complied with the conditions as to residence which for the time being are required by law.

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1929.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Further Contraction of Salop Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area.

1.—(1) The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1928 (No. 82) as amended by the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1928 (No. 83) shall be read and have effect as if the Area described in the First Schedule to this Order were substituted for the Infected Area described in the Schedule to the last mentioned Order.

(2) This Article shall come into operation on the eighth day of January, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine.

Further Contraction of Lancashire Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area.

2.—(1) The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1928 (No. 81) as amended by the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1928 (No. 84) shall be read and have effect as if the Areas described in the Second and Third Schedules to this Order were substituted for the Infected Area described in the Schedule to the last mentioned Order.

(2) This Article shall come into operation on the eleventh day of January, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine.

Release of Infected Areas from Restrictions.

3.—(1) The Area described in the First Schedule to this Order shall cease to be an Infected Area for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925, as from the fourteenth day of January, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine.

(2) The Area described in the Second Schedule to this Order shall cease to be an

Infected Area for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925, as from the seventeenth day of January, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine.

(3) The Area described in the Third Schedule to this Order shall cease to be an Infected Area for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925, as from the eighteenth day of January, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine.

Short Title.

4. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1929.
