LOCAL GOVERNMENT (COUNTY BOROUGHS AND ADJUSTMENTS) ACT, 1926.

COUNTY BOROUGH OF MIDDLESBROUGH.

Whereas in pursuance of Section 54 of the Local Government Act, 1888, a representation has been made to the Minister of Health by the Council of the County Borough of Middlesbrough that it is desirable that the boundary of the County Borough should be altered by a Provisional Order under the Act so as to include therein part of the Parish of Marton in the Rural District of Middlesbrough:

And whereas a Provisional Order for the alteration of the boundary of a Borough may deal with any of the matters mentioned in Sections 54 and 59 of the Local Government Act, 1888, and Section 54 of the Local Government Act, 1894, and may also amend any Local and Personal Act or repeal alter or amend any Provisional Order made under the Public Health Act, 1875, or made under the Sanitary Acts, and it is proposed that, if a Provisional Order should be made upon the representation of the Council of the County Borough of Middlesbrough the Order should provide for the matters aforesaid:
