NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE ACT, 1928.

Notice is hereby given under the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that it is proposed by the National Health Insurance Joint Committee, after the expiration of at least 40 days from this date, to make Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by Section 23 of the National Health Insurance Act, 1928;

And that on account of urgency the National Health Insurance Joint Committee, under Section 2 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, made Regulations entitled the National Health Insurance (Transitional) Regulations, 1928, to come into force immediately as provisional regulations, to continue in force until regulations have been made in accordance with the provisions of Section 1 of that Act;

LEEDS.

Whereas the Lord Mayor, Aldermen, and Citizens of the City of Leeds (hereinafter called the Corporation), being the Urban Sanitary Authority for the said City, have made application to the Minister of Health for the issue of a Provisional Order under Sections 297 and 303 of the Public Health

Act, 1875, partially to repeal, alter or amend the Leeds Corporation Act, 1927, so as:—

(1) To enable the Corporation to erect shops, offices, warehouses and other like buildings on lands which the Corporation have acquired in connection with street improvements, or with the consent of the Minister of Health on any lands acquired by the Corporation under any general or local Act or Order and not required by them for the purposes for which they were acquired, and to sell lease exchange or otherwise dispose of any such shops, offices or buildings upon and subject to such terms conditions and restrictions as they may think fit;

(2) To empower the Corporation, with the consent of the Minister of Health, to borrow moneys for the purposes aforesaid;

(3) For the several purposes of the Application or for purposes connected with, incidental to, or consequent on those purposes to make any such alteration or amendment of the said Local Act, or of any other Local Act or of any Act confirming a Provisional Order made in pursuance of any of the Sanitary Acts or of the Public Health Act, 1875, and in force in the said City as may be necessary or desirable:

And whereas it is proposed that a Provisional Order should be issued in compliance with the said Application;

NEWCASTLE-UPON-TYNE.

Whereas the Lord Mayor, Aldermen, and Citizens of the City of Newcastle-upon-Tyne (hereinafter called the Corporation), being the Urban Sanitary Authority for the said City, have made application to the Minister of Health for the issue of a Provisional Order under Sections 297 and 303 of the Public Health Act, 1875, partially to repeal, alter or amend the Newcastle-upon-Tyne Corporation Loans Act, 1882, the Newcastle-upon-Tyne Tramways and Improvement Act, 1899, and the Newcastle-upon-Tyne Order 1913, so as:—

(1) To enable the Corporation from time to time to take from their Loans Fund (No. 1) all amounts in that Fund greater than the nominal amount of the Stock for the time being unredeemed, and to use the amounts so taken from that Fund in the
