(3) The Area described in the Third Schedule to this Order shall cease to be an Infected Area for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925, as from the eighteenth day of January, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine.

*Short Title.*

4. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1929.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

An Area comprising:—

*In the county of Salop.*

The parish of Wellington Urban; and so much of the parishes of Uppington, Wroxeter, Wrockwardine, Rodington, Longdon upon Tern, Eyton upon the Weald Moors, Hadley and Wellington Rural as lies within the following boundary, namely:—

Commencing at the point where the road from Bridgnorth to Wellington meets Watling Street, thence in an easterly direction along Watling Street to the point where it meets the road from Newport to Wellington; thence in a north easterly direction along the latter road to the point where it forks at Haybridge; thence in a generally northerly direction along the left hand road passing Leegomery House to the point where it meets Hadley Road at the north easterly corner of Apley Castle Park; thence in a westerly direction along Hadley Road to the point where it is crossed by Long Lane; thence in a north westerly direction along Long Lane to the point where it crosses the Shropshire Union Canal; thence following the Shropshire Union Canal in a westerly and later south westerly direction to the point where it is crossed by the road from Rodington to Isombridge, thence in an easterly direction along the said road to the point where the road from Withington to Isombridge is met; thence in a south westerly direction along the latter road as far as the cross roads opposite the Lees; thence in a generally south easterly direction along Bluebell Road via Walcot Mills, Charlton, Uppington and Woodgreen to the point where it meets Wrekin Course; thence easterly for a short distance along Wrekin Course to the point where it is crossed by the Wellington Rural/Wroxeter parish boundary; thence following the southern boundary of Wellington Rural Parish in a generally easterly and later northerly direction to the point where it crosses the road from Bridgnorth to Wellington at Arleston Hill; thence in a generally northerly direction along the said road to the point of commencement.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

An Area comprising:—

*In the county of Lancaster.*

So much of the city and county borough of Liverpool as is comprised within the following boundary, namely:—

Commencing at George's Stage north of the Mersey Railway Tunnel, thence following a north easterly direction towards and along Water Street and Dale Street to William Brown Street; thence in a generally easterly direction along William Brown Street, London Road, Prescott Street and Kensington as far as Needham Road; thence in a southerly direction along Needham Road and Botanic Road and easterly along Wavertree Road, Picton Road and High Street as far as Church Road; thence in a generally southerly direction along Church Road, Penny Lane, Mossley Hill Road, Barkhill Road and Mersey Road to the Riverside; and thence along the northern bank of the River Mersey to the point of commencement.

THIRD SCHEDULE.

An Area comprising:—

*In the county of Lancaster.*

The parishes of Hale and Halewood; and so much of the parish of Tarbock as lies to the south of the road from Netherley Bridge to Cronton via Yew Tree Farm, Mill Bridge, Tarbock Green, Water Lane and Alder Lane.

And also comprising:—

So much of the borough of Widnes as lies within the following boundary, namely:—

Commencing at the point where Ditton Brook flows into the River Mersey, thence along the said brook in a north westerly direction to the point where it is crossed by Ditton Road at Ditton Bridge; thence easterly along Ditton Road to the point where the road leading to Victoria Park and Liverpool Road is met; thence northerly along the said road as far as Liverpool Road and then westerly along Liverpool Road as far as Prescott Road; thence northerly along the last mentioned road to the municipal borough boundary; thence following a westerly and southerly direction along the said boundary to the point where it reaches the River Mersey; thence easterly along the north bank of that river to the point of commencement at Ditton Brook.
