## EAST HULL GAS.

(Application for Special Order under Section 10 of the Gas Regulation Act, 1920.)

**N**OTICE is hereby given, that the East Hull Gas Company (hereinafter called "the Company") whose address is St. Mark Street, Hull, have applied to the Board of Trade for a Special Order under Section 10 of the Gas Regulation Act, 1920, for all or some of the following purposes (that is to say):—

1. To authorise the Company to purchase or take on lease and hold for the purposes of their gas undertaking the lands hereinafter mentioned or some part or parts thereof and to empower the Company on the said lands to erect maintain alter improve extend and renew gas works machinery and other apparatus and works for the manufacture of gas and to store gas thereon and to convert and manufacture residual products.

The lands above referred to are:—

(A) All that piece of land situate in the Parish of Preston and Rural District of Sculcoates in the East Riding of the County of York formerly copyhold of the Manor of Burstwick containing 10.199 acres or thereabouts forming the enclosure numbered 68 in the said Parish on the  $\frac{2500}{1000}$  Ordnance Map Edition of 1927 Yorkshire (East Riding) Sheet CCXLI. 2.

(B) All that piece of land situate in the said Parish of Preston formerly copyhold of the Manor of Burstwick containing 4.343 acres or thereabouts forming part of the enclosure numbered 69 in the said parish on the said sheet bounded on the North by the enclosure numbered 103 in the said parish on the said sheet on the East by land belonging or reputed to belong to Walter William Straker on the South by the London and North Eastern Railway (Withernsea Branch) and on the West by the last described piece of land.

2. To authorise the Company to purchase by agreement additional land for the purposes of their gas undertaking.

3. To authorise the Company to adapt lands for the purpose of sports or recreation grounds for persons in their employ and upon such lands to erect construct and maintain dressing rooms and other buildings works and conveniences.

4. To make new provisions as to the sale of ordinary stock in the capital of the Company by auction or tender.

5. To make new provisions empowering the directors of the Company to issue so as to be redeemable debenture stock, to make provision with respect to the redemption of redeemable stock either by a payment in cash or by the issue of other stock (redeemable or otherwise) and to authorise the creation and issue of new stock for any such purpose and the re-issue of any redeemable debenture stock after redemption.

6. To amend Section 33 (Renewal Fund) of the East Hull Gas Act 1906.

7. To provide that the Company shall not be bound to see to the execution of any trusts.

8. To make further provisions with reference to the Company's affairs, including provisions as to the notices of meetings, the preparation of the Company's accounts, the appointment of proxies, voting by joint holders, the appointment of Managing Director, the disqualification and powers of the directors and the appointment of Auditors.

9. To relieve the Company of the obligation to keep a Stockholders' address book and to authenticate by the affixing of the Common Seal or otherwise the register of stockholders.

10. To authorise the Directors of the Company to grant gratuities, pensions and superannuation allowances and to make other payments to officers and employees and the widows, families and dependants of such persons and to any superannuation fund established for the benefit of officers and employees and to the widows, families and dependants of such persons, to enter into and carry into effect agreements with Insurance Companies or others for securing such gratuities, pensions, allowances or payments, to subscribe to funds raised in National emergency, Infirmaries, Hospitals, &c., and to apply the funds and revenues of the Company for all or any of those purposes.

11. To make new or further provisions as to the mode of cutting off and reconnecting supplies and the expense thereof, the supply of fittings, the entry upon premises to which a supply of gas is laid on, the removal of fittings where gas supply discontinued, the period of error in defective meters, the taking of licenses for the use of patents, the authentication and service of notices by the Company, the recovery of penalties and demands, and the inclusion of several sums in one summons.

12. The Order will vary or extinguish all rights and privileges which would impede or interfere with its purposes and confer other rights and privileges.

13. To repeal, alter or amend all or any of the provisions of the East Hull Gas Company's Acts and Orders, 1867 to 1927, and any other Act or Order relating to the Company or their undertaking.

14. To incorporate with the Order, with or without modification, or to render inapplicable all, or some, of the provisions of the Lands Clauses Acts, the Gasworks Clauses Act, 1847, the Gasworks Clauses Act, 1871, and the Companies Clauses Acts, 1845 and 1863.
