TONBRIDGE ELECTRICITY (EXTENSION) SPECIAL
ORDER, 1928.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Electricity Commissioners have submitted to the Minister of Transport for confirmation under the above-mentioned Acts a Special Order made by them for the supply by the Urban District Council of Tonbridge of electricity within parts of the Urban District of Tonbridge and of the Rural Districts of Malling and Tonbridge in the County of Kent.

The Minister of Transport proposes to confirm the Order and gives notice that any person affected who may be desirous of objecting to the confirmation of the same must, in accordance with the Electricity (Confirmation of Special Orders) Rules, 1921, do so by memorial addressed to the Minister of Transport, written on one side only of foolscap paper and sent by registered post addressed to the Secretary, Ministry of Transport, 6, Whitehall Gardens, London, S.W. 1, and posted not later than the 4th day of February, 1929. A copy of any such memorial must also be sent in like manner to Messrs. Chas. Rogers Sons and Abbott, 13, Victoria Street, Westminster, London, S.W. 1, Solicitors for the Order. Such memorial must be sealed or signed by the person objecting or by some responsible and duly authorised person on his behalf and must state the specific grounds of objection to the Order and the modifications desired.

A copy of the Order as submitted for confirmation has been deposited for public inspection with the Clerk of the Peace for the County of Kent, at his office at Maidstone, and with the Clerks to the Rural District Councils of Tonbridge and Malling, at their respective offices.

Copies of the Order as submitted for confirmation may be obtained at a price not exceeding two shillings each from the Clerk to the Tonbridge Urban District Council, Tonbridge Castle, Tonbridge, and at the offices of the before-mentioned Solicitors.

SAUNDERSFOOT AND DISTRICT
ELECTRICITY.

NOTICE is hereby given, that H. and S. W. Thomas Company Limited, whose registered office is situate at Delphi Garage, Tenby, in the county of Pembroke (hereinafter called "the Undertakers") have applied to the Electricity Commissioners under the Electricity (Supply) Acts, 1882 to 1926, for a Special Order (hereinafter called "the Order") for all or some of the following purposes (that is to say):—

To authorise the Undertakers to generate and distribute electrical energy for all public

and private purposes as defined by the said Acts within the following area (hereinafter called "the area of supply"), that is to say:—

So much of the Parishes of Begelly and St. Issells in the Rural District of Narberth in the County of Pembroke bounded on the East by Saundersfoot Bay: on the South commencing near St. Bride's Bay at the point where the Rural District boundary reaches the sea and thence along the Rural District boundary to the Pembroke and Tenby Branch of the Great Western Railway; on the West by the said Railway northward to the Narberth Road thence westerly to the junction of that road with the road to Moreton Farm thence northward by an imaginary straight line to Bench Mark 234-6: on the North by an imaginary straight line eastward from Bench Mark 234-6 to Bench Mark 150-4 at Merrixton Bottom: and thence southward by an imaginary straight line to the Methodist Chapel thence by the road to Corse Gate, Holly Bush, Wiseman's Bridge Beer House, and terminating at the sea.

To incorporate in the Order such of the provisions contained in the Schedule to the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act, 1899, as are applicable, and to apply such provisions to the Undertaking to be authorised by the Order, with such variations and exceptions as may be contained therein.

To authorise the Undertakers to open, break up and interfere with all streets, roads, and public places, ways, footpaths, bridges, culverts, sewers, drains, and gas and water mains and pipes and telegraph and telephone and other wires within the area of supply, and to lay down, erect, maintain, renew and remove, either above or under ground or otherwise, electric lines, conductors, mains, pipes, tubes, wires, posts, street or distributing boxes, meters, apparatus or other works or things required for the purpose of enabling the Undertakers to generate, supply, store, convey, transmit, or distribute electrical energy within the area of supply, and to confer all such other powers upon the Undertakers as may be necessary for effecting the objects of the proposed undertaking.

To prescribe the maximum price or maximum prices that may be demanded and taken by the Undertakers in respect of the supply of electrical energy.

To authorise the Undertakers to open and break up streets and parts of streets which are not repairable by the Local Authority and also Railways.

To confer upon the Undertakers all or some of the powers of the Electricity (Supply) Acts, 1882 to 1926, and the enactments incorporated therewith, and to alter, vary or extinguish all rights and privileges which would or might interfere with any of the objects of the Order, and to confer all other rights and privileges necessary for carrying such objects into effect.

And notice is hereby given that copies of the draft Order and of an Ordnance Map showing the area of supply and the streets in which it is proposed that electric lines shall be laid down within a period to be specified
