**OKEHAMPTON AND TAVISTOCK
ELECTRICITY.**

WILLIAM George Heath, of 41, George Street, Plymouth (hereinafter referred to as "the applicant") has applied to the Electricity Commissioners under the Electricity (Supply) Acts, 1882 to 1928, for a Special Order for the following objects:—

(a) to authorise the applicant to supply electrical energy for all public and private purposes as defined by the above Acts within

the Borough of Okehampton, the Urban District of Tavistock and the Rural Districts of Okehampton and Tavistock all in the County of Devon (hereinafter referred to as "the area of supply");

(b) to empower the applicant to break up certain streets not repairable by the local authority and railways within the area of supply;

(c) to provide for the transfer of the proposed undertaking and the removal of overhead lines and to authorise the applicant to exercise within the area of supply the powers usually conferred upon distributors of electrical energy.
