a Scheme bearing date the 13th day of December, 1928, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice of Seighford, the Benefice of Derrington and the Benefice of Creswell, all of which Benefices are situate in the County of Stafford and in the Diocese of Lichfield:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend John Augustine, Bishop of Lichfield, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said three Benefices of Seighford, Derrington and Creswell, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Lichfield and therein recommended the union of the said three Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Lichfield signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said three Benefices based upon the terms recommended

in the said Report:

"And whereas all of the said Benefices of Seighford, Derrington and Creswell are now full the Reverend Cedric George Wright being the present Incumbent of the said Benefices of Seighford and Derrington and the Reverend John Oldham Johnson being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Creswell:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said John Augustine, Bishop of Lichfield (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Cedric George Wright (testified by his signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to

say:—
"1. That the said Benefice of Seighford, the said Benefice of Derrington and the said Benefice of Creswell shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls and one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measure provided under the style of 'The United Benefice of Seighford with

Derrington and Creswell.'

"2. That if upon the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme the said Benefice of Creswell shall be vacant then the said union shall forthwith take effect but if upon that day the said Benefice of Creswell shall not be vacant then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacation thereafter of the said Benefice of Creswell and pending the union of all the said three Benefices as aforesaid, the said two Benefices of Seighford and Derrington shall upon the day aforesaid be united together and form one Benefice with Cure cf Souls and one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measure provided under the style of 'The United Benefice of Seighford with Derrington.' Provided that if an Incumbent holding the United Benefice of Seighford with Derrington shall cease to be Incumbent of such United Benefice before the union of all the said three Benefices has taken effect as aforesaid the right to nominate or present another Incumbent or other Incumbents to the United Benefice of Seighford with Derrington shall belong solely to the Patrons of the said Benefice of Seighford.

"3. That the Church of the Parish of Seighford shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish of Seighford with Derrington or of Seighford with Derrington and Creswell as the case may be and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Seighford shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish.

"4. That upon the taking effect of the union of the said Benefices of Seighford and Derrington or of the union of all the said three Benefices the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Seighford shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"5. That after the union of all the said three Benefices has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, that in every series of seven successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice after the union the Patrons of the said Benefice of Seighford shall have the first, the second, the fourth and the fifth turns, the Patron of the said Benefice of Derrington shall have the third and the seventh turns and the Patron of the said Benefice of Creswell shall have the sixth turn.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Lichfield has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved at the Council held under the authority of the said Commission:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty The Queen, His Royal Highness The Duke of York, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Prime Minister and First Lord of the Treasury, being authorised thereto by His Majesty's said Commission have taken the said Scheme into consideration, and do hereby, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, on His Majesty's behalf, affirm the said Scheme and order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and do further order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And do further, by and with the like advice, direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Lichfield.

And whereas the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Act, 1919, the Union of Benefices Measure, 1921, and of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and of the

Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 19th day of May, 1927, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Act, 1919, the Union of Benefices Measure, 1921, and of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting (1) the union of the Benefice (being an United Benefice) of Beeston Saint Laurence Ashmanhaugh and the Benefice of Hoveton Saint Peter (being part of the United Benefice of Hoveton Saint Peter with Hoveton Saint John); (2) the union of the Benefice of Hoveton Saint John (being part of the said United Benefice of Hoveton Saint Peter with Hoveton Saint John) and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Wroxham and (3) the disunion of the Chapelry of Salhouse from the said Benefice of Wroxham all of which Benefices are situate in the County of Norfolk and in the Diocese of Norwich:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Act, 1919, the Union of Benefices Measure, 1921, and the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report (inter alia) upon the unions and disunion aforesaid duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Norwich and therein recommended (1) the union of the said Benefices of Beeston Saint Laurence with Ashmanhaugh and Hoveton Saint Peter; (2) the union of the said Benefices of Hoveton Saint John and Wroxham and (3) the disunion of the said Chapelry of Salhouse from the said Benefice of Wroxham and the terms for effecting the said unions and disunion including an alteration of boundaries affecting the Benefice and Parish of Neatishead in the said County and Diocese and the said Bishop of Norwich signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Wroxham (including the said Chapelry of Salhouse) is at present vested for an estate in fee simple free from encumbrances in Major Sigismund William Joseph Trafford, of Wroxham Hall, in the said County of Norfolk:

"And whereas it was one of the terms of the before-mentioned Report to the said Bishop of Norwich that upon the disunion of the said Chapelry of Salhouse and its constitution as a separate Benefice as hereinafter recommended and proposed the Patronage of the Benefice of Salhouse should belong to the present Patron of the said Benefice of Wroxham but the said Sigismund William Joseph Trafford is desirous that any right or interest of the Patron of the said Benefice of Wroxham in the Patronage of the Benefice of Salhouse should be transferred from him to the Bishop of Norwich for the time being so that the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Benefice of Salhouse after the disunion should belong to and be vested in the Bishop of Norwich for the time being:

"And whereas the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, as Bishop of the Diocese is consenting to the same transfer as by the Acts hereinbefore recited or by some or one of

them is made necessary:

"And whereas such transfer or alteration in the exercise of the Patronage of the Benefice of Salhouse as aforesaid whereby upon the disunion which is hereinafter recommended and proposed taking effect the Patronage of the Benefice of Salhouse will be vested in the See of Norwich will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the Cure of Souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parish or District hereinafter recommended and proposed to be assigned to the Benefice of Salhouse:

"And whereas all of the said Benefices of Beeston Saint Laurence with Ashmanhaugh, Hoveton Saint Peter with Hoveton Saint John and Wroxham are now full, the Reverend Walter Charles Goldsmith Cubison being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Beeston Saint Laurence with Ashmanhaugh, the Reverend John Henry Bailey being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Hoveton Saint Peter with Hoveton Saint John, and the Reverend David Davies being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Wroxham:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said unions and disunion based upon the terms recommended in the hereinbefore mentioned Report to the Bishop of Norwich and further for effecting such transfer or alteration in the exercise of the Patronage of the Benefice of Salhouse as is hereinbefore mentioned:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have agreed to raise to £300 per annum the income of the Benefice of Salhouse constituted in accordance with the provisions of this Scheme by a grant out of our Common Fund:

"Now, therefore, with the consent so far as the transfer or alteration in the exercise of Patronage hereinafter recommended is concerned of the said Sigismund William Joseph Trafford (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), and with the consent both as to the said transfer or alteration in the exercise of Patronage and as to the said unions and disunion and all other recommendations of this Scheme of the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this

Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to

say:—

"1. That a portion of the said Benefice of Hoveton Saint Peter with Hoveton Saint John, that is to say, the Benefice of Hoveton Saint Peter shall be severed from the said Benefice of Hoveton Saint Peter with Hoveton Saint John, and the said Benefice of Hoveton Saint Peter so severed and the said Benefice of Beeston Saint Laurence with Ashmanhaugh shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Beeston Saint Laurence with Ashmanhaugh and Hoveton Saint Peter' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That the said Benefice of Hoveton Saint Peter with Hoveton Saint John after the severance of the said Benefice of Hoveton Saint Peter as aforesaid and the said Benefice of Wroxham shall subject as hereinafter mentioned be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Wroxham with Hoveton Saint John,' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"3. That a part of the United Benefice of Wroxham with Hoveton Saint John referred to in Clause 2 of this Scheme namely the said Chapelry of Salhouse shall be separated from such United Benefice and shall become and be a separate Benefice with Cure of Souls under the name and designation of 'The Vicarage of Salhouse,' and the limits of the Parish to belong and be assigned to such separate Benefice of Salhouse shall be conterminous with the boundaries of the Civil Parish of Salhouse.

"4. That the Church or Chapel of the said Chapelry of Salhouse shall be the Parish Church of the Benefice and Parish of Salhouse.

"5. That with the consents of the said Walter Charles Goldsmith Cubison and David Davies (testified by their signing this Scheme) the said unions and disunion shall take effect upon the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme if the said Benefice of Hoveton Saint Peter with Hoveton Saint John be then vacant, but if at that date the said Benefice of Hoveton Saint Peter with Hoveton Saint Peter with Hoveton Saint Idhn shall not be vacant then the said unions and disunion shall take effect immediately upon the next vacation after that date of the said Benefice of Hoveton Saint Peter with Hoveton Saint John.

"6. That upon the said unions and disunion taking effect (a) the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Beeston Saint Laurence with Ashmanhaugh shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Beeston Saint Laurence with Ashmanhaugh and Hoveton Saint Peter (b) the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Hoveton Saint Peter with Hoveton Saint John shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Wroxham with Hoveton Saint John and (c) the Parsonage House situate at

Salhouse at present belonging to the said Benefice of Wroxham shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the Benefice of Salhouse.

"7. That upon the said unions and disunion taking effect (A) the endowments and property of the said Benefice of Hoveton Saint Peter with Hoveton Saint John shall be appropriated as follows, that is to say, (a) there shall be annexed to the United Benefice of Beeston Saint Laurence with Ashmanhaugh and Hoveton Saint Peter (i) all those Tithe rentcharges commuted at £92 15s. arising within the Parish of Hoveton Saint Peter now payable to the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Hoveton Saint Peter with Hoveton Saint John together with all capital sums of money, stocks, annuities or other property being or representing the proceeds of the sale, redemption or other conversion of the whole or any part of such tithe rentcharges (ii) the sum of £855 17s. 9d. London County Three pounds and ten shillings per centum per annum Stock now held by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England on behalf of the said Benefice of Hoveton Saint Peter with Hoveton Saint John and (iii) the sum of £730 4s. 5d. Four pounds per centum per annum Funding Stock (1960-1990) now held by the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty on behalf of the said Benefice of Hoveton Saint Peter with Hoveton Saint John and (b) there shall be annexed to the United Benefice of Wroxham with Hoveton Saint John all the other or remaining endowments and property of the said Benefice of Hoveton Saint Peter with Hoveton Saint John including (i) all those Tithe rentcharges commuted at £114 17s. 6d. arising within the Parish of Hoveton Saint John now payable to the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Hoveton Saint Peter with Hoveton Saint John together with all capital sums of money, stocks, annuities or other property being or representing the proceeds of the sale redemption or conversion of the whole or any part of such Tithe rentcharges (ii) the sum of £25 1s. 3d. Four pounds per centum per annum Funding Stock (1960-1990) now held by the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty on behalf of the said Benefice of Hoveton Saint Peter with Hoveton Saint John and (iii) the annual sum or stipend of £76 now payable by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Hoveton Saint Peter with Hoveton Saint John and (B) there shall be assigned and annexed to the Benefice of Salhouse a part of the endowments now belonging to the said Benefice of Wroxham namely all the vicarial Tithe rentcharges arising within the said Parish of Salhouse with the exception of the Tithe rentcharges commuted£32 12s. 3d. described in the Schedule hereto annexed which Tithe rentcharges commuted at £32 12s. 3d. shall continue to belong to the United Benefice of Wroxham with Hoveton Saint John including, both in the case of the Tithe rentcharges assigned to the Bencfice of Salhouse as aforesaid and in the case of the said Tithe rentcharges commuted at £32 12s. 3d., all capital sums of money, stocks, annuities or other property being or representing the proceeds of the sale, redemption or other conversion of the whole or any part of such Tithe rentcharges respectively.

"8. That after the said unions and disunion have taken effect (i) the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefices from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say (a) that in every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice of Beeston Saint Laurence with Ashmanhaugh and Hoveton Saint Peter after the union the Patron of the said Benefice of Beeston Saint Laurence with Ashmanhaugh shall have the first and the third turns and the Patron of the said Benefice of Hoveton Saint Peter with Hoveton Saint John shall have the second turn and (b) the right of presentation to the United Benefice of Wroxham with Hoveton Saint John shall be exercised by the Patrons alternately, the Patron of the said Benefice of Wroxham having the right upon the first presentation to such United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn of presentation and the Patron of the said Benefice of Hoveton Saint Peter with Hoveton Saint John having the right of presenta-tion upon the second presentation to such United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter, and (ii) all right, claim or title of the Patron of the said Benefice of Wroxham to any interest in the Patronage of the Benefice of Salhouse be with the consents aforesaid transferred to the

Bishop of Norwich and his successors in the same Bishopric and that the Advowson and perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Salhouse belong to and be exercised by the said Bishop of Norwich and his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"9. That upon the said unions and disunion taking effect with the consent (testified as aforesaid) of the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, as the Patron of the said Benefice of Neatishead and with the consent of the Reverend John Roper Keech, now Incumbent of the said Benefice of Neatishead (testified by his signing this Scheme) a portion of the Parish of the said Benefice of Neatishead, that is to say, all that portion of the said Parish of Neatishead which lies to the west of the middle of the road leading from Stalham through Beeston Saint Laurence to Hoveton Saint John and Wroxham shall be severed from the said Parish of Neatishead and shall be annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to

by reason of such alteration of boundaries.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts and Measures, or of any other Act of Parliament, or Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, and of the Act of the 17th and 18th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 84, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for apportioning the incomes of the Benefices of Saint Peter upon Cornhill; Saint Bartholomew, Bethnal Green; Saint Peter, Bethnal Green; Saint Mark, Clerkenwell; and Saint Oswald, Fulham; all in the County of Middlesex and in the Diocese of London, the Benefice of Saint Mark, Victoria Docks, in the County of Essex and in the Diocese of Chelmsford, and the Benefice of Saint Cyprian, Brockley, in the County of Kent and in the Diocese of Southwark, between those Benefices and five other Benefices namely the Benefices of Saint John the Evangelist, Brownswood Park; All Saints with Saint Olave, Mile End New Town; Saint Luke, Mile End Old Town; All Saints, Stoke Newington; and Saint Faith, Stoke Newington, all in the said County of Middlesex and in the said Diocese of London:

- "(7) Two sixtieth shares to the Incumbent of the Benefice of Saint Cyprian, Brockley, to

be increased by one sixtieth share as from the date upon which each of the Benefices of Saint Bartholomew, Bethnal Green; Saint Peter, Bethnal Green; and Saint Mark, Victoria Docks, shall next be vacated:

"And whereas by virtue of the hereinbefore mentioned Orders in Council dated the 5th day of March, 1885, and the 7th day of July, 1916, respectively, the said messuage and tenement remains vested in and the whole of the said rents in respect thereof continue to be receivable and recoverable by the Rector or Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Saint Peter upon Cornhill, and in the event of any question arising between the Rector of the said Benefice and the Incumbents or any of them of the other six Benefices whose Income was thereby augmented as to any such costs and expenses as aforesaid and otherwise as to the actual sum to be divided as aforesaid the same is to be finally determined by the Recorder for the time being of the City of London or in the event of that office being vacant, by the Common Sergeant of the said City on the application of any one of the Incumbents:

"And whereas the rent receivable in respect of that part of the said messuage or tenement now known as Number 52, Cornhill, which corresponds with the messuages or tenements formerly known as Numbers 51, 52 and 53, Cornhill, has been increased as from the 25th day of December, 1927, by an annual sum of £1,360 and will be, as from the 25th day of December, 1929, increased by a further annual sum of £470 as compared with the rent receivable in respect of the same premises at the time of the hereinbefore mentioned Order of Your Majesty in Council, dated the 7th day of July, 1916, and in consequence of this circumstance the endowments now enjoyed by the Rector of the said Benefice of Saint Peter upon Cornhill notwithstanding the aforesaid charge and apportionments and the endowments of the said six Benefices of Saint Bartholomew, Bethnal Green; Saint Peter, Bethnal Green; Saint Mark, Clerkenwell; Saint Oswald, Fulham; Saint Mark, Victoria Docks; and Saint Cyprian, Brockley, are of such an amount that in the opinion of us and of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, of the Right Reverend Guy, Bishop of Chelmsford, of the Right Reverend Cyril, Bishop of Southwark and of the Corporation of London, the further apportionment of the same endowments which is hereinafter recommended and proposed may properly be made:

"And whereas the said Benefices of Saint John the Evangelist, Brownswood Park; All Saints with Saint Olave, Mile End New Town; Saint Luke, Mile End Old Town; All Saints, Stoke Newington; and Saint Faith, Stoke Newington, are now insufficiently endowed:

"And whereas the said Benefices of Saint Peter upon Cornhill; Saint Bartholomew, Bethnal Green; Saint Peter, Bethnal Green; Saint Mark, Clerkenwell; Saint Oswald, Fulham; Saint Mark, Victoria Docks; and Saint Cyprian, Brockley, are now full, the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Saint Peter upon Cornhill being the Reverend John Arthur Smith Bullock, the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Saint Oswald, Fulham, being the

Reverend Arthur Rowland Hedley, and the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Saint Cyprian, Brockley, being the Reverend Harry Hurst:

"And whereas it has been proposed to us by the Corporation of London that a new apportionment of the said surplus rent arising from the messuage or tenement known as Number 52, Cornhill, and now forming part of the endowments of the last mentioned seven Benefices should be made in the manner which is hereinafter recommended and proposed:

"Now, therefore, with the consents of the said Arthur Feley, Bishop of London, of the said Guy, Bishop of Chelmsford, and of the said Cyril, Bishop of Southwark (in testimony whereof they have severally signed this Scheme and sealed the same with their Episcopal Seals), and with the consent of the Corporation of London (in testimony whereof the Corporation has caused its Common or Corporate seal to be affixed to this Scheme), and with the consents of the said John Arthur Smith Bullock, Arthur Rowland Hedley and Harry Hurst (in testimony whereof they have set their respective hand and seals to this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners England, humbly recommend and propose that as from the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme the existing arrangements for the present and future division of the said surplus of the net annual rents hereinbefore set forth and numbered one to seven shall be modified in the manner following :-

"(1) That as from such lastly mentioned date the said surplus shall be divided into 900 equal parts.

"(2) That as from such last mentioned date the number of such parts receivable by the Rector or Incumbent of the said Benefice of Saint Peter upon Cornhill shall be reduced from 150 to 100 and as from the same date 10 of such parts shall be payable to each of the Incumbents of the said Benefices of Saint John the Evangelist, Brownswood Park; All Saints with Saint Clave, Mile End New Town; Saint Luke, Mile End Old Town; All Saints, Stoke Newington; and Saint Faith, Stoke Newington.

"(3) That as from the date upon which the said Benefice of Saint Peter upon Cornhill shall next be vacated the number of such parts receivable by the Incumbent thereof shall be further reduced from 100 to 50 and that as from the same date 10 of such parts shall be payable to each of the Incumbents of the said Benefices of Saint John the Evangelist, Brownswood Park; All Saints with Saint Olave, Mile End New Town; Saint Luke, Mile End Old Town; All Saints, Stoke Newington; and Saint Faith, Stoke Newington.

"(4) That as from the date upon which the said Benefice of Saint Bartholomew, Bethnal Green, shall next be vacated the number of such parts receivable by the Incumbent thereof shall be reduced from 180 to 100 and that as from the same date 16 of such parts shall be payable to each of the Incumbents of the said Benefices of Saint John the Evangelist, Brownswood Park; All Saints with Saint Olave, Mile End New Town; Saint Luke, Mile End Old Town; All Saints, Stoke Newington; and Saint Faith, Stoke Newington.

"(5) That as from the date upon which the said Benefice of Saint Peter, Bethnal Green, shall next be vacated the number of such parts receivable by the Incumbent thereof shall be reduced from 180 to 100 and that as from the same date 16 of such parts shall be payable to each of the Incumbents of the said Benefices of Saint John the Evangelist, Brownswood Park; All Saints with Saint Olave, Mile End New Town; Saint Luke, Mile End Old Town; All Saints, Stoke Newington; and Saint Faith, Stoke Newington.

"(6) That as from the date upon which the said Benefice of Saint Mark, Clerkenwell, shall next be vacated the number of such parts receivable by the Incumbent thereof shall be reduced from 150 to 100 and 10 of such parts shall be payable to each of the Incumbents of the said Benefices of Saint John the Evangelist, Brownswood Park; All Saints with Saint Olave, Mile End New Town; Saint Luke, Mile End Old Town; All Saints, Stoke Newington; and Saint Faith, Stoke Newington.

"(7) That as from the date upon which the said Benefice of Saint Mark, Victoria Docks, shall next be vacated the number of such parts receivable by the Incumbent thereof shall be reduced from 180 to 75 and that as from the same date 45 of such parts shall be payable to the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Saint Oswald, Fulham, and 60 of such parts shall be payable to the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Saint Cyprian, Brockley.

"Provided always that the provisions made in the hereinbefore mentioned Orders in Council of the 5th day of March, 1885, and 7th day of July, 1916, as to the vesting of the said messuage or tenement, and as to the final determination of the actual sum to be divided as aforesaid, and as to the payment and the apportionment of the said rents shall remain unaffected by anything herein contained except in so far as to make these provisions applicable, and these provisions shall accordingly apply, to the new apportionment of the said rents which is herein recommended and proposed.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved at the Council held under the authority of the said Commission:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty The Queen, His Royal Highness The Duke of York, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain and the Prime Minister and First Lord of the Treasury, being authorized thereto by His Majesty's said Commission have taken the said Scheme into consideration, and do hereby, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, on His Majesty's behalf, ratify the same and order, as it is hereby ordered, that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And do hereby, by and with the like advice, direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the respective Registrars of the said Dioceses of London, Chelmsford and Southwark.

- "I, Ernest William, Lord Bishop of Birmingham, in pursuance of the Acts of Parliament of 1 and 2 Vic. c. 106 and 2 and 3 Vic. c. 49 hereby represent to your Grace:—
- "That there is in the County of Warwick and Diocese of Birmingham the Vicarage or Benefice of Bickenhill the Parish whereof contains a population of one thousand two hundred or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for three hundred persons and there is also situate in the said Parish the unconsecrated Church or Chapel of Saint Leonard Marston Green with accommodation for one hundred and fifteen persons.
- "The net annual value of the said Benefice of Bickenhill is three hundred and fourteen pounds or thereabouts.
- "That the said Benefice of Bickenhill is at the present time vacant.
- "There is also in the said County and Diocese the Rectory or Benefice of Sheldon the Parish whereof contains a population of five

hundred and twenty-six or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for two hundred and fifty persons.

"The net annual value of the said Benefice of Sheldon is four hundred and ninety-one pounds or thereabouts.

"There is within the Parish of Bickenhill a place or district or portion of land known as Marston Green in which is situate the said Church or Chapel of Saint Leonard.

"The aforesaid District of the said Parish of Bickenhill known as Marston Green with the total population of one thousand and fifty or thereabouts is the north western part of the said Parish of Bickenhill lying to the south east of Sheldon. Within the area of the said District is situate the said Church or Chapel of Saint Leonard which is distant about two and a half miles from the Parish Church of Bickenhill and about one mile from the Parish Church of Sheldon.

"That pursuant to the directions of the twenty-sixth section of the Act 1 and 2 Vic. c. 106 as amended by the Pluralities Act, 1887, I have drawn up in writing a Scheme appended to this Representation describing the mode in which it appears to me that the alterations above proposed may be best effected and how the changes consequent upon such alterations in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction glebe lands tithes rent charges and other ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made in justice to all parties interested and I submit the same to your Grace together with the consents in writing of the respective Patrons of the Benefices of the said Parishes of Bickenhill and Sheldon and of the Incumbent of the Benefice of Sheldon (the Benefice of Bickenhill being vacant) to the intent that your Grace may if you shall be satisfied with the said Scheme certify the same and such

consents to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

" SCHEME.

- "It is proposed that the district or portion of land described in the Schedule hereto and delineated in the accompanying Map and thereon coloured pink shall be separated from the Parish of Bickenhill to which it belongs and be annexed to and united to the Parish of Sheldon for ecclesiastical purposes.
- "That the Incumbent of the said Parish of Sheldon shall have exclusive cure of souls within the District of Marston Green so transferred to the Parish of Sheldon.
- "That all ecclesiastical offices shall be performed for the inhabitants of the said District of Marston Green in the Parish Church of Sheldon or in the Chapel of Saint Leonard in

the said District of Marston Green and that the fees for all such offices and all other such ecclesiastical dues offerings and emoluments usually payable to the Incumbent of a benefice as shall arise or become payable within or in respect of the said District of Marston Green shall belong to the Incumbent of the said Parish of Sheldon.

"That no change shall be made in regard to glebe lands tithes or tithe rent charges or compositions in lieu thereof belonging to the Benefices of the Parishes herein referred to nor in

respect of patronage.

"That the inhabitants of the said District shall be entitled to accommodation in the Church of the Parish of Sheldon to which it is proposed that the said District shall be annexed and in common with the parishioners of that Parish and shall not henceforth be entitled to any accommodation in the Church of the Parish of Bickenhill from which they shall be separated except nevertheless any person or persons (if any) possessing a legal right by faculty or otherwise to the exclusive use of any pews or sittings in the last mentioned Church and who may not be willing to relinquish and give up the same.
