WHEREAS His Majesty was pleased by His Commission dated the 4th day of December, 1928, to nominate and appoint Her Majesty The Queen, His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, K.G., K.T., K.P., G.C.S.I., G.C.M.G., G.C.I.E., G.C.V.O., G.B.E., His Royal Highness The Duke of York, K.G., K.T., G.C.M.G., G.C.V.O., the Most Reverend Father in God Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of Canterbury, the Right Honourable Douglas McGarel, Baron Hailsham, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Right Honourable Stanley Baldwin, Prime Minister and First Lord of the Treasury, or any three of them, during His Majesty's illness, to summon and hold on His Majesty's behalf His Privy Council, and to signify thereat His Majesty's approval of any matter or thing to which His Majesty's approval in Council is required:

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty,

dated the 14th day of January, 1929 (G.H.), in the words following, viz. :—

“Whereas by section 20 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that the Admiralty shall from time to time continue or appoint such officers, clerks and servants for the purposes of the Hospital and Schools as seem fit, and may (subject to the approval of Your Majesty in Council) fix the salaries of such officers and clerks:

“And whereas by section 8 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1872, it is enacted that the provisions of section 20 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1865, so far as the same relate to salaries, shall extend to pensions and pecuniary benefits of any kind:

“And whereas Mr. W. T. Litton, a former Assistant Master in the Royal Hospital School, Greenwich, is eligible for the award of superannuation allowances from the funds of Greenwich Hospital in respect of his service at Greenwich from the 1st September, 1883, to the 31st March, 1902:

“And whereas Mr. W. Martin, Established Foreman in Charge of Works on the Greenwich Hospital Estate, at Greenwich, retired from the service of Greenwich Hospital on the 24th September, 1928, on account of age:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the following payments from the Funds of Greenwich Hospital, viz. :—

“ (1) A pension to Mr. W. T. Litton at the rate of Ninety nine pounds, fourteen shillings and sixpence (£99 14s. 6d.) per
