**W**HEREAS His Majesty was pleased by His Commission dated the 4th day of December, 1928, to nominate and appoint Her Majesty The Queen, His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, K.G., K.T., K.P., G.C.S.I., G.C.M.G., G.C.I.E., G.C.V.O., G.B.E., His Royal Highness The Duke of York, K.G., K.T., G.C.M.G., G.C.V.O., the Most Reverend Father in God Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of Canterbury, the Right Honourable Douglas McGarel, Baron Hailsham, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Right Honourable Stanley Baldwin, Prime Minister and First Lord of the Treasury, or any three of them, during His Majesty's illness, to summon and hold on His Majesty's behalf His Privy Council, and to signify thereat His Majesty's approval of any matter or thing to which His Majesty's approval in Council is required:

And whereas the Right Reverend Ernest William, Lord Bishop of Birmingham, has, under Section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, made a Representation to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, in the following terms:—

"I, Ernest William, Lord Bishop of Birmingham, in pursuance of the Acts of Parliament of 1 and 2 Vic. c. 106 and 2 and 3 Vic. c. 49 hereby represent to your Grace:—

"That there is in the County of Warwick and Diocese of Birmingham the Vicarage or Benefice of Bickenhill the Parish whereof contains a population of one thousand two hundred or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for three hundred persons and there is also situate in the said Parish the unconsecrated Church or Chapel of Saint Leonard Marston Green with accommodation for one hundred and fifteen persons.

"The net annual value of the said Benefice of Bickenhill is three hundred and fourteen pounds or thereabouts.

"That the said Benefice of Bickenhill is at the present time vacant.

"There is also in the said County and Diocese the Rectory or Benefice of Sheldon the Parish whereof contains a population of five

hundred and twenty-six or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for two hundred and fifty persons.

"The net annual value of the said Benefice of Sheldon is four hundred and ninety-one pounds or thereabouts.

"There is within the Parish of Bickenhill a place or district or portion of land known as Marston Green in which is situate the said Church or Chapel of Saint Leonard.

"The aforesaid District of the said Parish of Bickenhill known as Marston Green with the total population of one thousand and fifty or thereabouts is the north western part of the said Parish of Bickenhill lying to the south east of Sheldon. Within the area of the said District is situate the said Church or Chapel of Saint Leonard which is distant about two and a half miles from the Parish Church of Bickenhill and about one mile from the Parish Church of Sheldon.

"That it appears to me that under the provisions of the said Acts the place or district or portion of land known as Marston Green described in the Schedule hereto may be advantageously separated from the Parish of Bickenhill to which it belongs and be annexed to and united for ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of Sheldon to which it is contiguous as the spiritual care of the inhabitants thereof will thereby be more conveniently and effectually provided for.

"That pursuant to the directions of the twenty-sixth section of the Act 1 and 2 Vic. c. 106 as amended by the Pluralities Act, 1887, I have drawn up in writing a Scheme appended to this Representation describing the mode in which it appears to me that the alterations above proposed may be best effected and how the changes consequent upon such alterations in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction glebe lands tithes rent charges and other ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made in justice to all parties interested and I submit the same to your Grace together with the consents in writing of the respective Patrons of the Benefices of the said Parishes of Bickenhill and Sheldon and of the Incumbent of the Benefice of Sheldon (the Benefice of Bickenhill being vacant) to the intent that your Grace may if you shall be satisfied with the said Scheme certify the same and such consents to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

"SCHEME.

"It is proposed that the district or portion of land described in the Schedule hereto and delineated in the accompanying Map and thereon coloured pink shall be separated from the Parish of Bickenhill to which it belongs and be annexed to and united to the Parish of Sheldon for ecclesiastical purposes.

"That the Incumbent of the said Parish of Sheldon shall have exclusive cure of souls within the District of Marston Green so transferred to the Parish of Sheldon.

"That all ecclesiastical offices shall be performed for the inhabitants of the said District of Marston Green in the Parish Church of Sheldon or in the Chapel of Saint Leonard in
