WHEREAS His Majesty was pleased by His Commission dated the 4th day of December, 1928, to nominate and appoint Her Majesty The Queen, His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, K.G., K.T., K.P., G.C.S.I., G.C.M.G., G.C.I.E., G.C.V.O., G.B.E., His Royal Highness The Duke of York, K.G., K.T., G.C.M.G., G.C.V.O., the Most Reverend Father in God Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of Canterbury, the Right Honourable Douglas McGarel, Baron Hailsham, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Right Honourable Stanley Baldwin, Prime Minister and First Lord of the Treasury, or any three of them, during His Majesty's illness, to summon and hold on His Majesty's behalf His Privy Council, and to signify thereat His Majesty's approval of any matter or thing to which His Majesty's approval in Council is required:

And whereas the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late

Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, and of the Act of the 5th and 6th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 26, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 31st day of January, 1929, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, and of the Act of the 5th and 6th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 26, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for authorising certain improvements at the Archiepiscopal Residence belonging to the Sce of York, which is situate at Bishopthorpe in the County of York:

"Whereas the Most Reverend William, now Archbishop of York, is desirous that certain improvements should be made at the said Archiepiscopal Residence and has submitted to us the particulars of such improvements and we have specified our general approval of the same:

"And whereas the said Archbishop is also desirous and it appears to us to be expedient that towards the cost of effecting the aforesaid improvements a sum of £1,600 (being a sum which together with the outstanding balance of the sums already borrowed upon the same security under the authority of the statutes hereinbefore mentioned, does not exceed two years income of the See) should be provided by his borrowing the same by way of mortgage

upon the security of all and every part of the lands tenements and hereditaments endowments or emoluments which now belong or may hereafter belong to the Archbishopric of York:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said William, Archbishop of York (testified by his having affixed his signature and Archiepiscopal Seal to this Scheme) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that the said Archbishop be authorised to borrow from the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne, and that the said Governors be empowered to lend under the provisions of the above mentioned Acts any sum not exceeding £1,600 and that as a security for the same the said Archbishop do mortgage all and every part of the lands tenements and hereditaments and endowments or emoluments which now belong or may hereafter belong to the said See to the said Governors by Deed for a term of 20 years or until the said sum of £1,600, with interest for the same as hereinafter mentioned, and all costs and charges which may attend the recovery thereof, shall be fully paid and satisfied and that such principal sum shall be repaid with interest in the manner following, that is to say, during and in respect of the first period of 12 months of the said term computed from the day of the date of the mortgage, no part of the said principal sum shall be repayable but the said Archbishop or his successors shall yearly at the end of the second period of 12 months so computed and at the end of every such like period of 12 months thereafter, pay to the said Governors their successors or assigns one eighteenth part of the said principal sum of £1,600 until the whole thereof shall be repaid, and shall also at the end of the first and each succeeding period of 12 months, computed as aforesaid, pay interest at the rate of £4 per centum per annum on the said principal sum or on so much thereof as shall from time to time remain unpaid. And that if and when it shall happen that either the principal or the interest directed to be paid as hereinbefore mentioned shall be in arrear and unpaid for the space of 40 days after the same shall have become due it shall and may be lawful for the said Governors their successors and assigns to recover the same and the costs and charges attending the recovery thereof by distress and sale in the like manner as rents may be recovered by landlords or lessors from their tenants by the laws in force at the time of such And that such mortgage distress and sale. Deed shall be in the form and to the effect to be approved by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and shall bind as well the said William, now Archbishop of York, as every succeeding Archbishop of York, until the principal money and interest costs and charges shall have been paid off and discharged.

"And we further recommend and propose that the said sum of £1,600 so to be borrowed as aforesaid shall be paid to us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, that the said Governors and their successors shall not be bound or required to see to the application thereof, and that upon the receipt of the said sum so to be borrowed as aforesaid the whole or any part or parts thereof shall be applied by us at such time or times and in such manner

as shall appear to us to be expedient towards effecting the said proposed improvements at the Archiepiscopal Residence aforesaid.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in conformity with the provisions of the herein named Acts, or of either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved at the Council held under the authority of the said Commission:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty The Queen, His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, His Royal Highness The Duke of York, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Prime Minister and First Lord of the Treasury, being authorized thereto by His Majesty's said Commission have taken the said Scheme into consideration, and do hereby, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, on His Majesty's behalf, ratify the same and order, as it is hereby ordered, that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts

late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Representation, bearing date the 13th day of December, 1928, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a Consolidated Chapelry to the consecrated Church of Saint Luke, Sharlston, situate within the Parish of Warmfield in the County of York and in the Diocese of Wakefield:

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said Parish of Warmfield and of the Parish of Normanton, in the said County and Diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such Parishes:

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said Parish of Warmfield and of the said Parish of Normanton, should be formed into a Consolidated Chapelry for all Ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Luke, Sharlston, situate as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend James Buchanan, Bishop of Wakefield, as such Bishop (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Representation), with the consents of William London Mollison, Esquire, the Reverend Henry William Fulford, Clerk in Holy Orders, James Reynolds Wardale, Esquire, Godfrey Harold Alfred Wilson, Esquire, Hector Munro Chadwick, Esquire, Henry Thirkill, Esquire, Mansfield Duval Forbes, Esquire, William John Harrison, Esquire, Joseph Whitlington Landon, Esquire, all of Clare College in the University of Cambridge, and the Reverend Henry Reginald Hall, of the Vicarage. Everton, in the County of Bedford, Clerk in Holy Orders, as the Patrons of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Warmfield (in testimony whereof they have signed and sealed this Representation), and with the consent of the Master, Fellows and Scholars of the College of the Holy and Undivided Trinity in the said University of Cambridge as the Patrons of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Normanton (in testimony whereof they have caused their Common or Corporate Seal to be affixed to this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said Parish of Warmfield and of the said Parish of Normanton which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map

or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one Consolidated Chapelry for the said Church of Saint Luke, Sharlston, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Luke, Sharlston.'

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal Wisdom shall seem meet.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Luke, Sharlston, comprising:—

"I. All that portion of the Parish of Warmfield in the County of York and in the Diocese of Wakefield, which is comprised within and is co-extensive with the limits of the Civil Parish of Sharlston.

"II. And also all that contiguous portion of the Parish of Normanton, in the same County and Diocese, which lies to the south of the middle of that section of the Snydale Branch Line of the London Midland and Scottish Railway which runs from Wakefield to the Featherstone Collieries."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved at the Council held under the authority of the said Commission:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty The Queen, His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, His Royal Highness The Duke of York, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Prime Minister and First Lord of the Treasury, being authorised thereto by His Majesty's said Commission have taken the said Representation into consideration and do hereby, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, on His Majesty's behalf, ratify the same and order, as it is hereby ordered, that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of Barking, in the County of Essex, and also in the Churchyard:

And whereas by the Burial Act, 1855, it is, amongst other things, provided that it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, from time to time to vary any Order in Council made under the Burial Act, 1853, as to His Majesty, with such advice as aforesaid, may seem fit:

And whereas by Orders in Council of the 5th day of March, 1885, the 29th day of December, 1885, and the 26th day of June, 1886, the time for discontinuance of burials in the said Parish Church and Churchyard was postponed until the 1st day of October, 1886:

And whereas the Minister of Health, after giving to the Incumbent and the Churchwardens of the said Parish of Barking ten days' previous notice of his intention in that behalf, has made a Representation to His Majesty in Council that, for reasons of public health, so much of the said Order in Council of the 9th day of September, 1884, as relates to burials in the Parish of Barking aforesaid, should be varied as hereinafter directed:

And whereas by an Order in Council of the 21st December, 1928, Notice of such Representation was given, and it was ordered that the same should be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 31st January, 1929, and such Order has been published in the London Gazette, and copies thereof have been affixed as required by the Burial Act, 1853:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty The Queen, His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, His Royal Highness The Duke of York, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Prime Minister and First Lord of the Treasury, being authorised thereto by His Majesty's said commission in pursuance of the said Acts of Parliament and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, on His Majesty's behalf are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered that so much of the said Order in Council of the 9th September, 1884, as relates to burials in the Parish of Barking aforesaid shall be varied,

so as to provide that except as hereinafter provided burials shall be discontinued in the Parish of Barking as follows, viz.:—

BARKING.—Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of Saint Margaret and in the Churchyard attached thereto:

Provided that:-

(a) In the walled grave now existing in the said Churchyard in which the remains of Richard Louth are interred, the burial may be allowed at her decease of the body of Louisa Louth, subject to the condition that the coffin be separately enclosed by brickwork or stonework properly cemented.

(b) In earthen graves, now existing in the said Churchyard, the burials may be allowed at their decease of the following relations of those already interred therein—Clara Ann Carter, Kate Ford, Rebecca Jackson, Fanny Pearson, Caroline Porter, Sarah Rayment, Arthur Isaac Wiseman, Sarah Matilda Wiseman, Harriet Wiseman, Jacob Wiseman, and Walter Frederick Wiseman, provided that the coffins can be deposited at or below the depth of five feet from the surface of the ground without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

- 1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 22nd February, 1929, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £30,000,000.
- 2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 25th February, 1929, to Saturday, the 2nd March, 1929, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.
- 3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.
- 4. Each tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.
- 5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.
- 6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.
- 7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the

House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

20. To make provision as to the amounts in which ordinary, preference and debenture
