

late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Representation, bearing date the 13th day of December, 1928, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a Consolidated Chapelry to the consecrated Church of Saint Luke, Sharlston, situate within the Parish of Warmfield in the County of York and in the Diocese of Wakefield:

“ Whereas at certain extremities of the said Parish of Warmfield and of the Parish of Normanton, in the said County and Diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such Parishes:

“ And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said Parish of Warmfield and of the said Parish of Normanton, should be formed into a Consolidated Chapelry for all Ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Luke, Sharlston, situate as aforesaid:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend James Buchanan, Bishop of Wakefield, as such Bishop (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Representation), with the consents of William London Mollison, Esquire, the Reverend Henry William Fulford, Clerk in Holy Orders, James Reynolds Wardale, Esquire, Godfrey Harold Alfred Wilson, Esquire, Hector Munro Chadwick, Esquire, Henry Thirkill, Esquire, Mansfield Duval Forbes, Esquire, William John Harrison, Esquire, Joseph Whitlington London, Esquire, all of Clare College in the University of Cambridge, and the Reverend Henry Reginald Hall, of the Vicarage, Everton, in the County of Bedford, Clerk in Holy Orders, as the Patrons of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Warmfield (in testimony whereof they have signed and sealed this Representation), and with the consent of the Master, Fellows and Scholars of the College of the Holy and Undivided Trinity in the said University of Cambridge as the Patrons of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Normanton (in testimony whereof they have caused their Common or Corporate Seal to be affixed to this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said Parish of Warmfield and of the said Parish of Normanton which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map

or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one Consolidated Chapelry for the said Church of Saint Luke, Sharlston, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named ‘The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Luke, Sharlston.’

“ We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal Wisdom shall seem meet.

“ THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

“ The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Luke, Sharlston, comprising:—

“ I. All that portion of the Parish of Warmfield in the County of York and in the Diocese of Wakefield, which is comprised within and is co-extensive with the limits of the Civil Parish of Sharlston.

“ II. And also all that contiguous portion of the Parish of Normanton, in the same County and Diocese, which lies to the south of the middle of that section of the Snydale Branch Line of the London Midland and Scottish Railway which runs from Wakefield to the Featherstone Collieries.”

And whereas the said Representation has been approved at the Council held under the authority of the said Commission:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty The Queen, His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, His Royal Highness The Duke of York, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Prime Minister and First Lord of the Treasury, being authorised thereto by His Majesty's said Commission have taken the said Representation into consideration and do hereby, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, on His Majesty's behalf, ratify the same and order, as it is hereby ordered, that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And do hereby, by and with the like advice, direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Wakefield.
