YEOVIL.

Whereas the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Yeovil (hereinafter called the Corporation), being the Urban Sanitary Authority for the said Borough, have made application to the Minister of Health for the issue of a Provisional Order under Sections 297 and 303 of the Public Health Act, 1875, partially to repeal, alter or amend the Yeovil Improvement Act, 1870, as amended by the Yeovil Corporation Act, 1920, so as:—

(1) To include within the limits of the Corporation for the purposes of water supply the parish of Brympton, that part of the existing parish of East Coker which is proposed to be added to the borough by the Yeovil (Extension) Order, 1929, and that portion of the parish of West Coker as comes within the boundary formed by a line commencing at the point at West Coker Road (north of Furzy Knap) where the boundary of the Borough adjoins that of West Coker, and proceeding first in a westerly direction and then in a southerly direction along the West Coker Parish Boundary to the point where it is intersected by Green Lane, thence in a north-westerly direction along Green Lane aforesaid, and continuing in a westerly direction along the West Coker Road to the point of its junction with Gooseacre Lane, thence along Gooseacre Lane aforesaid and in a north-westerly direction along Odcombe Road to the point of its junction with Pound Lane, and proceeding thence along Pound Lane aforesaid to the point where the boundary of the parish of West Coker adjoins that of Brympton, proceeding thence along the West Coker Parish boundary first in an easterly direction then in a northerly direction, then in an easterly direction along the north side of the Great Western Railway line to the junction with the borough boundary and from thence in a southerly direction to the first-mentioned point at West Coker Road aforesaid:

(2) To extend Section 13 of the local Act of 1920 for the protection of the County Council of Somerset to all water mains and pipes within the water limits of the Corporation as proposed to be extended as aforesaid;

(3) To enable the Corporation, by agreement with the occupier or owner of any premises in the parishes to which Section 23 of the said local Act of 1920 applies, to supply water to such premises as are in the opinion of the Corporation within a reasonable distance of a water main, on condition that the connexion of the premises with the water main is made by and at the expense of such occupier or owner;
