FOREIGN HAY AND STRAW (AMENDMENT) ORDER OF 1929 (No. 3).

Prohibition of Landing of Hay and Straw from Sweden.

1. Hay and straw brought from Sweden shall be subject to the prohibition of landing contained in the Foreign Hay and Straw Order of 1912, and the Foreign Hay and Straw (Amendment) Order of 1928 shall cease to operate accordingly.

Short Title.

2. This Order may be cited as the FOREIGN HAY AND STRAW (AMENDMENT) ORDER OF 1929 (No. 3).

**AGRICULTURAL WAGES (REGULATION)
ACT, 1924.**

Whereas the Agricultural Wages Committee for the area comprising the administrative county of Glamorgan, which, for the purposes of the Agricultural Wages (Regulation) Act, 1924, shall be deemed to include the city and county borough of Cardiff and the county boroughs of Merthyr Tydfil and Swansea, have, in pursuance of the above Act, duly fixed minimum and overtime rates of wages for workers employed in agriculture for time work in that area, and the said rates are set out in the Schedule to this Order. Now the Agricultural Wages Board, in pursuance of the said Act, and for the purpose of carrying out the decision of the said Committee, hereby order that the provisions contained in the Schedule to this Order shall become effective from the 2nd day of March, 1929.

SCHEDULE.

1. The wages payable for employment in summer and in winter (as hereinafter defined) shall be not less than wages at the following minimum rates:—

Where a whole-time male worker is employed by the week or any longer period and the hours of work agreed between the worker and the employer in any week (excluding hours of overtime employment), are less than 60 in the case of a worker employed wholly or mainly as a stockman, cattleman, cowman, horseman, shepherd or bailiff, or 52 in summer or 48 in winter in the case of any other worker, the rate of wages applicable to that worker shall be such as to secure to the worker the wages which would have been payable if the agreed hours had been the full hours mentioned above in the case of that worker.

3. For the purpose of the above rates employment in summer shall be deemed to be employment during the period commencing on the first day of March and terminating on the last day of October, and employment in winter shall be deemed to be employment during the rest of the year.

4. For the purpose of the above rates the hours of work shall not include meal times, but shall include any time during which, by reason of weather conditions, an employer has prevented from working a worker who was present at the place of employment and ready to work.

5. The differential rates of wages for overtime employment shall be not less than the following minimum rates:—

7. For the purpose of the application of the above differential rates of wages for overtime employment the Glamorganshire Agricultural Wages Committee have by Order dated 16th February, 1927, defined the following employment as the employment which is to be treated as overtime employment.

1. In the case of male workers employed wholly or mainly as stockmen, cattlemen, cowmen, horsemen, shepherds or bailiffs:—

(a) All employment in excess of 6 hours on a Saturday, or on such other day (not being Sunday) in every week as may be agreed between the employer and the worker, provided that this provision shall not apply in the case of any worker who, under an agreement with his employer, is entitled in each year either to 14 days' holiday (not necessarily consecutive days, and if so agreed, including Sundays), on full pay, or to payment of double pay for fourteen days' work.

(b) All employment in excess of 60 hours in any week (including Sunday, but excluding all hours which are treated as overtime employment).

2. In the case of other workers:—

(a) All employment in excess of 6 hours on a Saturday, or on such other day (not being Sunday) in every week as may be agreed between the employer and the worker, provided that this provision shall not apply in the case of any worker who, under an agreement with his employer, is entitled in each half-year either to one week's holiday on full pay or to double pay for one week's work.

(b) All employment on a Sunday.

(c) All employment in excess of 52 hours in any week (excluding all hours which are treated as overtime employment) in summer.

(d) All employment in excess of 48 hours in any week (excluding all hours which are treated as overtime employment) in winter.

3. In the case of female workers:—

(a) All employment in excess of 6 hours on a Saturday, or on such other day (not being Sunday) in every week as may be agreed between the employer and the worker, provided that this provision shall not apply in the case of any worker who, under an agreement with her employer is entitled in each half-year either to one week's holiday on full pay, or to double pay for one week's work.

(b) All employment on a Sunday.

(c) All employment on any other day in excess of 8½ hours.

14. For the purpose of the application of the above differential rates of wages for overtime employment the Middlesex Agricultural Wages Committee have by Order dated 15th February, 1928, defined the following employment as the

employment which is to be treated as overtime employment:—

(a) In the case of all workers, all employment in excess of 5½ hours on a Saturday or on such other day (not being Sunday) in every week as may be agreed between employer and worker.

(b) In the case of all workers, all employment on Good Friday, Easter Monday, Whit Monday, August Bank Holiday, Christmas Day, Boxing Day and any other Bank Holidays which may be proclaimed by Royal Proclamation.

(c) In the case of workers employed wholly or mainly on the duties of Stockmen, all employment in excess of 60 hours in any week (including Sunday, but excluding all hours which are to be treated as overtime employment).

(d) In the case of workers employed wholly or mainly as Carters, all employment in excess of 56 hours in any week (including Sunday, but excluding all hours which are to be treated as overtime employment).

(e) In the case of workers other than those mentioned in (c) and (d) above,

(i) all employment on a Sunday,

(ii) all employment in excess of 50 hours in any week (excluding all hours which are to be treated as overtime employment) in summer, and

(iii) all employment in excess of 48 hours in any week (excluding all hours which are to be treated as overtime employment) in winter.

1. This Order may be cited as the Leeds Registration of Births, etc., Order, 1929, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of March, 1929.

2. The Bramley and Holbeck, Hunslet and Leeds Registration Districts, which together form the area of the Leeds Union, shall cease to exist and that Union shall be divided into two Superintendent Registrars' Districts, to be named Leeds North and Leeds South respectively.

3. (a) The Leeds North Registration District constituted by this Order shall consist of the existing Leeds Registration District.

(b) The Leeds South Registration District constituted by this Order shall consist of the existing Bramley and Holbeck and Hunslet Registration Districts.

4. (a) Each of the existing Sub-districts in the Leeds Registration District shall form a Sub-district of the Leeds North Registration District and each of such Sub-districts shall be known by the same name as heretofore.

(b) The existing Sub-district of Bramley and Holbeck in the Bramley and Holbeck Registration District and each of the existing Sub-districts in the Hunslet Registration District shall form a Sub-district of the Leeds South Registration District and each of such Sub-districts shall be known by the same name as heretofore.

5. The Superintendent Registrars of the existing Leeds and the Bramley and Holbeck Registration Districts shall be respectively the Superintendent Registrars of the Leeds North and the Leeds South Registration Districts as constituted by this Order.
