And whereas the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council,

a Scheme bearing date the 8th day of November, 1928, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Toxteth Park, Saint James, and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Toxteth Park, Saint Matthew, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Lancaster and in the Diocese of Liverpool:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Albert Augustus, Bishop of Liverpool, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report (*inter alia*) upon the union of the said two Benefices of Toxteth Park, Saint James, and Toxteth Park, Saint Matthew, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Liverpool and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Liverpool signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

" And whereas both of the said Benefices of Toxteth Park, Saint James, and Toxteth Park, Saint Matthew, are at present full the Reverend Henry Gordon being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Toxteth Park, Saint James, and the Reverend George Hayward being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Toxteth Park, Saint Matthew:

" Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Albert Augustus, Bishop of Liverpool (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

" 1. That the said Benefice of Toxteth Park, Saint James, and the said Benefice of Toxteth Park, Saint Matthew, shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Toxteth Park, Saint James with Saint Matthew,' and that the Parishes of the said Benefices shall also be united into one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measure provided.

" 2. That the Church of the Parish of Toxteth Park, Saint James, shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Toxteth Park, Saint James, shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish.

" 3. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if one only of the said two Benefices shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but, if he shall not so consent then the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of his Benefice and the then Incumbent (if any) of the other of the said two Benefices shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice; and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of either of the said two Benefices if the Incumbent at that time of the other of the said two Benefices shall consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of his Benefice and the then Incumbent (if any) of the other of the said two Benefices shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 4. (a) That so soon as conveniently may be after the union has taken effect the Church of Saint Matthew, Toxteth Park, shall be taken down and the materials and site thereof, together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed by the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

" (b) That the net proceeds to arise from such sale or sales after the appropriation to the Expenses Fund of the Diocese of Liverpool under the said Measure of so much of such proceeds as may in our opinion be necessary to defray the expenses attendant upon the sale or sales, the taking down of the Church, the removal of monuments (if any) and all other expenses incidental to these matters, shall be applied by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners as follows, that is to say, a sum to be approved by us and the Bishop of Liverpool shall be set aside and applied towards the cost of the provision of a Parochial Hall for the United Benefice, and the residue of such net proceeds shall be added to the said Expenses Fund of the Diocese of Liverpool.

" (c) That the font, communion table, sacramental plate, bells, organ and other furniture and fittings of the said Church of Saint Matthew, Toxteth Park, or such of them as the Bishop of Liverpool shall select, shall be transferred to the Parish Church of the United Benefice, and any articles not so transferred shall be transferred to any other Church or Chapel or Churches or Chapels within the Diocese of Liverpool which the Bishop may select: provided always that any articles that shall not be so transferred or appropriated, except the font, communion table and sacramental plate, may be sold and the proceeds shall be added to the fund arising from the sale of the site and materials of the said Church of Saint Matthew, Toxteth Park, as aforesaid.

" 5. That upon the union taking effect the Register Books of Baptisms, Marriages and Burials and other the Records and Muniments deposited in the Church of Saint Matthew, Toxteth Park, shall be transferred to the Church of Saint James, Toxteth Park, but the marriage registers in duplicate current at the Church of Saint Matthew, Toxteth Park, shall first be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Registrar General to be closed officially.

" 6. That two Curates or a Curate and a Lay Reader be appointed to assist the Incumbent in performing the duties of the United Benefice, this recommendation and proposal being made to the intent that the Bishop shall have the power of requiring the appointment of two Curates or a Curate in accordance with and subject to the conditions and provisions of subsection (b) of Section 18 of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and towards the remuneration of the second Curate or Lay Reader as the case may be a part of the endowment at present belonging to the said Benefice of Toxteth Park, Saint Matthew, that is to say, an annual sum of £150 (being part of a larger annual payment at present made by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Toxteth Park, Saint Matthew) shall be appropriated and held and administered by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, as a fund applicable only for and towards the remuneration of the second Curate or Lay Reader as aforesaid and to be payable by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners in general accordance with our regulations from time to time relating to payments of grants for or towards the stipends of Assistant Curates.

"7. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, and the first turn of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice after the union shall belong to the Patron or Patrons of that one of the said two Benefices of Toxteth Park, Saint James, and Toxteth Park, Saint Matthew, an Incumbent of which does not become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice under any of the provisions of Clause 3 of this Scheme.

" Provided always that the provisions herein contained relating to the sale and disposal of the Church of Saint Matthew, Toxteth Park, shall not take effect until the consents and approval which by the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, are made requisite to the sale under the powers conferred by that Measure of the site of any Church shall be obtained to the sale and disposal hereby proposed of the said Church of Saint Matthew, Toxteth Park, and of the site thereof together with any ground annexed or belonging thereto.

" And provided further that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

WHEREAS His Majesty was pleased by His Commission dated the 4th day of December, 1928, to nominate and appoint Her Majesty The Queen, His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, K.G., K.T., K.P., G.C.S.I., G.C.M.G., G.C.I.E., G.C.V.O., G.B.E., His Royal Highness The Duke of York, K.G., K.T., G.C.M.G., G.C.V.O., the Most Reverend Father in God Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of Canterbury, the Right Honourable Douglas McGarel, Baron Hailsham, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Right Honourable Stanley Baldwin, Prime Minister and First Lord of the Treasury, or any three of them, during His Majesty's illness to summon and hold on His Majesty's behalf His Privy Council, and to signify thereat His Majesty's approval of any matter or thing to which His Majesty's approval in Council is required:

And whereas the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 31st day of January, 1929, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice') of Stoulton with Drake's Broughton, in the County of Worcester and in the Diocese of Worcester:

"Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Stoulton with Drake's Broughton is vested in the Right Honourable Arthur Herbert Tennyson, Baron Somers, in fee simple in possession free from incumbrances, and the said Arthur Herbert Tennyson, Baron Somers, is therefore the Patron or person entitled to present or nominate to the said Benefice in case the same were now vacant:

"And whereas the said Arthur Herbert Tennyson, Baron Somers, is desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Stoulton with Drake's Broughton should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Worcester for the time being:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Ernest, now Bishop of Worcester, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary he the said Ernest, Bishop of Worcester, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Stoulton with Drake's Broughton which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the parish or district in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parish of Stoulton with Drake's Broughton:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Arthur Herbert Tennyson, Baron Somers, being the person whose consent as Patron is required by the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts and of the Act of the 1st and 2nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 106 (in testimony of which consent he has signed and sealed this Scheme) and with the consent of the said Ernest, Bishop of Worcester (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Stoulton with Drake's Broughton shall be transferred to the said Ernest, Bishop of Worcester, and his successors in the same Bishopric and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Ernest, Bishop of Worcester, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved at the Council held under the authority of the said Commission:

Now, therefore, His Royal Highness The Duke of York, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Prime Minister and First Lord of the Treasury being authorized thereto by His Majesty's said Commission have taken the said Scheme into consideration and do hereby, by and

with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council on His Majesty's behalf, ratify the same and order, as it is hereby ordered, that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And do hereby, by and with the like advice, direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Worcester.

UNIVERSITY OF OXFORD.

STATUTE APPROVED BY CONGREGATION ON
TUESDAY, FEBRUARY 19, 1929.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend § 1 of Sectio 1 of Titulus IV of the Statutes of the University of Oxford so as to provide that the age-limit imposed upon holders of Professorships, Lecturerships, and other University Teacherships by clause 2 of that sub-section shall be removed in the case of the holders of certain specified offices: NOW THE SAID UNIVERSITY in exercise of the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, and of all other powers enabling it, ENACTS, SUBJECT TO THE APPROVAL OF HIS MAJESTY IN COUNCIL, AS FOLLOWS.

In Statt. Tit. IV. Sect. 1. § 1, after clause 3 the following new clause shall be inserted:--

"Clauses 2 and 3 of this Statute shall not apply to any of the offices specified in the Schedule appended to this clause, but every such office shall be deemed to be tenable for the period for which the holder was appointed, subject to his liability to vacate it by deprivation for sufficient cause.

In pursuance of the powers contained in the Railway Employment (Prevention of Accidents) Act, 1900, the Ministry of Transport Act, 1919, and the Ministry of Transport (Board of Trade Exception of Powers) Order, 1919, the Minister of Transport hereby gives notice that he proposes to make the following Rules, and that copies of the draft Rules may be obtained at the Ministry of Transport, 6, Whitehall Gardens, London, S.W. 1.

The Prevention of Accidents (Extension of Time) Rules, 1929, dated 1929, made by the Minister of Transport pursuant to the Railway Employment (Prevention of Accidents) Act, 1900 (63 and 64 Vict., c. 27) the Ministry of Transport Act, 1919 (9 and 10 Geo. 5, c. 50), and the Ministry of Transport (Board of Trade Exception of Powers) Order, 1919 (S.R. & O., 1919, No. 1440).

1. In these Rules the following expressions have the following meanings:—

The expression "the Minister" means the Minister of Transport.

The expression "owner" means a company, firm or person owning wagons for use on any railway.

The expression "certified return" means a return certified as true and signed by the owner making the return, or where the owner is a firm by a member of the firm, or where the owner is a company by a person or persons duly authorised to sign documents requiring authentication by the Company.

The expression "fitted" means fitted on both sides with brake levers complying with the conditions set out in Schedule No. 1 to the Prevention of Accidents Rules, 1911.

The expression "partly-fitted" means fitted on both sides with brake levers of a description not in accordance with the requirements of the said Schedule No. 1.

The expression "unfitted" means not fitted with brake levers on both sides.

2. As respects the owners to whom these Rules apply, Clause (2) of the Prevention of Accidents Rules, 1911, as amended by the Prevention of Accidents (Extension of Time) Rules, 1920, and the Prevention of Accidents (Extension of Time) Rules, 1926 (hereinafter called "the Principal Rules") shall be read and have effect as if the period of twenty-five years from the date of the Prevention of Accidents Rules, 1911, were therein referred to instead of the period of twenty years from the said date.

3.—(1) Subject as hereinafter provided, these Rules apply to every owner owning 50 such wagons or over who complies with the following conditions, that is to say:—

(a) within seven days (or such further period as the Minister may allow) after the thirty-first day of December, 1929, and within the like period after the thirty-first day of December in each of the six succeeding years, furnishes to the Minister a certified return showing the number of unfitted, partly-fitted and fitted wagons owned by him at such thirty-first day of December, and from time to time supplies such further information in connection therewith as the Minister may require, and

(b) satisfies the Minister from time to time within such time as the Minister may allow that the total number of unfitted and partly-fitted wagons belonging to him is not unreasonably great having regard to the requirement of the Principal Rules as amended by these Rules that all wagons for use on any railway shall be fitted by the seventh day of November, 1936,

(c) satisfies the Minister within such time after the thirty-first day of December, 1931, as the Minister may allow that the total number of unfitted and partly-fitted wagons belonging to him on the thirty-first day of December, 1931, does not exceed the number specified in that behalf in the Schedule hereto.

(2) If any owner fails in any year to comply with any of the conditions laid down in

these Rules, the Minister may publish in the London and Edinburgh Gazettes a notice that such owner has so failed, and as from the date of the publication of such notice these Rules shall cease to apply to that owner, and unless and until such a notice is published with

regard to him an owner shall be deemed to have complied with all the said conditions.

4. These Rules shall come into operation as from the date hereof and may be cited as "The Prevention of Accidents (Extension of Time) Rules, 1929."

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1929 (No. 15).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Further Contraction of Cambridge Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area.

1.—(1) The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1929 (No. 11) as amended by the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1929 (No. 13) shall be read and have effect as if the Area described in the First Schedule to this Order were substituted for the Infected Area described in the First Schedule to the last mentioned Order.

(2) This Article shall come into operation on the eighth day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine.

Further Contraction of Widnes (Lancs.) Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area.

2.—(1) The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1929 (No. 12) as amended by the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1929 (No. 13) shall be read and have effect as if the Area described in the Second Schedule to this Order were substituted for the Infected Area described in the Second Schedule to the last mentioned Order.

(2) This Article shall come into operation on the tenth day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine.

Release of Infected Areas from Restrictions.

3.—(1) The Area described in the First Schedule to this Order shall cease to be an Infected Area for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925, as from the fifteenth day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine.

(2) The Area described in the Second Schedule to this Order shall cease to be an Infected Area for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925, as from the seventeenth day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine.

Short Title.

4. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1929 (No. 15).

- (d) During any other week in Winter, 48.

2. (f) All employment in excess of 48 hours (excluding all hours which are to be treated as hours of overtime employment) in any other week in winter.

For the purpose of this Order employment in summer shall be deemed to be employment during the period commencing on the second Monday in February and ending on the second Sunday in November, and employment in winter shall be deemed to be employment during the rest of the year.
