WHEREAS in pursuance of the Oxford Extension Act, 1928, the boundary of the City of Oxford will on the first day of April, 1929, be altered so as to include certain areas situate in the Administrative County of Oxford:

And whereas by Section 7 of the said Act it is provided as follows:—

7.—(2) On the date of the passing of this Act the provisions of Section 30 (Proceedings for division of borough into wards or alteration of wards) of the Municipal Corporations Act 1882 as amended by the Municipal Corporations Act, 1893, and the Borough Councillors (Alteration of Number) Act 1925 shall have effect as if—

(a) a petition had been presented by the council praying for an alteration of the number of councillors and wards of the city and an alteration of the boundaries of the said wards; and

(b) the provisions of this Act altering the boundaries of the existing city had come into operation.

(3) Notwithstanding anything in the [City of Oxford] Order of 1889 any Order in Council made in pursuance of the provisions of this section for altering the number of councillors of the city may—

(a) fix the number of councillors to be elected respectively by the local government electors of the city and by the University.

(5) Articles XI and XII of the Order of 1889 may be altered or varied by an Order in Council made in pursuance of this section so far as may be requisite for the purposes of this section.

And whereas by an Order in Council made on the 21st day of December, 1928, it was ordered that the number of Wards of the City shall be seven, and that the number of Councillors elected by the local government electors of the City shall be forty-two and the number of Councillors elected by the University shall be nine:

And whereas on the 14th day of January, 1929, the Right Honourable Sir William Joynson-Hicks, Baronet, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, did appoint Charles Matthew Knowles, Esquire, LL.B., Barrister-at-law, to be a Commissioner to prepare a Scheme for determining the boundaries

of the Wards of the City and for apportioning among the Wards the councillors elected by the local government electors:

And whereas the said Commissioner has accordingly prepared the following Scheme, dated the 27th day of February, 1929:—

“SCHEME FOR DETERMINING THE BOUNDARIES OF THE WARDS OF THE CITY OF OXFORD AND APPORTIONING THE COUNCILLORS AMONGST THE SAID WARDS IN PURSUANCE OF SECTION 7 OF THE OXFORD EXTENSION ACT, 1928.

“I. BOUNDARIES OF WARDS.

“In the following descriptions ‘The City Boundary’ means the boundary of the City of Oxford as extended by the Oxford Extension Act, 1928.

“*Summertown and Wolvercote Ward.*

“A line commencing at the north western corner of enclosure 5 on the City Boundary thence northwards, north-eastwards, northwards, eastwards and southwards following the City Boundary to a point immediately east of the southernmost boundary of enclosure 155 thence westwards, northwards and westwards following the southern boundary of enclosure 155 and continuing westwards following the boundary between enclosure 156 and enclosure 170 to its junction with the boundary between enclosures 156 and 157 thence southwards and westwards following the eastern and southern boundaries of enclosure 157 and continuing westwards following the boundaries between enclosures 157, 158 and 161 on the north and enclosures 169, 168 and 168a on the south to the junction with Charlbury Road, thence southwards along the centre of Charlbury Road to its junction with Belbroughton Road thence westwards along the centre of Belbroughton Road to its junction with Banbury Road thence northwards along the centre of Banbury Road to its junction with Staverton Road thence westwards and south-westwards along the centre of Staverton Road to its junction with Woodstock Road thence northwards along the centre of Woodstock Road to its junction with Frenchay Road thence westwards along the centre of Frenchay Road to its terminus, thence continuing in a straight line to the centre of the Oxford Canal thence southwards along the centre of the Oxford Canal to a point immediately under the centre of the bridge immediately west of the junction of Hayfield Road and Kingston Road thence westwards along the centre of the said bridge and continuing westwards along the centre of the road west of the said bridge to a point in the centre of that road due south of the south-western corner of enclosure 91a thence northwards to the said south-western corner of enclosure 91a thence northwards following the western boundary of enclosure 91a to the south-eastern corner of enclosure 81 thence westwards following the southern boundaries of enclosures 81, 82 and 86 and the southern and western boundaries of enclosure 92 thence northwards following the boundary between enclosure 50 on the west and enclosures 85, 84, 56, 56a, 181, 179, 180 and 168 on the east thence westwards following the northern boundary of enclosure 50 to its junction with the eastern boundary of enclosure 52 thence continuing westwards following the northern boundaries of enclosures 52 and 1 to the junction with the

northern boundary of enclosure 161 thence southwards, eastwards, southwards and westwards following the boundaries of enclosure 161 to the junction of its southern boundary with the eastern boundary of enclosure 162 thence southwards following the boundary between enclosures 160 and 162 as far as the boundary stone on Godstow Bridge thence westwards and north-westwards following the southern boundary of enclosure 158 to the point of commencement aforesaid.

“*North Ward.*

“A line commencing at a point at the junction of High Street, with Cornmarket Street thence northwards along the centre of Cornmarket Street, Magdalen Street, St. Giles Street and Woodstock Road to its junction with Little Clarendon Street thence south-westwards along the centre of Little Clarendon Street to its junction with Walton Street thence north-westwards along the centre of Walton Street and Walton Well Road to a point in the centre of the bridge over the centre of the Great Western Railway track thence northwards along the centre of the said railway track to its junction with the southern boundary of Summertown and Wolvercote Ward, thence eastwards, northwards, eastwards and southwards following the southern boundary of Summertown and Wolvercote Ward hereinbefore described to its junction with the City Boundary thence southwards following the City Boundary to the point where it leaves the centre of the River Cherwell at Parson's Pleasure Bathing Place thence southwards along the centre of the eastern branch of the River Cherwell to a point beneath the centre of the footbridge connecting enclosures 6 and 7 (St. Clements Parish) thence southwards and south-westwards along the centre of the River Cherwell to a point beneath the centre of Magdalen Bridge thence north-westwards and westwards along the centre of Magdalen Bridge and High Street to the point of commencement aforesaid.

“*South Ward.*

“A line commencing at the junction of High Street with Cornmarket Street thence eastwards following the southern boundary of North Ward hereinbefore described to a point immediately over the centre of the West branch of the River Cherwell thence southwards along the centre of the said River to the northern corner of enclosure 11 thence continuing southwards following the western boundaries of enclosures 11 and 12 to the point where the latter boundary meets the boundary of enclosure 21 thence continuing southwards and following the western boundaries of enclosures 21, 24, 27, 32 and 33 to a point 55 yards north of the north-eastern corner of enclosure 34 thence westwards in a straight line across the River Thames to the boundary stone on the west

bank of the said River thence in a south-eastern direction following the west bank of the River Thames to the north-eastern corner of enclosure 40 on the City Boundary thence westwards, southwards, north-westwards, south-westwards, and north-westwards following the City Boundary to the boundary stone on the west boundary of enclosure 1 thence north-eastwards following the northern boundaries of enclosures 1, 5, 6 and 7 to the most northerly point of enclosure 7 thence north-westwards in a straight line to the southern corner of enclosure 8 thence north-westwards and north-eastwards following the western boundary of enclosure 8 to its junction with the most westerly point of enclosure 9 thence following the western boundary of enclosure 9 to its junction with the most westerly point of enclosure 35 thence in an easterly direction along the south-eastern boundary of enclosure 88 to the most easterly point of that enclosure thence in a westerly and generally northerly direction along the western boundaries of enclosures 4, 2 and 1 thence along the centre of enclosure 69 to a point under the centre of Pacey's Bridge thence eastwards along the centres of New Road and Queen Street to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" East Ward:

"A line commencing at the junction of the eastern boundary of South Ward with the southern boundary of North Ward on Magdalen Bridge thence southeastwards, eastwards and northwards following the eastern boundary of North Ward hereinbefore described to the Boundary Stone at Kings Mill House thence eastwards following the northern boundaries of enclosures 8, 11 and 12 to the northeast corner of enclosure 12 thence southwards and eastwards following the western and southern boundaries of enclosure 14 to the Boundary Stone at the southeast corner of enclosure 184 thence northeastwards following the southeastern boundary of enclosure 184 and continuing eastwards following the southern boundaries of enclosures 180 and 185 to the junction with the eastern boundary of enclosure 16 thence southwards following the eastern boundary of

enclosures 16 and 15 to the most westerly point of enclosure 17 thence southwards in a straight line to the centre of Headington Road thence northeastwards along the centre of Headington Road to its junction with Gipsy Lane thence southeastwards along the centre of Gipsy Lane to its junction with Old Road thence eastwards along the centre of Old Road to a point immediately north of the boundary stone at the northeastern corner of enclosure 46A thence southwards to the Boundary Stone thence southwards following the eastern boundaries of enclosures 46A, 46, 46B and 48 to the junction with the northwest boundary of enclosure 68C thence southwestwards following the boundary of enclosure 48 to the point where that boundary meets the northeastern boundary of enclosure 68B thence northwestwards following the northeastern boundary of enclosure 68B to the northern corner of that enclosure thence southwestwards, southeastwards and southwestwards following the northwestern boundary of enclosure 68B to its junction with enclosure 62 thence northwestwards, southwestwards and northwestwards following the southern and southwestern boundaries of enclosure 61 to its junction with the eastern boundary of enclosure 60 thence southwestwards following the southeastern boundaries of enclosures 60, 58 and 73 to the centre of Cowley Road thence southeastwards along the centre of Cowley Road to a point opposite and in a straight line with the boundary between enclosures 69 and 70 thence southwestwards following the said boundary between enclosures 69 and 70 to the centre of Cricket Road thence southeastwards along the centre of Cricket Road to its junction with the northern boundary of enclosure 67 thence southwestwards following the northern boundaries of enclosures 67 and 64 to the junction with Iffley Road, and continuing in the same straight line to the centre of Iffley Road thence northwestwards along the centre of Iffley Road to its junction with Jackdaw Lane thence westwards along the centre of Jackdaw Lane to its junction with the eastern boundary of the South Ward thence northwestwards, northwards, northeastwards and northwards following the eastern boundary of South Ward hereinbefore described to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" Headington Ward.

"A line commencing at a point on the City Boundary in the centre of the River Cherwell southwest of the southern corner of enclosure 189 thence northeastwards, eastwards and southwards following the City Boundary to its junction with the northeast boundary of enclosure 8 thence in a northwesterly direction following the northeastern boundaries of enclosures 8, 5, 4, 1, 165, 173 and 175 to the northern corner of enclosure 175 thence southwestwards following the northwestern boundary of enclosure 175 to the southeastern corner of enclosure 289 thence westwards following the southern boundary of enclosure 289 to the northwestern corner of enclosure 286A thence southwards following the eastern boundary of

enclosure 288A to the most southerly point of that enclosure thence northwestwards following the southern boundaries of enclosures 288A and 287 and the western boundary of enclosure 282 to its junction with the eastern boundary of the East Ward thence northwards, westwards, northwestwards, westwards, northwards, westwards, northwards and westwards following the northern boundary of East Ward as hereinbefore described to its junction with the eastern boundary of North Ward thence in a northwesterly direction following the eastern boundary of North Ward as hereinbefore described to the point of commencement aforesaid.

"Cowley and Ifley Ward.

"A line commencing at the junction of Jackdaw Lane with the eastern boundary of South Ward thence eastwards, southeastwards, northeastwards, northwestwards and northeastwards following the southern boundary of East Ward hereinbefore described to its junction with the southern boundary of Headington Ward thence southeastwards, northeastwards and southeastwards following the southern boundary of Headington Ward hereinbefore described to its junction with the City Boundary thence southwards, westwards and northwards following the City Boundary to its junction with the southern boundary of South Ward thence northwards following the eastern boundary of South Ward hereinbefore described to the point of commencement aforesaid.

"PLAN DELINEATING BOUNDARIES.

"The boundaries of the Wards as above defined are delineated on the Plan annexed hereto, which forms part of the Scheme.

"In case of any discrepancy between the Wards as delineated on the Plan and the textual description of the Wards as above set out, the textual description shall prevail.

"II.—APPORTIONMENT OF COUNCILLORS.

"The number of Councillors elected by the local government electors of the City for each Ward shall be six.

"III.—SUPPLEMENTARY PROVISIONS.

"Article XII of the City of Oxford Order, 1889, shall be altered or varied as follows:—

"The number of Aldermen of the City shall be increased from fifteen to seventeen of whom fourteen shall be elected by the Councillors representing the Citizens and three shall be elected by the Councillors representing the University.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late

Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the New Parish of Saint John, Long Eaton, in the County of Derby, and in the Diocese of Derby:

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the 10th day of August, 1922, and published in the London Gazette on the 11th day of the same month, a separate District for spiritual purposes was constituted out of the Parish of Long Eaton, in the said County of Derby, and at that time in the Diocese of Southwell, but now in the said Diocese of Derby, and the said District was named 'The District of Saint John, Long Eaton':

"And whereas the said District of Saint John, Long Eaton, has become a New Parish of the character contemplated by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, by the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, and by the above-mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

"And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint John, Long Eaton, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Edmund Courtenay, Bishop of Derby (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend and propose that, from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint John, Long Eaton, shall be altered so that all that portion of the Parish of Sandiacre, in the said County of Derby and in the said Diocese of Derby, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink, shall be severed from such Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint John, Long Eaton.

"And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

"The territory to be annexed to the New Parish of Saint John, Long Eaton, in the County of Derby and in the Diocese of Derby, being:—

"All that portion of the said Parish of Sandiacre which is bounded upon the south

west by the Parish of Sawley in the said County and Diocese, upon the south east partly by the said Parish of Sawley and partly by the said New Parish of Saint John, Long Eaton, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the east and upon the north west, by an imaginary line commencing at the point in the middle of the Erewash Canal where the boundaries of the said Parish of Sandiacre, of the said New Parish of Saint John, Long Eaton, and of the Parish of Long Eaton, in the said County and Diocese, all meet, and extending thence northward along the middle of the Erewash Canal for a distance of 41 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the Derby Canal, and extending thence south westward along the middle of the Derby Canal for a distance of 60 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Sandiacre from the said Parish of Sawley."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme or Representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such Scheme or Representation and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto:

And whereas the said Scheme or Representation has been approved at the Council held under the authority of the said Commission:

Now, therefore, His Royal Highness The Duke of York, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Prime Minister and First Lord of the Treasury being authorised thereto by His Majesty's said Commission, have taken the said Scheme or Representation into consideration, and do hereby, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, on His Majesty's behalf, ratify the same and order, as it is hereby ordered, that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And do hereby, by and with the like advice, direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Derby.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice') of Christ Church, Folkestone, in the County of Kent, and in the Diocese of Canterbury:

"Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Christ Church, Folkestone, is vested for an estate in fee simple without incumbrances in the Right Honourable William Pleydell-Bouverie, commonly called Viscount Folkestone and hereinafter referred to as 'William, Viscount Folkestone':

"And whereas the said William, Viscount Folkestone, is desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Christ Church, Folkestone, now vested in him as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Archbishop of Canterbury for the time being:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Ernest William, Bishop of Birmingham, as such Bishop, and with the consents of John Francis William Deacon, of Mabledon, Tonbridge, in the County of Kent, Esquire, the Reverend Ernest Newton Sharpe, of the Vicarage, Paddington, London, Clerk in Holy Orders and a Prebendary of the Cathedral Church of Saint Paul in London, George Thomas Bethune Baker, of Number 9, Eversfield Road, Eastbourne, in the County of Sussex, Esquire, and the Venerable John Harold Richards, of Coleshill Vicarage, Birmingham, Clerk in Holy Orders and Archdeacon of Aston, as the Patrons as well of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Erdington, as of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Aston juxta Birmingham (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said New Parish of Erdington and of the said Parish of Aston juxta Birmingham which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one Consolidated Chapelry for the said Church of All Saints, Gravelly Hill, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of All Saints, Gravelly Hill.'

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal Wisdom shall seem meet.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of All Saints, Gravelly Hill, comprising:—

"I. All that portion of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Erdington, in the County of Warwick and in the Diocese of Birmingham, which is bounded upon the north-west, upon the west, and upon the south-west by the Parish of Aston juxta Birmingham, in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south-east, upon the east, and upon the north-east, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said Parish of Aston juxta Birmingham from the said New Parish of Erdington crosses the middle of Salford Bridge which carries the road connecting Lichfield Road and the road called Gravelly Hill across the River Tame, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the said bridge and of Gravelly Hill for a distance in all of 51 chains or thereabouts to the junction of Gravelly Hill with the road called Hunton Hill, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Hunton Hill for a distance of 9 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries Hunton Hill over the Sutton Coldfield Branch Line of the London, Midland and Scottish Railway, and extending

thence north-eastward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of 40 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries Reservoir Road across such line of railway, and extending thence first north-westward then westward and then again north-westward along the middle of Reservoir Road for a distance of 20 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the footpath leading past the western side of the Erdington Reservoir into Marsh Lane, and extending thence first north-westward and then in various directions along the middle of the said footpath for a distance of 26 chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the southern side of Marsh Lane, and extending thence north-westward in a straight line (thereby crossing Marsh Lane) for a distance of 10 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge over the stream flowing through Marsh Lane Farm and extending thence westward along the middle of the said stream (thereby passing under Bleakhill Lane) for a distance of 40 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the stream flowing into the Upper Witton Reservoirs upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Erdington from the said Parish of Aston juxta Birmingham.

Now, therefore, His Royal Highness The Duke of York, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Prime Minister and First Lord of the Treasury being authorised thereto by His Majesty's said Commission have taken the said Representation into consideration, and do hereby, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, on His Majesty's behalf, ratify the same and order, as it is hereby ordered, that

the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And do hereby, by and with the like advice, direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Birmingham.
