#### TIN BOX TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

PROPOSAL TO FIX MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS NEWLY BROUGHT WITHIN THE SCOPE OF THE TRADE BOARD IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE REGULATIONS MADE UNDER SECTION 18 OF THE TRADE BOARDS ACT, 1909, BY THE MINISTER OF LABOUR AND DATED 21ST APRIL, 1927.

The Tin Box Trade Board (Great Britain) HEREBY GIVE NOTICE that they PROPOSE TO FIX Minimum Rates of Wages for Male and Female workers newly brought within the scope of the Trade Board by the Trade Boards (Tin Box Trade, Great Britain) (Constitution and Proceedings) Regulations, 1928.

Particulars of the proposed Minimum Rates may be obtained on application to the Secretary of the Board.

In accordance with Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board will consider any Objections to the above Proposal to Fix, which may be lodged with them within two months from the 12th March, 1929. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address) and should be sent to the Secretary, Tin Box Trade Board (Great

Britain), 1, Whitehall Gardens, London, S.W. 1. It is desirable that Objections should state precisely and, as far as possible, with reasons what is objected to.

His Majesty The KING has been pleased, upon the recommendation of the President of the Board of Trade, to award the Bronze Medal for Gallantry in Saving Life at Sea to Mr. John William Harris, First Mate, Mr. Stephen Corner Stephenson Taws, Second Mate, and Reginald Thistle Forster, Percy Arthur Walker, and Arthur William Rouse, Quartermasters and A.B.'s, formerly of the s.s. "City of Lahore," of Liverpool, in recognition of the gallantry displayed by them on the 30th October, 1927, in saving the lives of the crew of the Newfoundland schooner "Selma Creaser," which was in distress in the Atlantic Ocean.

The Silver Medal for Gallantry in Saving Life at Sea (Foreign Services) has also been awarded, on the recommendation of the President of the Board of Trade, to a number of Icelanders in recognition of the gallant services rendered by them on 20th and 21st March, 1928, when they rescued the crew of the steam trawler "Max Pemberton" of Hull, which stranded on the Icelandic Coast on 20th March, 1928.

The award has also been approved of the Silver Medal for Gallantry in Saving Life at Sea to William Arthur James, fireman of the British s.s. "Trojanstan."

A fire broke out in the stoke-hold of the vessel on the 12th October, 1928, and a number of the crew were unable to make their escape from the engine room. James with commendable gallantry and at considerable risk, closed the door of the pump room in which was stored a large quantity of oil fuel. This action prevented the fire spreading and was the means of preventing serious loss of life.
