WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION ACT, 1925.

The Home Secretary gives notice that in pursuance of Section 2 (1) of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920, he has made an Order authorising the employment on two day-shifts of women of 19 and young persons of 16 years of age and over at the Lowertown Mills of Messrs. Hield Brothers Limited, Oxenhope, near Keighley, subject to the conditions that a worker shall not be employed in the afternoon shift in consecutive weeks; that suitable accommodation for clothing put off during working hours, messroom accommodation, and washing facilities shall be provided; that additional

daily thermometer readings shall be taken and recorded if atmospheric humidity is artificially produced; and that the Secretary of State may at any time require the occupiers to make such special arrangements for the conveyance of workers living at a distance or otherwise for the welfare of such workers as may be necessary to prevent hardship.

In Two Portions.

Eleven Hackney Carriages:

First Portion. Four carriages in centre of roadway, commencing at a point thirty-five feet West of the Western Refuge at the junction with Gloucester Road and extending Westward as far as necessary for four carriages.

Front of vehicles toward the East.

Second Portion. Seven carriages in centre of roadway, commencing at a point in line with the party wall of Nos. 100-102, Cromwell Road, and extending Westward as far as necessary for seven carriages.

Front of vehicles toward the East.

The first portion of the Standing to be fed exclusively by carriages from the second portion.

Provided that no Hackney Carriage shall be suffered to stand across any street or thoroughfare, or opposite the end of any street or carriage-way, or upon any place where foot passengers usually cross the carriage-way.

KIDDERMINSTER AND STOURPORT ELECTRIC TRAMWAY COMPANY.

(TRAMWAY ABANDONMENT.)

CONSENT BY THE MINISTER OF TRANSPORT.

WHEREAS it is enacted by Section 46 of the Kidderminster and Stourport Electric Tramway Act, 1926 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1926") as follows:—

"(1) The Company may at any time and from time to time abandon all or any of their tramways with the consent of the Minister of Transport and of the local authority or local authorities of the district or districts in which the tramways or tramway proposed to be abandoned are or is situate upon and subject to such terms and conditions as the said Minister after considering any representations made to him by any such local authority or local authorities may impose."

And whereas it is enacted by Section 4 of the Act of 1926, as follows:—

"The Company" means the Kidderminster and Stourport Electric Tramway Company.

And whereas the Kidderminster and Stourport Electric Tramway Company (hereinafter referred to as "the Company") have made application for the consent of the Minister of Transport (hereinafter referred to as "the Minister") under the said Section 46 of the Act of 1926, to the abandonment by them of the Tramways hereinafter described and authorised by the Kidderminster and Stourport Electric Tramway Act, 1896, that is to say:—

Tramway No. 1.—Commencing in the parish of Kidderminster Borough at a point in the centre of Oxford Street opposite the north-eastern corner of the Green Man and Still Inn passing thence in a southerly direction along Oxford Street Bridge Street New Road Stourport Road and Foundry Street Lombard Street High Street and Bridge Street Stourport and terminating in the last-mentioned street in the parish of Lower Mitton at a point opposite the north eastern corner of the Bridge Inn in Bridge Street:

Tramway No. 3.—Commencing at a point in the centre of New Road 0.90 chain north-east of the southern corner of land numbered 225 on the 2500 Ordnance map and proceeding thence along a road running westward and which crosses over the River Stour or Mill Pool to the Canal Basin of the Staffordshire and Worcestershire Canal and terminating in that road at the boundary of the portion of land numbered 217 on the 2500 Ordnance map:

And whereas the Minister required the Company to give public and other notices of the said application and as to the manner in which representations and objections thereto might be made to him.

And whereas the local authorities of the districts in which the tramways hereinbefore described are situate have consented to the abandonment of such tramways:

Now therefore the Minister in exercise of the power in that behalf conferred on him by the said Section 46 of the Act of 1926, hereby consents to the abandonment of the tramways hereinbefore described and fixes the second day of April, 1929, as the date as from which all the powers obligations and liabilities of the Company in relation to the said tramways shall cease and determine in accordance with and subject to the provisions of sub-section (2) of the said Section 46 of the Act of 1926.

COUNTY BOROUGH OF BLACKPOOL. TRAMWAYS ACT, 1870.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Blackpool, acting by the Council as Local Authority in this behalf did on the 3rd day of April, 1929, make the following Bye-laws and Regulations:—

BYE-LAWS AND REGULATIONS

Made by the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Blackpool as Local Authority under the powers conferred on them by the Tramways Act, 1870.

Definitions.

1. For the purpose of these Bye-laws and Regulations the term "tramways" shall mean any tramway or tramways laid down within the Borough, the term "car" shall mean any carriage using such tramways, and the terms "driver" and "conductor" shall respectively mean the driver and conductor or other person having charge of a car.

Distance from other Cars.

2. Except at terminal stations, junctions, approved traffic stopping places, and, in cases of emergency, where any person authorised to control traffic on the spot shall otherwise direct, the driver of a car shall so drive the same that a space of not less than twenty yards shall separate it from any preceding car on the same track.

Driver to warn person in charge of Obstructing Vehicle.

3. The driver of a car on coming in sight of a vehicle or animal standing or travelling on any part of the road so as not to leave sufficient space for the car to pass shall sound his bell or whistle as a warning to the person in charge of such vehicle or animal and that person shall with reasonable despatch cause such vehicle or animal to be removed so as not to obstruct the car.

Impeding Traffic.

4. No person shall in any way wilfully impede or interfere with the traffic on the tramways nor shall any driver or conductor needlessly cause interruption to the ordinary road traffic.

Penalty.

5. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these Bye-laws and Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

Repeal of former Bye-laws.

6. The Bye-laws and Regulations made by the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Blackpool as the Local Authority on the 5th day of May, 1902, under the powers conferred upon them by section 46 of the Tramways Act, 1870, are hereby repealed as from the date of these Bye-laws and Regulations coming into force but without prejudice to any proceedings in respect of any contravention thereof prior to such date.

Date of Operation.

7. These Bye-laws and Regulations shall come into force on the first day of July, 1929.
