## WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION ACT, 1925.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department gives notice that, in consequence of the resignation of John Fletcher Horne, Esq., M.D., one of the Medical Referees under the above Act for the District of Barnsley County Court (Circuit 13) the appointment held by him is vacant.

Applications for the post should be addressed to the Private Secretary, Home Office, Whitehall, London, S.W. 1, and should reach him not later than 1st May, 1929.

The Home Secretary gives notice that in pursuance of Section 2 (1) of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920, he has made an Order authorising the employment on two day-shifts of women of 19 and young persons of 16 years of age and over at the Lowertown Mills of Messrs. Hield Brothers Limited, Oxenhope, near Keighley, subject to the conditions that a worker shall not be employed in the afternoon shift in consecutive weeks; that suitable accommodation for clothing put off during working hours, messroom accommodation, and washing facilities shall be provided; that additional

daily thermometer readings shall be taken and recorded if atmospheric humidity is artificially produced; and that the Secretary of State may at any time require the occupiers to make such special arrangements for the conveyance of workers living at a distance or otherwise for the welfare of such workers as may be necessary to prevent hardship.
