**W**HEREAS His Majesty was pleased by His Commission dated the 4th day of December, 1928, to nominate and appoint Her Majesty The Queen, His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, K.G., K.T., K.P., G.C.S.I., G.C.M.G., G.C.I.E., G.C.V.O., G.B.E., His Royal Highness The Duke of York, K.G., K.T., G.C.V.O., the Most Reverend Father in God Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of Canterbury, the Right Honourable Douglas McGarel, Baron Hailsham, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Right Honourable Stanley Baldwin, Prime Minister and First Lord of the Treasury, or any three of them, during His Majesty's illness, to summon and hold on His Majesty's behalf His Privy Council, and to signify thereat His Majesty's approval of any matter or thing to which His Majesty's approval in Council is required:

And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the sixteenth day of January, 1924, and known as the Sierra Leone (Legislative Council) Order in Council, 1924, provision was made for the constitution of a Legislative Council for the Colony and Protectorate of Sierra Leone:

And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the twenty-seventh day of June, 1927, and known as the Sierra Leone (Legislative Council) Amendment Order in Council, 1927, Articles 4 and 5 of the Sierra Leone (Legislative Council) Order in Council, 1924, were revoked and fresh Articles substituted therefor:

And whereas power was reserved to His Majesty from time to time to revoke, add to, alter, or amend the said Orders:

And whereas it is deemed expedient to make other provision than is contained in Article 5 of the Sierra Leone (Legislative Council) Order in Council, 1924, as amended by the Sierra Leone (Legislative Council) Amendment Order in Council, 1927:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty The Queen, His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, His Royal Highness The Duke of York, His Grace the Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Prime Minister and First Lord of the Treasury, by virtue and in exercise of all the powers enabling them in that behalf, and being authorised thereto by His Majesty's said Commission, are pleased, by and with the advice

of His Majesty's Privy Council, on His Majesty's behalf, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Sierra Leone (Legislative Council) Amendment Order in Council, 1928.

2. Article 5 of the Sierra Leone (Legislative Council) Order in Council, 1924, as amended by the Sierra Leone (Legislative Council) Amendment Order in Council, 1927, is hereby revoked without prejudice to anything lawfully done thereunder and the said Sierra Leone (Legislative Council) Order in Council, 1924, shall be construed and take effect as if, instead of Article 5 thereof, amended as aforesaid, the following Article had been inserted therein:—

"5.—(1) The Official Members of the Council shall consist of the following persons:—

The four senior Members of the Executive Council holding office in Sierra Leone;

The Officers lawfully discharging the functions of the Commissioners of the Northern, Central and Southern Provinces of the Protectorate;

The Officers lawfully discharging the functions of Comptroller of Customs, Director of Public Works, Director of Education, General Manager of Railways and Director of Agriculture.

(2) Whenever the Attorney General for the time being is unable, although present in Sierra Leone, to attend a meeting of the Council, the Solicitor General may attend in his place and with the same precedence."

3. This Order shall be published in the Sierra Leone Royal Gazette, and shall come into operation on a date to be fixed by the Governor by Proclamation in the said Gazette; and the Governor shall give directions for the publication of this Order at such places and in such manner and for such time or times as he thinks proper for giving due publicity thereto within Sierra Leone.

4. In this Order the term "the Governor" means the officer for the time being administering the government of Sierra Leone.

5. His Majesty may from time to time revoke, add to, alter, or amend this Order.

And the Right Honourable Leopold Charles Maurice Stennett Amery, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

#### DRESS.

The following are the Regulations to be observed:—

1. Peers, Bishops, His Majesty's Lieutenants of Counties, Deputy Lieutenants of Counties, Members of Parliament, Officials connected with the Houses of Parliament, Clergy of all Denominations, and all gentlemen other than those mentioned in the following Regulations, should communicate with the Comptroller, Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace. No applications can be received from gentlemen in the foregoing categories wishing to be presented. Their names must be forwarded by the gentleman making the presentation.

2. All gentlemen referred to in the following Regulations, wishing to attend or be presented at the Levée, should make a written application as directed below.

3. All Officers, whether on the active or retired lists of the Royal Navy and the Royal Marines, will communicate with and obtain their cards, whether for attendance or presentation, from the Private Secretary to the First Lord of the Admiralty.

4. All Officers on the active, retired, and reserve lists of the Regular Army, the Militia, and the Territorial Army, except Officers of the Household Cavalry and the Brigade of Guards, and except Officers of the Indian Services and Indian Army and Colonial Service and Colonial Forces, will communicate with and obtain their cards, whether for attendance or presentation from the Under-Secretary of State, War Office.

Officers of the Household Cavalry and the Brigade of Guards will communicate, through their Regimental Headquarters, with the Comptroller, Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, to obtain their cards for attendance or presentation.

5. All Officers on the active list of the Royal Air Force and Officers of the Special Reserve and Auxiliary Air Force will obtain their cards, for attendance or presentation, through the usual channels. Officers of the Reserve of Air Force Officers and Officers on the retired

list of the Royal Air Force will communicate with and obtain their cards, whether for attendance or presentation, from the Secretary, Air Ministry, Kingsway, W.C.2.

6. All Officers of His Majesty's Civil Service will communicate with and obtain their cards for attendance or presentation from the Department under which they serve.

7. All Officers of the Indian Services and of the Indian Army, whether on the active or retired lists, will communicate with and obtain their cards, for attendance or for presentation, from the Political A.D.C. to the Secretary of State at the India Office, Whitehall.

8. All Officers of the Colonial Service and Colonial Forces, whether on the active or retired lists, will communicate with and obtain their cards, whether for attendance or presentation, from the Colonial Office, Whitehall, with the exception of Officers of the local Forces of the self-governing Dominions, who will apply to the Under-Secretary of State, the War Office, for their cards for attendance or for presentation, supporting their application in all cases by a credential from the Governor-General, Governor, Officer commanding the local Forces, or the representative in London of the Dominion concerned.

9. Gentlemen connected with the Treasury, the Foreign Office, and other Government Departments will make their applications, whether for attendance or for presentation, through the Private Secretaries to the Ministers of the respective Departments.

10. Lord Mayors and Mayors, High Sheriffs, Sheriffs, Recorders, Chairmen of Quarter Sessions, Metropolitan Police Magistrates and other Stipendiary Magistrates, and gentlemen connected with the Home Office, will make their applications, whether for attendance or for presentation, through the Private Secretary to the Secretary of State for the Home Department.

11. Lord Provosts and Provosts and Conveners of County Councils will make their applications for attendance or for presentation through the Private Secretary to the Secretary of State for Scotland, at the Scottish Office, Whitehall.

Scottish Judges, Law Officers, King's Counsel and Legal Officials in Scotland should make their applications through the Legal Secretary to the Lord Advocate.

12. Chairmen of County Councils, and gentlemen connected with the Ministry of Health, will similarly make their applications through the Private Secretary to the Minister of Health.

13. Judges, Law Officers, King's Counsel, and all Legal Officials holding appointments under the Crown, other than those already mentioned, will similarly make their applications through the Private Secretary to the Lord Chancellor.

### PARCEL POST.

#### THE FOREIGN PARCELS (CUSTOMS) WARRANT, 1929.

DATED 2ND MARCH, 1929.

Whereas it is desirable to make provision for the delivery from the premises of exporters for exportation on drawback by Parcel Post of goods in respect of which duties payable under Part I of the Safeguarding of Industries Act, 1921, as amended and continued by Section 10 of the Finance Act, 1926, or Section 3 of the Finance Act, 1925, as amended by Section 3 of the Finance Act, 1926, Sections 3 and 4 of the Finance Act, 1927, and Sections 7 and 8 of the Finance Act, 1928, or Section 4 or Section 5 of the Finance Act, 1925, as amended by Section 5 of the Finance Act, 1926, or Section 6 of the Finance Act, 1925, or Section 1 of the Safeguarding of Industries (Customs Duties) Act, 1925, or Section 11 of the Finance Act, 1926, or Section 9 of the Finance Act, 1927, or Section 9 of the Finance Act, 1928, have been paid: We, the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of the powers conferred on us by Section fourteen of the Post Office (Parcels) Act, 1882, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the recommendation of the Commissioners of Customs and Excise and of His Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by their respectively signing the same), order, direct and declare as follows:—

1. The provisions of Sections 100, 102, 104 and 114 of the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876, of Section 7 of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, and of the Foreign Parcels (Customs) Warrant, 1885, shall not apply to goods as aforesaid which are delivered from the premises of exporters thereof for exportation on drawback by the Imperial and Foreign Parcel Post.

2. The Provisions of Sections 117 and 118 of the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876, shall apply to such goods with the modification that the proper Officer of Customs and Excise shall in place of certifying the shipment and exportation of the goods certify that the certificate of posting hereinafter mentioned has been duly received; and instead of a declaration by the exporter or his agent that the goods have been actually exported and not reloaded there shall be a declaration by the exporter or his agent that they have been duly delivered to an Officer of the Post Office in accordance with the provisions of this Warrant.

3. Every such parcel on its removal to the Post Office shall bear on the outer cover thereof a label on which shall be printed in conspicuous type the words "exported on drawback" and shall be accompanied by a shipping bill in the form prescribed by the Commissioners of Customs and Excise.

4. The Officer of the Post Office accepting such parcel duly labelled and accompanied by the shipping bill aforesaid, shall give the sender a certificate on such shipping bill of the posting of the parcel.

5. The delivery of every such parcel from the premises of the exporter shall be subject to such bond and to such special conditions as the said Commissioners of Customs and Excise may from time to time prescribe.

6. If any claim shall be made on the Postmaster-General for compensation in respect of the loss or damage to any such parcel, that claim shall, in the absence of proof to the contrary, be deemed to be conclusive evidence that such parcel has not been duly exported and that its contents have gone into use in Great Britain or Northern Ireland, and any drawback paid shall be repaid by the exporter.

7. The Foreign Parcels (Customs) Warrant, 1926, is hereby revoked.

8. This Warrant shall come into operation on the first day of May, 1929.

9. This Warrant may be cited as the Foreign Parcels (Customs) Warrant, 1929.
