COUNTY OF BERKS.

THE CORONERS (AMENDMENT) ACT, 1926.
ORDER FOR THE ALTERATION OF CORONERS'
DISTRICTS.

Whereas on the 26th day of April, 1927, a vacancy occurred in the Office of Franchise Coroner for the Manor and Liberty of Hungerford;

And whereas by the operation of Section 4 of the Coroners (Amendment) Act, 1926, the area over which the Franchise Coroner for the said Manor and Liberty of Hungerford had jurisdiction thereupon became merged in the County of Berks for all purposes relating to Coroners;

And whereas the County of Berks is at present divided into five Coroners Districts, and it is necessary to alter the existing division of the County so as to include the said Manor and Liberty of Hungerford in one of such districts;

And whereas the Berkshire County Council have pursuant to Section 12 of the said Act and to the Coroners (Orders as to Districts) Rules, 1927, submitted to the Secretary of State a draft Order providing for the alteration of the existing division of the County of Berks into Coroners districts so as to include in one of those districts the area of the Manor and Liberty of Hungerford;

Now, therefore, I, the undersigned, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, in pursuance of the power vested in me by Section 12 of the Coroners (Amendment) Act, 1926, do hereby order that the existing division of the County of Berks into Coroners' districts, shall be altered and that the said districts shall be named and constituted as set out in the Schedule hereto and substituted for the existing districts.

This Order shall come into operation on the first day of February, 1928.
