Sub-districts) Order, 1929, and shall come into operation on the 1st May, 1929.

2. The existing Redmarley Sub-district of Newent Registration District shall be extended by the addition of the Newent Sub-district of the same Registration District, and the extended Sub-district shall be known by the name of the Newent Sub-district.

3. The Registrar of the existing Redmarley Sub-district shall be the Registrar of Newent Sub-district constituted by this Order.

Zone 3.—All Finnish territory to the south of 62° N. latitude and to the east of 26° E. longitude and also that between 62° N. latitude and 64° 30′ N. latitude.

Zone 4.—All Finnish territory to the north of 64° 30′ N. latitude.

These charges are in all cases for a telephonic communication of not more than 3 minutes' duration. The charge for each additional minute or fraction of a minute after the first 3 minutes is one-third of the above-mentioned charges.

The hours during which the day charges apply are those between 8 a.m. and 7 p.m. (legal time of the country in which the call originates). The hours during which the night charges apply are those between 7 p.m. and 8 a.m. (legal time of the country in which the call originates).

In the case of a call from a call office, the usual call office fees will be charged in addition to the other charges.

Note.—Communication with Finland is at present restricted to calls to and from places in the second Finnish zone.
