PURSUANT to an Order of the Chancery Division of the High Court of Justice, dated the 18th day of June, 1928, and made in an action in the Matter of the estate of James Fordyce Stevenson, deceased (late of Camberwell House, Peckham-road, Camberwell, in the county of Surrey, and formerly of 3, Upper Addison-gardens, Kensington, in the county of Middlesex, who died on the 10th day of December, 1927), Troughton against The Attorney General, 1928, S.
