The KING has been pleased by Letters Patent under the Great Seal bearing date the 1st day of May, 1929, to appoint the Right Honourable William Watson, late Lord Advocate for Scotland, to be a Lord of Appeal in Ordinary under the provisions of "The Appellate Jurisdiction Act, 1876," as amended by any subsequent enactment, and to grant to him the dignity of a Baron for life by the style and title of Baron Thankerton of Thankerton in the County of Lanark.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

- 1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 10th May, 1929, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £35,000,000.
- 2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 13th May, 1929, to Saturday, the 18th May, 1929, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

- 3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.
- 4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.
- 5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.
- 6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.
- 7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.
- 8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.
- 9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACTS, 1901 to 1929.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice that on the 27th April, 1929, he made Regulations under Section 1 of the Factory and Workshop (Cotton Cloth Factories) Act, 1929, to apply to all factories in which is carried on the weaving of cotton cloth. These Regulations, which may be cited as the Cotton Cloth Factories Regulations, 1929, will come into force on the 15th May, 1929, from which date the Regulations under the Factory and Workshop (Cotton Cloth Factories) Act, 1911, will be repealed.

The Home Secretary gives notice that in pursuance of Section 2 (1) of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920, he has made an Order authorising the employment on two day-shifts, of women of 18 and young persons of 16 years of age and over in toffee boiling and chocolate coating at the works of Messrs. Dunn & Co. (Sunderland) Ltd., Burn Park, Sunderland, subject to the conditions that a worker shall not be employed in the afternoon shift in consecutive weeks; that suitable cloakroom and messroom accommodation, washing facilities and facilities for

sitting shall be provided; and that the Secretary of State may at any time require the occupiers to make such special arrangements for the conveyance of workers living at a distance or otherwise for the welfare of such workers as may be necessary to prevent hardship.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz.:—

REGULATIONS FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF ASSISTANT SURVEYORS IN THE CIVIL ENGINEER-IN-CHIEF'S DEPARTMENT OF THE ADMIRALTY AND IN THE WORKS AND BUILDINGS DIRECTORATE OF THE AIR MINISTRY.

N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time. Competitions do not take place at fixed intervals, but are held as occasion arises.

1. Candidates must have attained the age of 25 and must not have attained the age of 30 on a date to be fixed in respect of the competition in which they are to take part. Candidates who have served or are serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding five years during which they have so served.

years during which they have so served.
2. Candidates must be natural-born British subjects and the children of fathers also

natural-born British subjects; provided that exception may be made:—

- (a) In the case of candidates serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners.
- (b) In the case of natural-born British subjects who served in His Majesty's Armed Forces in the Great War between the 4th August, 1914, and 11th November, 1918.
- (c) In the case of natural-born British subjects who have satisfactorily completed a period of not less than five years' service on full pay in His Majesty's Regular Forces.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalization or by any other voluntary and formal act.

3. Until further order, special consideration will be given to candidates who have served in His Majesty's Forces during the War.

No person will be eligible who obtained from any tribunal established under the Military Service Acts, 1916 to 1918, exemption from service in His Majesty's Forces under those Acts on the ground of a conscientious objection to the undertaking of military service or, although not so exempted, declined to comply with obligations imposed upon him by those Acts.

4. Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to apply for appointment.

No person actually serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force will be eligible for consideration unless he produces, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to apply for appointment, dated before his appearance before the Selection Board, and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

- 5. Candidates must be prepared to serve at home or abroad, and candidates selected for the Air Ministry must be prepared to undertake journeys by air in connection with the execution of their duties as may be directed.
- 6. The Civil Service Commissioners will take such steps as they think most appropriate to make known the existence of any vacancy or vacancies which it is desired to fill on any one occasion.
- 7. Application shall be addressed in the first instance to the Civil Service Commission, and shall be made on a form to be obtained from that Office. The Civil Service Commissioners

will examine the candidates' credentials and will select for interview those candidates who appear to have the requisite qualifications and to be best fitted for appointment.

8. Candidates must either be Professional Associates of the Surveyors' Institution, having qualified under Sub-Division III (I. Quan-

tities—Typical), or have passed the examina-tions qualifying for election.

9. Candidates who are selected for interview will be summoned to appear before a Selection Board, who will recommend for the vacancies existing those candidates who appear to them to possess the highest qualifications, and their decision will be final. The Selection Board will be constituted by the Civil Service Commissioners, in consultation with the authorities of the Department or Departments in which there are vacancies to be filled, and such Department or Departments will be repre-sented on the Selection Board. The Selection Board will take into consideration the candidates' record of experience and education, any recommendations that they may receive from persons named by candidates as having direct knowledge of their work in the past, and the personal qualities of the candidates as shown at this interview; and on their estimation of all the above evidence they will frame their decisions.

10. When vacancies are offered for competition in more than one Department, it will rest with the Civil Service Commissioners to determine to which Department the successful candidates shall be assigned. In making the assignments the Commissioners will be guided by the requirements of the public service; but subject to this condition, the wishes of the candidates will, where possible, be respected.

11. The appointment of selected candidates will be subject to their satisfying the Civil Service Commissioners of their eligibility in respect of age, nationality, health and character, and will not be confirmed unless and until they have been elected to corporate membership of the Surveyors' Institution and have passed the prescribed period of probation to the satisfaction of the Head of the Department in which they are employed.

12. Candidates selected for appointment will be required to pay a fee of £8.

13. Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons will disqualify them for appointment. The Selection Board will disregard spontaneous recommendations from persons who are not personally acquainted with the candidate's work, whether at school, at the university, in industry or business, in the Forces, or other-
