

thorpe which includes the chapelry of Fraisthorpe the boundaries whereof are well known and defined.

"2. That there is also in the said County and Diocese the parish of Barmston which is a Rectory and Benefice in the same County and Diocese.

"3. That the said Vicarage of Carnaby with Fraisthorpe is now vacant by the Cession of the Reverend Frederick Vernon White, M.A., the last Incumbent there and that the said Rectory of Barmston is also vacant by the death of the Reverend Charles Ingram William Boynton, M.A., the last Incumbent there.

"4. That according to the last census the population of the said parish of Carnaby with Fraisthorpe inclusive of the said Chapelry of Fraisthorpe is two hundred and eighty-seven persons and the population of the said parish of Barmston is one hundred and eighty-five persons.

"5. That the said Chapelry of Fraisthorpe and the said parish of Barmston are immediately contiguous and adjoin.

"6. That there is an ancient chapel or church within the boundaries of the said chapelry of Fraisthorpe sufficient for the needs of the inhabitants of the said chapelry and that the said chapelry is distant from the said Rectory of Barmston not exceeding two miles whilst the church of the parish of Carnaby is most inconveniently situated for the inhabitants of Fraisthorpe being three miles apart by the nearest road.

"7. That the net annual value of the Benefice of Barmston is five hundred and seventeen pounds per annum and the net annual value of the Benefice of Carnaby with Fraisthorpe is only ninety pounds per annum.

"8. That the Patronage of the said Benefice of Barmston is vested in Cycely Mabel Wickham-Boynton of Burton Agnes Hall, Driffeld, Yorkshire, and the Patronage of Carnaby with Fraisthorpe is vested in The Honourable Tatton Lane Fox Willoughby, Howsham Hall, York, and Henry Peter Marriott, Quarry Cottage, Malton (Trustees of the Boynton Estate), and all the said Patrons have consented to the said Scheme and their respective consents in writing are hereto annexed.

"9. That it appears to the said Archbishop that under the provisions of the Acts of Parliament passed in the session holden in the 1st and 2nd years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria Chapter 106 and of the 2nd and 3rd years of the same reign the said chapelry of Fraisthorpe may be advantageously separated from the said Vicarage of Carnaby and be united to the said Rectory of Barmston for ecclesiastical purposes.

"10. That pursuant to the directions contained in the 26th Section of the aforesaid first mentioned Act the said Archbishop has prepared a Scheme in writing appended to this Report describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alterations above proposed may be best effected and how the changes consequent upon such alteration in respect of ecclesiastical jurisdiction Glebe lands Tithes rent charges and other ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect of Patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested and the said Archbishop being on full consideration and enquiry satis-

fied with such Scheme he doth by this report to Your Majesty in Council certify the same to Your Majesty together with the consents in writing of the Patrons of the Benefices to be affected to the intent that Your Majesty in Council in case it shall be thought expedient and proper so to do may make an Order for carrying the same into effect.

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

#### "SCHEME.

"That the Chapelry of Fraisthorpe in the parish of Carnaby with Fraisthorpe and County and Diocese of York which consists of the whole of that part of the Civil Parish of Fraisthorpe with Auburn and Wilsthorpe which is not within the ecclesiastical Parish of Emmanuel Bridlington shall be severed from the said Vicarage of Carnaby with Fraisthorpe and be united to the Rectory of Barmston for ecclesiastical purposes.

"That the said inhabitants of the said chapelry of Fraisthorpe shall be entitled in future to be seated in the church belonging to the said Rectory of Barmston and to parochial rights or privileges of baptism marriage churching burial and other offices of the Church at the parish church of Barmston and all fees chargeable in respect of such offices as aforesaid shall belong and be payable to the Rector of Barmston but the inhabitants of the said Chapelry of Fraisthorpe shall cease to have any parochial rights or privileges in respect of any offices of the Church from the Incumbent of the said Vicarage of Carnaby with Fraisthorpe or any rights in respect of seats in the said church at Carnaby.

"That there shall be no alteration in the Patronage or right of nomination to either of the parishes affected hereby and that no alteration shall be made in the endowment of either of the said Benefices of Barmston or Carnaby with Fraisthorpe."

"I, Cycely Mabel Wickham-Boynton, the Patron or person entitled to present to the Rectory of Barmston and we, Tatton Lane Fox Willoughby and Henry Peter Marriott the persons entitled to present to the said Vicarage of Carnaby with Fraisthorpe, do hereby give our consents to the foregoing Report and Scheme given under our hands this 30th day of January, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine.
