WHEREAS His Majesty was pleased by His Commission dated the 4th day of December, 1928, to nominate and appoint Her Majesty The Queen, His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, K.G., K.T., K.P., G.C.S.I., G.C.M.G., G.C.I.E., G.C.V.O., G.B.E., His Royal Highness The Duke of York, K.G., K.T., G.C.M.G., G.C.V.O., the Most Reverend Father in God Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of Canterbury, the Right Honourable Douglas McGarel, Baron Hailsham, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Right Honourable Stanley Baldwin, Prime Minister and First Lord of the Treasury, or any three of them, during His Majesty's illness, to summon and hold on His Majesty's behalf His Privy Council, and to signify thereat His Majesty's approval of any matter or thing to which His Majesty's approval in Council is required:

And whereas by "The Consular Salaries and Fees Act, 1891," His Majesty The King is authorised by Order in Council to fix the fees to be taken in respect of any matter or thing done by a Consular Officer in the execution of

his office, and to vary such fees by way of increase or decrease, and to abolish fees, and to create new fees:

And whereas by "The Foreign Marriage Act, 1892," by "The Marriage with Foreigners Act, 1906," and by "The Foreign Marriages Order in Council, 1913," it is provided that certain things may or shall be done on payment of the proper fee, and those Acts further provide that the proper fee shall be such fee as may for the time being be fixed under "The Consular Salaries and Fees Act, 1891," and that the fee so fixed as respects a Consul shall be the fee which may be taken by any marriage officer:

And whereas it is expedient that the notes set forth in the Table of Consular and Marriage fees in China, annexed to "The Consular Fees (Amendment) Order in Council, 1923," should be varied in certain respects:

Now, therefore, His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Prime Minister and First Lord of the Treasury, being authorised thereto by His Majesty's said Commission in pursuance of the said Acts and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, on His Majesty's behalf are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as "The Consular Fees (Amendment) Order in Council, 1929," and shall be read as one with "The Consular Fees Order in Council, 1921," and "The Consular Fees (Amendment) Order in Council, 1923."

2. Note 5 of the notes set forth in the table annexed to "the Consular Fees (Amendment) Order in Council" is hereby withdrawn and

the note set forth in the Schedule annexed to this Order is substituted therefor.

3. This Order shall come into operation upon July 1st, 1929.

And the Right Honourable Sir Austen Chamberlain, K.G., one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein.

5. The above fees are, at the option of a Consular Officer, to be paid either in British gold or in any silver dollar currency in use in China which may from time to time be specified by His Majesty's Minister at Peking, at a uniform rate of exchange, applicable to all such silver dollar currencies, which shall be fixed from time to time for this purpose by His Majesty's Minister in Peking but shall not exceed as a maximum the rate of two shillings for one silver dollar.

And whereas the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 25th day of April, 1929, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37,

and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken out of the Parish of Leigh, in the County of Essex and in the Diocese of Chelmsford:

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said Parish of Leigh is a Parish wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular part of the said Parish of Leigh which is hereinafter mentioned and described, should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine Worship:

"And whereas we have agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of £200 per annum to the Minister of the said proposed separate District so soon as a Minister shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and to his successors:

"And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of £200 will after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

"And whereas a capital sum of £2,000 has been contributed towards the cost of erecting a permanent Church within and for the said proposed separate District:

"And whereas the said capital sum of £2,000 has been contributed as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District, and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas the contributors of the said capital sum of £2,000 towards the cost of erecting such permanent Church have nominated to us the Bishop for the time being of the said Diocese of Chelmsford as the person to whom they desire that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish should be assigned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Henry Albert, now Bishop of Chelmsford (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said Parish of Leigh, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any

Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid, become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes, and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Margaret, Leigh on Sea.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said District so recommended to be constituted and, when such District shall have become a New Parish as aforesaid, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be absolutely vested in the said Henry Albert, Bishop of Chelmsford and his successors, Bishops of Chelmsford, for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measure relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Margaret, Leigh on Sea, being:—

"All that part of the Parish of Leigh, in the County of Essex and in the Diocese of Chelmsford, which is bounded upon the west by the Parish of Hadleigh, in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north, upon the east and upon the south, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Hadleigh from the said Parish of Leigh at the point where such boundary crosses the middle of Prittle Brook and extending thence first eastward and then south eastward along the middle of Prittle Brook for a distance of 1 mile and 15 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge or culvert which carries the road known as Kingswood Chase across Prittle Brook, and extending thence southward along the middle of Kingswood Chase for a distance of 12½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with London Road and the road known as Southsea Avenue, and extending thence southward along the middle of Southsea Avenue for a distance of 6 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road known as Ronaldhill Grove, and extending thence westward along the middle of Ronaldhill Grove for a distance of 4½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road known as Fairleigh Drive, and extending thence southward along the middle of Fairleigh Drive for a distance of 14½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road known as Glendale Gardens, and extending thence westward along the middle of Glendale Gardens for a distance of 14 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road known as Westcliff Drive, and extending thence south westward along the middle of Westcliff Drive for a distance of 2 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Hadleigh Road, and extending thence north westward along the middle of Hadleigh Road for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Western Road,

and extending thence first north westward and then westward along the middle of Western Road for a distance of 22 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Harley Street, and extending thence southward along the middle of Harley Street for a distance of 12½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road known as Marine Parade, and extending thence in a straight line due south for a distance of 11½ chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the London, Tilbury and Southend Line of the London, Midland and Scottish Railway, and extending thence westward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of 53 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Leigh from the said Parish of Hadleigh."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein-before mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patron and to the Incumbent of the Parish of Leigh out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patron and Incumbent have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved at the Council held under the authority of the said Commission:

Now, therefore, His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Prime Minister and First Lord of the Treasury, being authorised thereto by His Majesty's said Commission have taken the said Scheme into consideration, and do hereby, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, on His Majesty's behalf, ratify the same and order, as it is hereby ordered, that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And do hereby, by and with the like advice, direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Chelmsford.

And whereas the Most Reverend William, Lord Archbishop of York, has, under Section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, made a Report to His Majesty in Council, in the following terms:—

"1. That there is in the County and Diocese of York the Vicarage of Hutton Buscel the Parish of which comprises amongst other places the District of Wrench Green the boundaries whereof are well known and are delineated on the plan annexed hereto and are thereon edged round with green.

"2. That according to the last census the population of the said Parish of Hutton Buscel exclusive of the said District of Wrench Green amounts to about Seven hundred persons and that of the said District to Sixty persons.

"3. That the said District of Wrench Green is situated at a distance of Eight miles or thereabouts from the Parish Church of Hutton Buscel aforesaid.

"4. That there is in the said County and Diocese of York also the New Vicarage of Hackness the Parish Church whereof is at a distance of only One mile from the said District of Wrench Green.

"5. That the Church of the said Parish of Hackness is capable of affording accommodation to the inhabitants of the said Parish of Hackness and of the said District of Wrench Green.

"6. That the Patronage of the said Vicarage of Hutton Buscel is vested in the Right Honourable William Charles de Meuron Earl Fitzwilliam, K.C.V.O., C.B.E., D.S.O., and the Reverend Lewis Arthur Drakeford-Lewis, Master of Arts, is the present incumbent thereof and the Patronage of the said New Vicarage of Hackness belongs to the Right Honourable Francis Baron Derwent of Hackness in the said County of York and the Reverend William Norman Blake is the present incumbent thereof all of whom are consenting parties to the separation and annexation contemplated by the scheme hereafter proposed.

"7. That it is proposed by the present Scheme that from and after the next avoidance of the said Vicarage of Hutton Buscel the Corn Rents belonging to that Benefice amounting to the sum of twelve pounds five shillings and fivepence and charged on lands situated within the said District of Wrench Green proposed to be so transferred as aforesaid as more particularly set forth in the Schedule hereto annexed shall be transferred to the Benefice of Hackness aforesaid as and for and in aid of the maintenance and benefit of the Incumbent thereof.

"8. That it appears to the said Archbishop that under the provisions of the Acts of Parliament passed in the Session holden in the first and second years of the reign of Her late

Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 106, and of the second and third years of Her late Majesty's reign, Chapter 49, the said District of Wrench Green may be advantageously separated from the Benefice of Hutton Buscel and be annexed to the said Benefice of Hackness for ecclesiastical purposes.

"9. That pursuant to the direction contained in the 26th Section of the said first mentioned Act the said Archbishop has prepared a Scheme in writing appended to this report describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration above proposed may be best effected and the said Archbishop being on full consideration and inquiry satisfied with such Scheme he doth by this Report to Your Majesty in Council certify the same to Your Majesty together with the Consent in writing to the said Scheme of the Patrons and Incumbents of the said Parishes to the intent that Your Majesty in Council in case it should be thought expedient and proper so to do may make an Order for carrying such Scheme into effect.

"WILLIAM EBOR."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Archbishop and the Consents referred to in the said Report are as follows:—

"SCHEME.

"That the said District of Wrench Green edged round with green on the plan attached hereto shall be separated from the said Parish of Hutton Buscel and be annexed to the Parish of Hackness for ecclesiastical purposes.

"That the Vicar of Hackness shall have exclusive cure of souls in and over the said District so transferred.

"That the Corn Rents amounting to the sum of twelve pounds five shillings and fivepence per annum arising out of the lands within the said District of Wrench Green and belonging to the Incumbent of Hutton Buscel shall as and from the termination of the present incumbency of Hutton Buscel belong to and be received by the Vicar of the Parish of Hackness.

"That all other ecclesiastical dues fees and emoluments now receivable by the Vicar of Hutton Buscel within or in respect of the said District of Wrench Green shall henceforth belong to and be received by the Vicar of the Parish of Hackness.

"That the Patronages of the said Benefices of Hutton Buscel and Hackness shall not be altered.

"That subject to the provisions of the Compulsory Church Rate Abolition Act, 1868, the inhabitants of the said District of Wrench Green shall be liable for the repair of the Parish church of Hackness as are the other inhabitants of the said Parish of Hackness and shall be henceforth exempt from all liability in respect of the repair and maintenance of the Parish church of Hutton Buscel.

"That the inhabitants of the said District of Wrench Green shall not henceforth be entitled to any accommodation in the Parish church or churchyard of Hutton Buscel but shall be entitled to accommodation in the Parish church and churchyard of Hackness aforesaid.

" CONSENTS.

" We, The Right Honourable William Charles de Meuron, Earl Fitzwilliam, the Patron or person entitled to present to the Vicarage of Hutton Buscel in the County and Diocese of York in case the same were now vacant and the Reverend Lewis Arthur Drakeford-Lewis, Master of Arts, Vicar of the said Vicarage and the Right Honourable Francis, Baron Derwent of Hackness in the County of York the Patron or person entitled to present to the said Vicarage and Parish church of Hackness in the County and Diocese of York

in case the same were now vacant and the Reverend William Norman Blake Vicar of the said Vicarage of Hackness do hereby respectively signify our consents to the foregoing Report and Scheme.

The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

MERCHANDISE MARKS ACT, 1926.

REFERENCE TO STANDING COMMITTEE.

In accordance with the provisions of Section 2, sub-section 4, of the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926, the Board of Trade give notice that, in pursuance of applications received by them for the making of Orders-in-Council to require imported goods of certain classes and descriptions to bear an indication of origin, they have made a reference to the Standing Committee appointed by them under the Act in respect of the following classes and descriptions of imported goods:—

1. Slates for roofing.
2. Lattice reinforcements and stirrups of iron and steel for concrete construction.
3. The following articles of iron and steel:—
 - (a) Blank and screwed bolts, nuts and rivets (other than wire rivets).
 - (b) Blank and tapped nuts, hexagon and square; set screws, hexagon and square, and head coach screws, hexagon and square; boilermakers' and engineers' studs.
4. Machinery belting (including conveyor and elevator bands) other than belting of metal.
5. Strap butts (also known as millband or belting butts) of leather, dressed or curried.
6. Wallpapers, ceiling papers and similar wall and ceiling decorations, including borders and friezes made of paper, wood pulp or similar materials.
7. (a) Boxes, cartons, cases, and other containers made of paper, chip, cardboard, straw-board, fibreboard, pulpboard or similar box-boards, or of any combination of these materials, whether corrugated or not, other than paper bags, suit cases, attache cases or similar cases,

(b) Flats for boxes, cartons, cases and other containers of the description specified in para. (a).

Attention is called to the fact that, while under the provisions of the above Act the Committee must in every case referred to them consider whether the goods should bear an indication of origin at the time of sale or exposure for sale, they may also at their discretion consider and report upon the question whether such goods should bear an indication of origin at the time of importation.

KEEPERS IN THE PUBLIC RECORD OFFICE.

N.B.—Competitions under these Regulations are open both to men and women. Competitions do not take place at fixed intervals, but are held as occasion arises on the occurrence of vacancies. The Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

1. Candidates must have attained the age of 22 and must not have attained the age of 26 on the 1st April of the year in which the competition is held. In reckoning age for competition the following allowances will be made, viz. :—

(a) Candidates who have served or who are serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force may deduct from their actual age any time during which they have so served.

(b) Candidates who have served in any established civil situation to which they were admitted with the Certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding two years which they may have spent in such service.

2. Candidates must be natural-born British subjects and the children of fathers also natural-born British subjects; provided that exception may be made :—

(a) In the case of candidates serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners.

(b) In the case of natural-born British subjects who served in His Majesty's Armed Forces in the Great War between 4th August, 1914, and 11th November, 1918.

(c) In the case of natural-born British subjects who have satisfactorily completed a period of not less than five years' service on full pay in His Majesty's Regular Forces.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied, in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any

other nationality by naturalisation or by any other voluntary and formal act.

3. Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to apply for appointment.

No person actually serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force, will be eligible for consideration unless he produces, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to apply for appointment, dated before his appearance before the Selection Board, and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

4. The authorities of the Public Record Office will take such steps as they think most appropriate to make known the existence of any vacancy or vacancies which they desire to fill on any one occasion and the Civil Service Commissioners will satisfy themselves that the steps taken have been such as to secure all desirable publicity.

5. Application shall be addressed in the first instance to the Deputy Keeper of the Records, Public Record Office. The authorities of that Department will examine the candidates' credentials and will submit the names of such candidates as appear to have the requisite qualifications and to be best fitted for appointment to the Civil Service Commissioners, who, if dissatisfied with the number or quality of candidates for any vacancy, may require further search to be made for qualified candidates.

6. Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners that they have received such systematic education and possess in particular such knowledge of Latin and French as to fit them for the post. In general, candidates should possess a University honours degree or other equivalent qualification in Classics, Law or History. The Commissioners may submit any or all of the candidates to a qualifying examination to test their education or any part of it.

7. Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character. Female candidates must be unmarried or widows, and will be required to resign their appointments on marriage.

8. Candidates who are recommended by the Public Record Office and are accepted by the Civil Service Commissioners will be summoned to an interview before a Selection Board, who will recommend for the vacancies existing those candidates who appear to them to possess the highest qualifications, and their decision will be final. The Selection Board shall be nominated by the Commissioners in consultation with the Public Record Office, who shall be represented on the Selection Board, and one of the Commissioners shall be the Chairman. The Selection Board will take into consideration the candidate's record of experience and education and the personal qualities of the candidate as shown at this interview; and on their estimation of the above evidence they will frame their decisions.

9. Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through

Members of Parliament or other influential persons, will disqualify them for appointment. The Selection Board will disregard spontaneous recommendations from persons who are not personally acquainted with the candidate's work, whether at school, at the university, or otherwise.

10. If a qualifying examination is held, each candidate subjected thereto will be required to pay a fee of £3. A Selected Candidate will be required to pay a fee of £8 towards which the fee paid at the qualifying examination (if any) will count, before the issue of the certificate of qualification for appointment.

THE LONDON TRAFFIC ACT, 1924.

SECTION 7.

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Transport, by virtue and in exercise of the powers given to him by Section 7 of the London Traffic Act, 1924, and the Regulations from time to time made by him thereunder, after consulting the London and Home Counties Traffic Advisory Committee, has relaxed the restrictions and limitations imposed by the said Regulations upon the occasion of the Whitsun Bank Holiday period, 1929, so that nothing in the said Regulations shall:—

Omnibus Company Limited, or Thomas Tilling Limited from using, after 11 a.m., on the days specified in the Schedule hereto, for the purpose of plying for hire upon any route shown in Column 1 of the said Schedule in any of the streets or parts thereof declared to be "restricted streets" by any Order made by the Minister of Transport under the aforesaid Section of the London Traffic Act, 1924, and forming part of those routes, such number of omnibuses as is shown opposite to each such route respectively in Column 2 of the said Schedule in excess of the number of omnibuses which they may use in those streets or parts thereof under the said Regulations;

(b) prevent any person other than the London General Omnibus Company Limited, the Tramways (M.E.T.) Omnibus Company Limited, or Thomas Tilling Limited, who is maintaining at the date hereof a regular service in accordance with Section 6 of the London Traffic Act, 1924, upon any approved route, from using, for the purpose of plying for hire along a restricted street or part thereof in the maintenance of a regular service on the approved route, on Saturday and Tuesday, the 18th and 21st days of May, 1929, in addition to the number of omnibuses which he may operate in that street or part thereof under the said Regulations a number equal to 10 per cent. of the total number of omnibuses (excluding spare vehicles) scheduled by him at the date hereof for operation upon approved routes, provided that where any person ordinarily operates less than 10 omnibuses he shall be allowed so to operate one additional omnibus;

provided that nothing herein contained shall be deemed to affect or derogate from the powers of the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis under the provisions of Section 52 of the Metropolitan Police Act, 1839, to give directions to constables for keeping order and for preventing any obstruction of the thoroughfares.

(iii) All employment on Good Friday, Easter Monday, Whit Monday, August Bank Holiday, Christmas Day and Boxing Day except employment on such a day up to 3 hours in connection with milking and the care of and attendance upon stock but so that employment in excess of 3 hours in connection with milking and the care of and attendance upon stock on such a day shall not rank as overtime employment if equivalent time off on full pay is given.

(iv) All employment on any other day in excess of 8½ hours.
