**WHEREAS** His Majesty was pleased by His Commission dated the 4th day of December, 1928, to nominate and appoint Her Majesty The Queen, His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, K.G., K.T., K.P., G.C.S.I., G.C.M.G., G.C.I.E., G.C.V.O., G.B.E., His Royal Highness The Duke of York, K.G., K.T., G.C.M.G., G.C.V.O., the Most Reverend Father in God Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of Canterbury, the Right Honourable Douglas McGarel, Baron Hailsham, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Right Honourable Stanley Baldwin, Prime Minister and First Lord of the Treasury, or any three of them, during His Majesty's illness, to summon and hold on His Majesty's behalf His Privy Council, and to signify thereat His Majesty's approval of any matter or thing to which His Majesty's approval in Council is required:

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty,

dated the 3rd day of May, 1929 (C.W. 3844/29), in the words following, viz.:—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Order in Council bearing date the 2nd day of August, 1918, to sanction the grant, at our discretion, of Temporary Commissions as Acting Chaplains to Ministers of Religious Bodies, not in conformity with the Church of England, who rendered full time service in the Royal Navy during the period of the late war:

“And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Order in Council bearing date the 13th day of October, 1922, to sanction the continuance of the grant of temporary commissions to such Ministers under the same conditions in time of peace, subject to their being designated ‘Temporary Chaplains’ and not ‘Acting Chaplains’:

“And whereas the Reverend Frederick Kerr McClement, D.C.L., M.A., was granted a Temporary Commission as Acting Roman Catholic Chaplain (now styled ‘Temporary Roman Catholic Chaplain’) with seniority of the 2nd May, 1918, and served in Your Majesty's Naval

Service until the 3rd May, 1929, on which date he was placed on the retired list at his own request:

"And whereas we consider that such service should render this Officer eligible for retired pay:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the following proposals:—

"(1) Retired Pay based on a standard rate of £225 a year to be granted to this Officer, and to be awarded at the current rate of £211 10s. a year as from the date of his retirement:

"(2) The standard rate of £225 a year to be regarded as comparable with rates authorized in Schedule V, Section IX, of Your Majesty's Order in Council bearing date the 22nd January, 1920, and his retired pay to be subject to revision at the same dates and in the same manner as retired pay authorized by that Order.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals."

Now, therefore, His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Prime Minister and First Lord of the Treasury, being authorized thereto by His Majesty's said Commission have taken the said Memorial into consideration, and do hereby, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, on His Majesty's behalf approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

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**WHEREAS** His Majesty was pleased by His Commission dated the 4th day of December, 1928, to nominate and appoint Her Majesty The Queen, His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, K.G., K.T., K.P., G.C.S.I., G.C.M.G., G.C.I.E., G.C.V.O., G.B.E., His Royal Highness The Duke of York, K.G., K.T., G.C.M.G., G.C.V.O., the Most Reverend Father in God Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of Canterbury, the Right Honourable Douglas McGarel, Baron Hailsham, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Right Honourable Stanley Baldwin, Prime Minister and First Lord of the Treasury, or any three of them, during His Majesty's illness, to summon and hold on His Majesty's behalf His Privy Council, and to signify thereat His

Majesty's approval of any matter or thing to which His Majesty's approval in Council is required:

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 3rd day of May, 1929 (C.W. 3452/29), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Order in Council bearing date the 2nd day of August, 1918, to sanction the grant, at our discretion, of Temporary Commissions as Acting Chaplains to Ministers of Religious Bodies, not in conformity with the Church of England, who rendered full time service in the Royal Navy during the period of the late war:

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Order in Council bearing date the 13th day of October, 1922, to sanction the continuance of the grant of temporary commissions to such Ministers under the same conditions in time of peace, subject to their being designated 'Temporary Chaplains' and not 'Acting Chaplains':

"And whereas the Reverend Alexius Calderbank was granted a Temporary Commission as Acting Roman Catholic Chaplain (now styled 'Temporary Roman Catholic Chaplain') with seniority of the 19th March, 1917, and served in Your Majesty's Naval Service until the 1st May, 1929, on which date he was placed on the retired list at his own request:

"And whereas we consider that such service should render this Officer eligible for retired pay:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council, to sanction the following proposals:—

"(1) Retired pay based on a standard rate of £240 a year to be granted to this Officer, and to be awarded at the current rate of £225 10s. a year as from the date of his retirement;

"(2) The standard rate of £240 a year to be regarded as comparable with rates authorised in Schedule V, Section IX, of Your Majesty's Order in Council bearing date the 22nd January, 1920, and his retired pay to be subject to revision at the same dates and in the same manner as retired pay authorised by that Order.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals."

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And whereas there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 4th day of May, 1929 (C.W. 4308/29), in the words following, viz.:-

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas there is at present a surplus on the Lieutenant-Commanders' List:

"And whereas we consider it desirable that steps should be taken to reduce the List so far as possible to the numbers estimated to be necessary:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the following proposal:—

"Lieutenant-Commanders, R.N., other than Officers promoted from Warrant rank, who will have attained the age of compulsory retirement by the 31st December, 1933, to be

given the option, at our discretion, of retiring forthwith with the rate of retired pay for which they would have been eligible under ordinary regulations, if they had remained on the active list and had been employed continuously until reaching the age of 45 years; such option to be exercised within a period of six months from the date of promulgation of the orders.

"Officers serving abroad who are allowed to retire under this scheme to be granted full pay up to the date of arrival in England, provided they return by a direct route without delay, but not to be eligible for any extension of full pay in respect of foreign service leave.

"Nothing in this Order shall preclude us from withholding either in whole or in part these special terms in any particular case, or from retiring any Officer during the currency of this scheme under any other regulations which may be applicable to his case.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

Now, therefore, His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Prime Minister and First Lord of the Treasury, being authorized thereto by His Majesty's said Commission have taken the said Memorial into consideration, and do hereby, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, on His Majesty's behalf approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

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And whereas a majority of the whole Council of the Borough of Barrow-in-Furness in the County of Lancaster did on the 23rd day of July, 1928, agree to petition, and the Council of the said Borough thereupon petitioned, His Majesty under and in pursuance of the provisions of Section 30 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, as amended by Section 2 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1893, for an alteration of the boundaries of the Wards of the said Borough:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased by His Order in Council of the 14th day of August, 1928, to refer the said Petition to a Committee of the Lords of His Privy Council:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased by His Order in Council of the 1st day of November, 1928, to approve the Report of the Committee to the effect that, the Statutory Notice that the Petition had been presented having expired, it rested with the Secretary of State to appoint a Commissioner to prepare a Scheme in accordance with the provisions of Section 30 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882:

And whereas on the 22nd day of November, 1928, the Right Honourable Sir William Joynson-Hicks, Baronet, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, did appoint Richard Cowdy Maxwell, Esquire, O.B.E., LL.D., Barrister-at-Law, to be a Commissioner to prepare a Scheme for determining the boundaries of and for apportioning the Councillors among the Wards of the Borough of Barrow-in-Furness:

And whereas the said Commissioner has accordingly prepared the following Scheme, dated the 18th day of April, 1929:—

“SCHEME FOR DETERMINING THE BOUNDARIES OF THE WARDS OF THE COUNTY BOROUGH OF BARROW-IN-FURNESS AND APPORTIONING THE COUNCILLORS AMONG THE WARDS IN PURSUANCE OF AN ORDER IN COUNCIL DATED THE 1ST OF NOVEMBER, 1928, AND INCIDENTAL, CONSEQUENTIAL AND SUPPLEMENTAL PROVISIONS.

“COUNTY BOROUGH OF BARROW-IN-FURNESS.

“I.—BOUNDARIES OF WARDS.

“*Walney Ward.*

“A line commencing at South East Point in Walney Island, thence due south to the Borough boundary, thence westward, north westward and eastward following the Borough boundary to the point where such boundary leaves the centre of Walney Channel and turns due east, thence south and south-eastward along the centre of Walney Channel to the point where a straight line drawn in a north-westerly direction from North East Point in Walney Island to a point midway along the straight portion of the north-west wall of Cavendish Dock would be met, thence continuing south-eastward along such straight line to North East Point in Walney Island aforesaid, and thence south-eastward along the shore of Walney Island to the point of commencement aforesaid.

“*Barrow Island Ward.*

“A line commencing at a point in the centre of Walney Channel where it crosses a straight line drawn in a north-westerly direction from North East Point in Walney Island aforesaid

to a point midway along the straight portion of the north-west wall of Cavendish Dock, thence north-westward along such straight line and its continuation to the Ramsden Dock branch line of the London Midland and Scottish (formerly the Furness) Railway (hereinafter referred to as ‘the Railway’), thence south-westward along the south-eastern edge of the metals of such branch line to a point on Buccleuch Bridge immediately over the north-east wall of the entrance from Buccleuch Dock to Ramsden Dock, thence along such north-east wall and (turning north-eastward) along the south-east, north-east and north-west walls of Buccleuch Dock to the entrance from Buccleuch Dock to Devonshire Dock, thence along the north-east wall of that entrance and (turning north-eastward) along the south-east, north-east, and north-west walls of Devonshire Dock to the Entrance Basin (situate between the northern extremity of Barrow Island and the mainland) to Devonshire Dock, thence along the north-east wall of such basin to the most northerly point of such wall, thence due west to the eastern boundary of Walney Ward at the centre of Walney Channel, and thence south-eastward following the eastern boundary of Walney Ward as hereinbefore described along the centre of Walney Channel to the point of commencement aforesaid.

“*Hindpool Ward.*

“A line commencing at the north-western extremity of Barrow Island Ward in the centre of Walney Channel, thence eastward, south-eastward and north-eastward following the boundary of Barrow Island Ward as hereinbefore described to the most northerly point of Devonshire Dock, thence in a straight line to a point in the centre of North Road immediately opposite the western corner of Harbour House, thence north-eastward along the centre of North Road to the intersection of Hindpool Road, thence south-eastward along the centre of Hindpool Road to the intersection of Abbey Road, thence north-eastward along the centre of Abbey Road to the centre of Ramsden Square, thence north-westward along the centre of Duke Street to the intersection of Nelson Street, thence north-eastward along the centre of Nelson Street and Drake Street to the intersection of Holker Street, thence south-eastward along the centre of Holker Street to the intersection of Abbey Road, thence north-eastward along the centre of Abbey Road to the intersection of Hibbert Road, thence north-westward along the centre of Hibbert Road to the intersection of Rutland Street, thence south-westward following a straight line drawn along the centre of Rutland Street to the up main (Whitehaven to London) line of the Railway, thence north-westward along the north-eastern edge of the metals of such up main line to the centre of the railway bridge at or immediately north of Cocken Junction, carrying such main line over Ormsgill Nook, thence due west to the eastern boundary of Walney Ward at the centre of Walney Channel and thence southward following the eastern boundary of Walney Ward as hereinbefore described along the centre of Walney Channel to the point of commencement aforesaid.

“*Hawcoat Ward.*

“A line commencing at a point in the centre of Walney Channel due west of the centre of

the railway bridge over Ormsgill Nook aforesaid, thence northward following the eastern boundary of Walney Ward as hereinbefore described along the centre of Walney Channel to the Borough boundary, thence north-eastward, eastward and southward following the Borough boundary to the point where such boundary crosses the down main (London to Whitehaven) line of the Railway, thence southward along the eastern edge of the metals of such down main line to a point under Millwood Bridge immediately below the centre of the highway from Barrow to Dalton, thence south-westward along the centre of such highway to its junction with Abbey Road, thence continuing south-westward along the centre of Abbey Road to the intersection of Brighton Street, thence north-westward along the centre of Brighton Street to the intersection of Settle Street, thence south-westward along the centre of Settle Street to the boundary of Hindpool Ward at the intersection of Settle Street and Hibbert Road and thence north-westward and westward following the north-eastern boundary of Hindpool Ward as hereinbefore described to the point of commencement aforesaid.

*"Newbarns Ward.*

"A line commencing at the most southerly point of Hawcoat Ward at the intersection of Hibbert Road and Settle Street, thence north-eastward following the boundary of that Ward as hereinbefore described to the down main (London to Whitehaven) line of the Railway at a point below Millwood Bridge aforesaid, thence southward along the eastern edge of the metals of such down main line to a point immediately below the centre of the bridge carrying Roose Road over such main line, thence south-westward along the centre of Roose Road to a point immediately below the up main (Whitehaven to London) line of the Railway where such line crosses Roose Road, thence north-westward along the north-eastern edge of the metals of such up main line to a point under Abbey Road Bridge, thence north-eastward to the intersection of Abbey Road and Hibbert Road and thence north-westward following the boundary of Hindpool Ward as hereinbefore described to the point of commencement aforesaid.

*"Salthouse Ward.*

"A line commencing at a point in the centre of Michaelson Road where it crosses the boundary of Barrow Island Ward at the north-east side of the entrance from Buccleuch Dock to Devonshire Dock, thence north-eastward along the centre of Michaelson Road to a point in that Road where it is carried over the Strand at the junction of the Strand and Hindpool Road, thence eastward along the centre of the Strand to the intersection of Ramsden Street, thence north-eastward along the centre of Ramsden Street to the intersection of Back Marsh Street, thence north-westward along the centre of Back Marsh Street to the intersection of Greengate Street, thence north-eastward along the centre of Greengate Street to its intersection with the south-western boundary of Newbarns Ward, thence south-eastward, north-eastward, eastward, north-eastward and northward, following the boundary of Newbarns Ward as hereinbefore described to the boundary of Hawcoat Ward at Millwood Bridge aforesaid, thence

northward following the boundary of Hawcoat Ward as hereinbefore described to the Borough boundary, thence turning southward following the Borough boundary south-eastward, southward, south-eastward and south-westward to the boundary of Walney Ward at a point due south of South East Point aforesaid, thence north-westward following the south-eastern boundary of Walney Ward to the boundary of Barrow Island Ward at the centre of Walney Channel, thence north-westward, south-westward and north-westward following the eastern and north-eastern boundary of Barrow Island Ward as hereinbefore described to the point of commencement aforesaid.

*"Ramsden Ward.*

"A line commencing at a point in the centre of Michaelson Road where it crosses the boundary of Barrow Island Ward at the north-east side of the entrance from the Buccleuch to the Devonshire Dock, thence north-westward following the northern boundary of Barrow Island Ward as hereinbefore described to the most northerly point of Devonshire Dock, thence north-eastward following the boundary of Hindpool Ward as hereinbefore described to the boundary of Newbarns Ward at Abbey Road Bridge, thence south-eastward following the boundary of Newbarns Ward as hereinbefore described to a point in that boundary immediately opposite the centre line of Crellin Street, thence south-westward along the centre of Crellin Street and Forshaw Street to the intersection of Duke Street, thence south-eastward along the centre of Duke Street to the intersection of Cornwallis Street, thence south-westward along the centre of Cornwallis Street to the intersection of Hindpool Road, thence south-eastward along the centre of Hindpool Road to its junction with the Strand under Michaelson Road, thence south-westward along the centre of Michaelson Road to the point of commencement aforesaid.

*"Central Ward.*

"A line commencing at a point in the south-western boundary of Newbarns Ward immediately opposite the centre line of Crellin Street, thence south-eastward following the boundary of that Ward as hereinbefore described to the boundary of Salthouse Ward at a point where Greengate Street crosses the Railway, thence south-westward, south-eastward, south-westward and westward following the boundary of Salthouse Ward to the boundary of Ramsden Ward at a point in Michaelson Road where that Road is carried over the Strand at the junction of the Strand with Hindpool Road and thence north-westward and north-eastward following the south-eastern boundary of Ramsden Ward as hereinbefore described to the point of commencement aforesaid.

"The boundaries of the Wards as above described are more particularly delineated on the Plan annexed hereto, which forms part of the Scheme.

**W**HEREAS by the Foreign Jurisdiction Acts, 1890 and 1913, it is, among other things, provided that it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council by Order to direct that the Colonial Probates Act, 1892, shall extend, with or without any exceptions, adaptations, or modifications, in the Order mentioned, to any Foreign Country in which for the time being His Majesty has jurisdiction and that thereupon that Act shall to the extent of that jurisdiction, operate as if that country were a British Possession, and as if His Majesty in Council were the Legislature of that Possession:

And whereas the Tanganyika Territory is a territory in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations has been accepted by His Majesty:

And whereas by Treaty, grant, usage, sufferance, and other lawful means, His Majesty The King has power and jurisdiction in the said Territory:

And whereas His Majesty The King is satisfied that the Legislature of the said Territory has made adequate provision for the recognition in that Territory of Probates and Letters of Administration granted by the Courts of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland:

And whereas it is expedient that the Colonial Probates Act, 1892, should be extended to the said Territory:

And whereas on the sixth day of December, 1922, the Irish Free State was established under the provisions of an Act of Parliament shortly entitled "The Irish Free State Constitution Act, 1922 (Session 2)":
