**W**HEREAS by the Foreign Jurisdiction Acts, 1890 and 1913, it is, among other things, provided that it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council by Order to direct that the Colonial Probates Act, 1892, shall extend, with or without any exceptions, adaptations, or modifications, in the Order mentioned, to any Foreign Country in which for the time being His Majesty has jurisdiction and that thereupon that Act shall to the extent of that jurisdiction, operate as if that country were a British Possession, and as if His Majesty in Council were the Legislature of that Possession:

And whereas the Tanganyika Territory is a territory in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations has been accepted by His Majesty:

And whereas by Treaty, grant, usage, sufferance, and other lawful means, His Majesty The King has power and jurisdiction in the said Territory:

And whereas His Majesty The King is satisfied that the Legislature of the said Territory has made adequate provision for the recognition in that Territory of Probates and Letters of Administration granted by the Courts of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland:

And whereas it is expedient that the Colonial Probates Act, 1892, should be extended to the said Territory:

And whereas on the sixth day of December, 1922, the Irish Free State was established under the provisions of an Act of Parliament shortly entitled "The Irish Free State Constitution Act, 1922 (Session 2)":

And whereas His Majesty was pleased by His Commission dated the 4th day of December, 1928, to nominate and appoint Her Majesty The Queen, His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, K.G., K.T., K.P., G.C.S.I., G.C.M.G., G.C.I.E., G.C.V.O., G.B.E., His Royal Highness The Duke of York, K.G., K.T., G.C.M.G., G.C.V.O., the Most Reverend Father in God Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of Canterbury, the Right Honourable Douglas McGarel, Baron Hailsham, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Right Honourable Stanley Baldwin, Prime Minister and First Lord of the Treasury, or any three of them, during His Majesty's illness, to summon and hold on His Majesty's behalf His Privy Council, and to signify thereat His Majesty's approval of any matter or thing to which His Majesty's approval in Council is required:

Now, therefore, His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Prime Minister and First Lord of the Treasury, by virtue
