1. Article 2 of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) (Amendment) Order of 1928 is hereby revoked, and the following article shall be substituted for Article 7 of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925, hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order ":--

#### "Disposal of Slaughterhouse Manure and Refuse.

7. No manure or waste meat trimmings or any other refuse shall be moved from any slaughterhouse in an Infected Area except to premises within the same Infected Area, and then only if permission for such movement is given in writing by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the place of destination. Any person removing or receiving any such material and the occupier of any premises to which it is moved shall take all practicable steps to secure that it is not fed to or brought into contact with animals. Notwithstanding the definition of the term 'slaughterhouse' contained in Article 1 of this Order the term 'slaughterhouse' for the particular purposes of this Article shall include any slaughterhouse which forms part of a farm or other premises."

Commencement and Short Title.

2. This Order shall take immediate effect and it may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS RESTRICTIONS) (AMENDMENT) ORDER OF 1929, and shall be construed as one with the principal Order.
