**THE SAFEGUARDING OF INDUSTRIES (EXEMPTION)
No. 2 ORDER, 1929, DATED 5TH JUNE, 1929,
MADE BY THE TREASURY UNDER SECTION 10 OF
THE FINANCE ACT, 1926 (16 & 17 GEO. 5. c. 22).**

Whereas it is provided by sub-section (5) of Section 10 of the Finance Act, 1926 (16 & 17 Geo. 5. c. 22) that the Treasury may by Order exempt from the duty imposed by Section 1 of the Safeguarding of Industries Act, 1921 (11 & 12 Geo. 5. c. 47) as amended by the Finance Act, 1926, for such period as may be specified in the Order, any article in respect of which the Board of Trade are satisfied on a representation made by a consumer of that article that the article is not made in any part of His Majesty's Dominions in quantities which are substantial having regard to the consumption of that article for the time being in the United Kingdom and that there is no reasonable probability that the article will within a reasonable period be made in His Majesty's Dominions in such substantial quantities:

And whereas, by the Safeguarding of Industries (Exemption) No. 6 Order, 1928 (a), made by the Treasury, the articles specified in Article 2 of this Order were inter alia exempted from the duty imposed by Section 1 of the Safeguarding of Industries Act, 1921, as amended by the Finance Act, 1926, for a period ending on the 30th June, 1929.

And whereas the Board of Trade are satisfied on representations made by consumers of the articles specified in Article 2 and Article 3 of this Order that these articles are not made in any part of His Majesty's Dominions in quantities which are substantial having regard to the consumption of these articles for the time being in the United Kingdom and that there is no reasonable probability that these articles will, within a reasonable period, be made in His Majesty's Dominions in such substantial quantities:

Now therefore, We, being two of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, in pursuance of the powers conferred on Us by the said Section 10 of the Finance Act, 1926, and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Safeguarding of Industries (Exemption) No. 2 Order, 1929.

2. Radium compounds shall continue to be exempt from the duty imposed by Section 1 of the Safeguarding of Industries Act, 1921, as amended by the Finance Act, 1926, from the expiration of the period prescribed by the above mentioned Order until the 31st day of December, 1929, inclusive.

3. Methylcyclohexanol methyl adipate other than that entered under the Customs Acts before the 10th day of June, 1929, or removed from a bonded warehouse before that date shall be exempt from the said duty until the 31st day of December, 1929, inclusive.

**THE CORONERS (AMENDMENT) ACT,
1926.**

**ORDER FOR THE ALTERATION OF CORONERS
DISTRICTS.**

Whereas by virtue of Section 4 (1) of the Coroners (Amendment) Act, 1926, the right of His Grace the Duke of Beaufort to appoint a franchise Coroner for the Liberties of Crickhowell and Tretower in the County of Brecon ceased on the vacancy in the office of Coroner for such Liberties which occurred in consequence of the death of the franchise Coroner Mr. Richard Henry Arlingham Davies, Solicitor, Crickhowell, on the 12th day of January, 1929, and for all purposes relating to Coroners the area in which the said franchise Coroner had jurisdiction thereupon became merged in the County of Brecon:

And whereas the area in which the said franchise Coroner had jurisdiction is defined in the First Part of the Schedule hereto:

And whereas by Section 4 (2) of the Coroners (Amendment) Act, 1926, where any area in which a franchise Coroner had jurisdiction is merged in a County which is divided into Coroners Districts any consequential alteration of the Division of the County into Coroners Districts shall be effected in manner provided by that Act:

And whereas the existing Coroners Districts in the County of Brecon (except the franchise District hereinbefore referred to) are defined

in the Second and Third Parts of the Schedule hereto:

And whereas the County Council for the Administrative County of Brecon deem it expedient to constitute the area defined in the First Part of the Schedule hereto, a separate Coroners District of the County to be known as the Coroners District of Crickhowell and Brynmawr and to increase the number of Coroners for the County of Brecon from two to three; and have submitted to the Secretary of State a draft Order giving effect to these recommendations:

Now, therefore, I, the undersigned, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, in pursuance of the power vested in me by Section 12 of the Coroners (Amendment) Act, 1928, do hereby order:—

1. That the said County of Brecon shall henceforth be divided into the following three Coroners Districts, namely:—

(a) The District of Crickhowell and Brynmawr comprising the area defined in the First Part of the Schedule hereto;

(b) The Northern District comprising the area defined in the Second Part of the Schedule hereto; and

(c) The Southern District comprising the area defined in the Third Part of the Schedule hereto.

2. That this Order may be cited as the County of Brecon Coroners Districts Order, 1929.

This Order shall come into operation on the first day of June, 1929.

1.—(1) Part II (*Restriction on Movement of Sheep out of a Movement Area*) of the Sheep Scab Order of 1928, hereinafter referred to as the "principal Order," is hereby applied to the Area described in the Schedule hereto, hereinafter referred to as "the Area" and the Area so described shall thereupon become a "Movement Area" for the purposes of the principal Order.

Restrictions on Exposure of Sheep at Markets, &c., within the Area during the period from 24th July to 9th September.

2.—(1) Sheep on any premises in the Area shall not (except as hereinafter provided) be permitted to enter, or be exposed for sale or exhibition in any market, fairground, saleyard or place of exhibition in that Area during the period from 24th July to 9th September, in the current year, unless they have within fifty-six days before the date of entry or exposure been double-dipped and are accompanied by a declaration signed by the owner of the sheep, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, stating that the sheep have been so dipped, and the dates of dipping, and that since the second dipping the sheep have been kept separate as far as practicable while in the Area from other sheep not so dipped.

(2) An Inspector of the Local Authority acting under the direction of the Local Authority, may grant an exemption, subject to such conditions (if any) as may be specified therein, exempting sheep in the Area from one or both of the dippings in any particular case in which the Inspector is satisfied that it is impracticable or inexpedient to dip the sheep. In any such case the reasons for granting the exemption shall be stated therein, and the Local Authority shall forthwith cause a copy of the exemption to be forwarded to the Ministry. If the Minister considers that the exemption is for any reason undesirable, and directs the revocation thereof, the same shall thereupon cease to operate, but not so as to affect the previous operation of the exemption.

Special Provision as to Fat Sheep for Immediate Slaughter.

3.—(1) Where an Inspector of a Local Authority is satisfied that any sheep in his district in the Area are intended for immediate slaughter, and that it is impracticable or inexpedient that the same should in accordance with this Order be dipped before exposure for sale or exhibition, he may subject to any

directions by the Local Authority, by licence in the Form H described in the First Schedule to the principal Order authorise the movement of the sheep to any market, fairground, saleyard or place of exhibition in the Area, subject to such conditions (if any) as are inserted in the licence.

(2) Such conditions may, if the Local Authority think fit, be varied so as to enable any sheep, which are returned unsold from a market in the Area with a licence (Form H) to any premises, to be moved to another market, fairground, or saleyard without the sheep being previously double-dipped.

Interpretation.

4. The expressions used in this Order have the same meaning as in the principal Order.

Offences.

5. Any person committing, or aiding, abetting, counselling or procuring the commission of any breach of the provisions of this Order is liable, on summary conviction, to the penalties provided by the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927.
